A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS PROMOTING THE USE OF AZALEAS IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE LANDSCAPING

WHEREAS, the City of Brookings has been designated as an "Azalea City" by the Azalea Society of America, and,


WHEREAS, the City-owned Azalea Park is home to over 800 Azalea plants, including native Azaleas believed to be over 200 years old, and,

WHEREAS, public facilities and private businesses located in Brookings have incorporated the Azalea into their name and brand, including Azalea Middle School, the Azalea Reach Apartments and Azalea Gardens group care home.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council to promote the image of Brookings as an Azalea City,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Brookings encourages the use of Azaleas and its parent genus the Rhododendron in public and private landscaping within the City.
