

Subject: Letter of Support for Pen Air

Recommended Motion:

Motion to authorize the Mayor to submit a letter of support to Peninsula Airways (Pen Air) encouraging submittal of a proposal to continue providing services at Del Norte County Regional Airport in response to the U.S. Department of Transportation's Request for Proposals.

Background/Discussion:

Pen Air has been the sole provider of air service in and out of the Del Norte County Regional Airport (DNCRA) since 2015. It is now time, once again, for interested air service providers to submit proposals to the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) to provide air service for the next two-year contract term.

USDOT provides an operating subsidy to the commercial air carrier serving DNCRA of approximately \$2.0 million annually through the Essential Air Service program. United Express dropped service to DNCRA in 2015.

In 2015, the City of Brookings provided a letter of support to Pen Air encouraging it to submit a proposal for that upcoming contract. It was subsequently awarded the contract. Murphy Forner, the Vice President of Ground Operations at Pen Air has requested that the City once again submit a letter of support to Pen Air's president encouraging re-submittal.

A second airline, Boutique, has expressed interest in providing air service at DNCRA, so Pen Air will likely be facing competition for the contract this year. Staff has reviewed the Powerpoint presentation provided by Boutique and notes:

- Boutique is proposing to use a nine-seat aircraft rather than the 32-seat aircraft operated by PenAir. If we want to grow the service, going from a 32-passenger aircraft to a nine-passenger aircraft is the wrong direction.
- PenAir is expanding in other areas of the northwest and is establishing a base of operation at Portland International Airport (PDX), this means that they will have their own parts warehouse, etc. at PDX that will enable them to do service work on the aircraft between flights. PenAir has been aggressively building their business in the northwest, whereas Boutique is primarily a Midwest carrier.
- PenAir has only had the contract for two years, and it takes time to develop interairline relationships, community relations and marketing. Changing carriers again will be a setback.

- Several options offered by Boutique would be to fly into Oakland, so Oregon travelers would again need to go south to go north.
- We are working on a joint marketing effort with PenAir and Travel Oregon promoting the idea that Portlanders can now fly to the southern Oregon coast; that Brookings is now a viable option to more congested places like Cannon Beach.
- PenAir has an interline agreement with Alaska; is working on an interline agreement with American; and is pursuing an interline agreement with a third carrier. Boutique has no interline agreements.

On April 6, the City Manager met with Forner to discuss Pen Air's performance and future plans. No one has reached out to the City from Boutique. Their proposal says they will do community outreach after they get the contract.

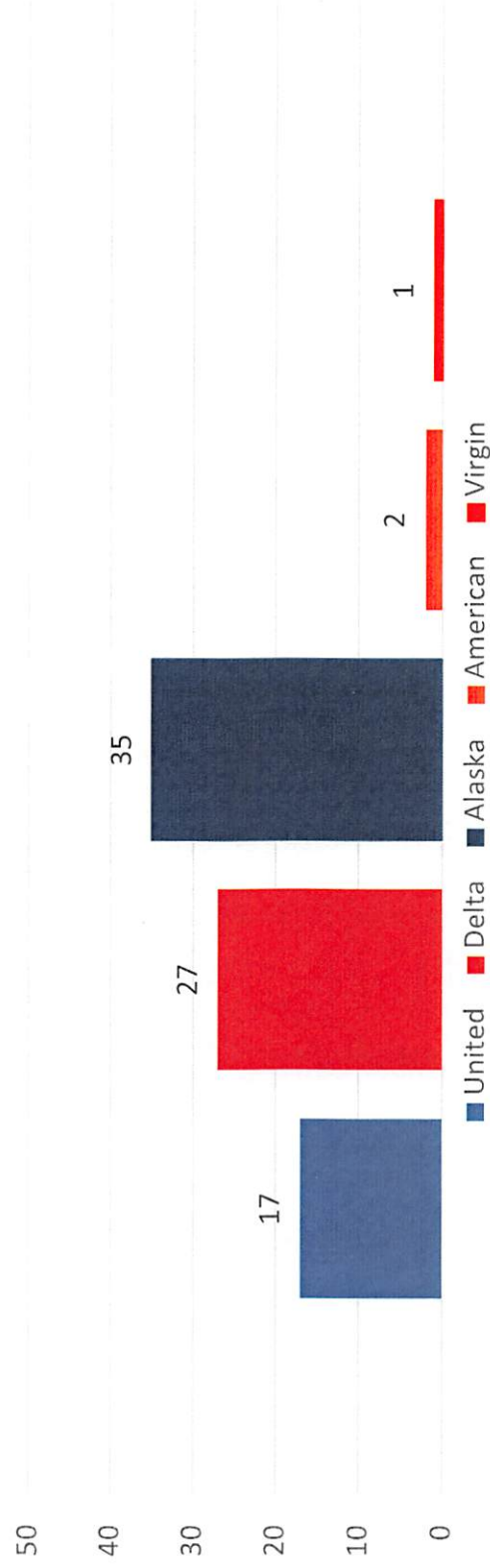

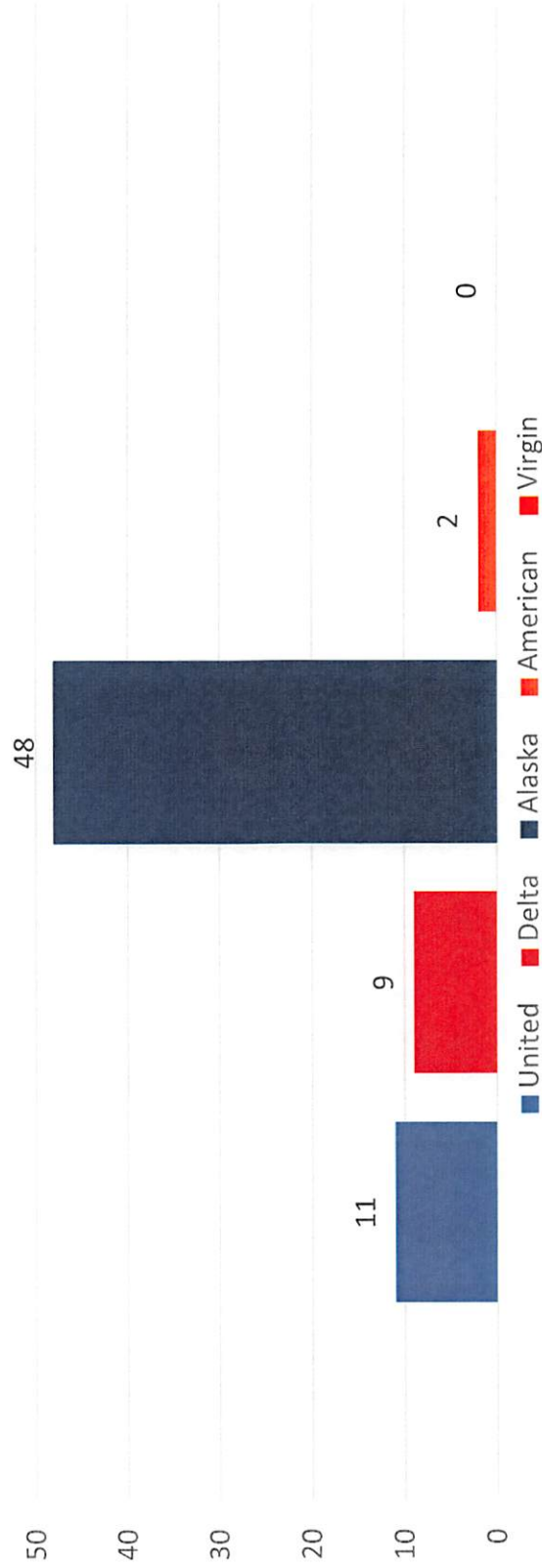

About Boutique Air

Our Story

Headquartered in San Francisco, California, Boutique Air has been in operation since 2007. We began by flying fire surveillance missions for the U.S. Forestry Service and Bureau of Land Management. We evolved to provide air charter services across the west coast with our fleet of Pilatus and Cessna aircraft. As a charter operator we have received certifications from both industry-leading safety organizations, ARG/US and Wyvern. Boutique Air employs pilots that are highly experienced and hold the most advanced FAA ratings - a key reason for our continued perfect safety record.

In July of 2012, Boutique Air applied for commuter operating authority from the Department of Transportation. We quickly passed tests on financial fitness and management competency, receiving authority for scheduled service in January of 2014. We began flying scheduled service between Los Angeles and Las Vegas in January of 2014.

We have worked to develop effective distribution channels. We have connections in place with all of the major Global Distribution Systems (GDSs), which travel agents use to access the market. You will find us on Worldspan and Galileo (Travelport), Sabre, and Amadeus. In addition, we are on the major Online Travel Agencies (OTAs), including Expedia, Travelocity, Priceline, Orbitz, CheapTickets, and CheapOAir.

EAS Contracts

On April 22, 2014 Boutique Air received its first EAS contract when the DOT selected the airline to provide service between Clovis and DFW. Since then, we have continued our track record of success and now serve 16 different EAS communities and operate out of 27 different airports. Continuing on a path of successful growth in the EAS market, Boutique Air will begin service to Massena, NY in April of this year.

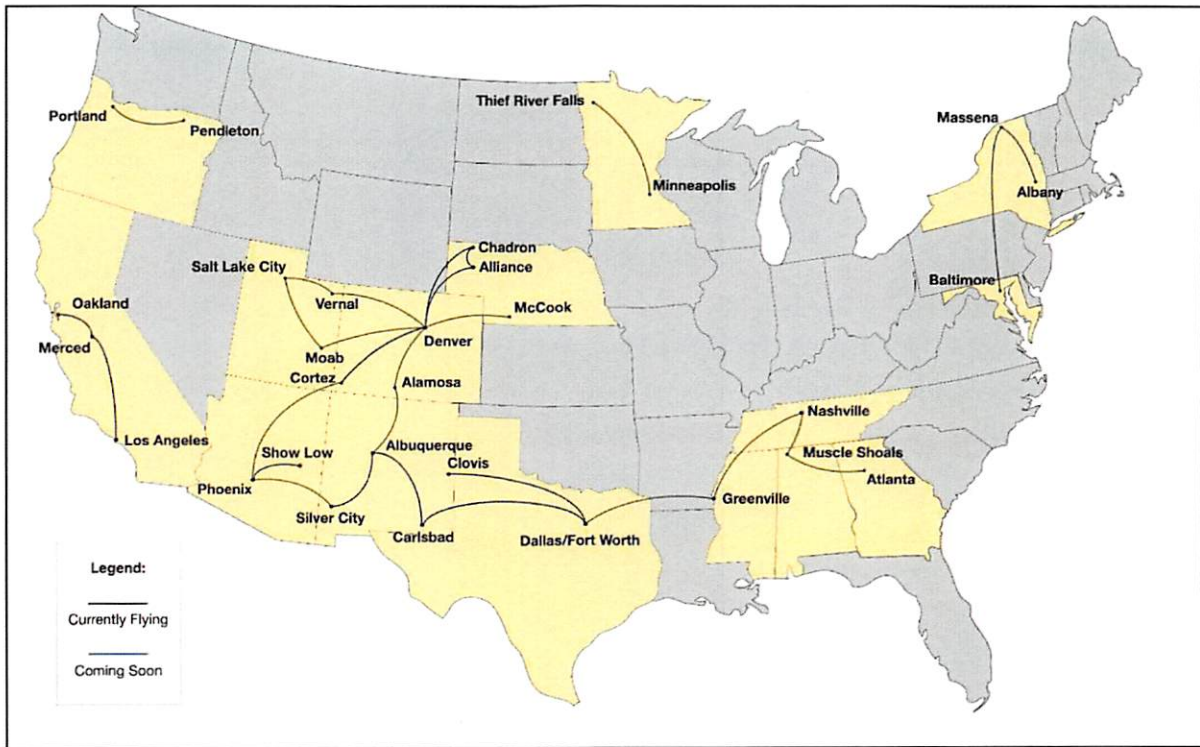

Historical Passenger Traffic Performance

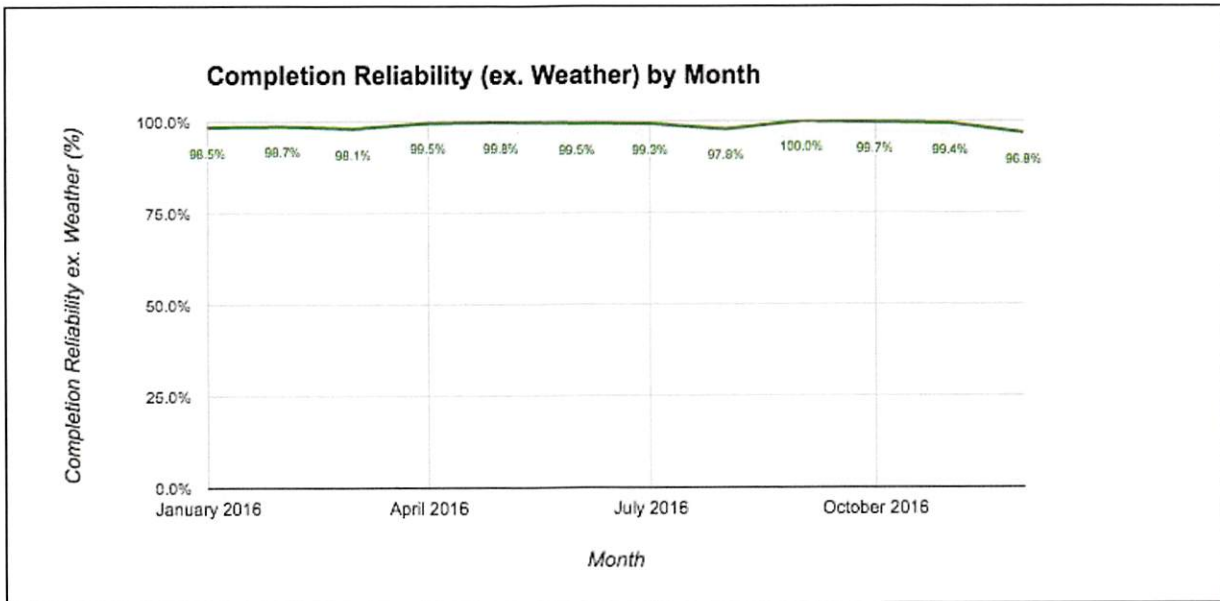

Boutique Air also prides itself on its flight completion reliability. For the year ending December 2016, Boutique Air averaged a completion reliability of 98.9% across its network (*12 months T100 data ending Dec 2016*).





Proposal

Overview

Our proposals would be flown in eight or nine-seat, modern, pressurized Pilatus PC-12 and Beechcraft King Air 350 aircraft. The term is two years, with a four year option.

In order to increase brand recognition in the community, Boutique Air will spend at least \$20,000 per year if it is selected for advertising & marketing to help ensure that air service for the community is a success. We will utilize a combination of radio, print, billboard, TV, and internet advertising.

Note on Service Start Date

Boutique Air will begin service 60-90 days after the DOT issues the order selecting Boutique Air as the EAS carrier. Boutique air will start service as early as operationally possible.

Note on Interline Agreements

Boutique Air is in the process of implementing an interline agreement with one of the major airlines and expects it to be in place by early 2017.

Community Input

Shortly after the bids are complete, Boutique Air will schedule meetings with airport and/or city officials. This will allow us to answer any questions and provide additional information.

While we can't promise we will be able to implement everyone's suggestions, we welcome feedback from the community, as well as anyone who may have an interest in the proposed flights. What we can promise is that we will listen to your feedback, and give it the attention and consideration it deserves.



Call to Order

Mayor Pieper called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Roll Call

Council present: Mayor Jake Pieper, Councilors Bill Hamilton, Brent Hodges, Roger Thompson and Dennis Triglia; Student Ex Officio Shawntisha Bailey present; a quorum present.

Staff present: Finance and Human Resources Director Janell Howard, City Attorney Martha Rice, Public Works and Development Director Paul Stevens, Building Inspector Garrett Thomson, Treatment Plant Chief Operator Ray Page and City Recorder Teri Davis.

Media Present: No media present

Others Present: Two audience members.

Resolutions

Updates to Engineering Requirements and Standard Specs (ERSS) for Infrastructure

Building Inspector Thomson presented the Staff Report

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Hodges seconded and Council voted unanimously with an advisory "aye" from Ex Officio Bailey to approve updated Engineering Requirements and Standard Specifications for Public Works Infrastructure.

Director Howard noted that a separate action needed to be taken to approve the Resolution.

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Hodges seconded and Council voted unanimously with an advisory "aye" from Ex Officio Bailey to adopt Resolution 17-R-1102.

Master Fee Schedule

Director Howard presented the staff report.

Council asked for specifics regarding the Court's Failure to Appear fee, the Capella use fee for music performance and the removal of the Notary service.

Council requested that staff consider bringing back a change to the Court's Failure to Appear fee raising it to \$50.

Council requested that the stipulation for the Capella use of music performance not be limited only to non-profits.

Councilor Hodges moved, Councilor Triglia seconded and Council voted unanimously to adopt Resolution 17-R-1101 updating the Master Fee Schedule and repealing Resolution 16-R-1075.

Oral Requests and Communications from the audience

- No audience members requested to address Council.

Staff Reports

Treatment Services Request for Qualifications (RFQ)

Public Works and Development Director Stevens presented the staff report.

Mayor Pieper noted an issue with the language in the first paragraph of the second page of the RFQ in a clause regarding lobbying and prohibited contact with Councilors. Director Howard recommended changing the words “will be cause” to “may be cause for disqualification.” The change was approved by City Attorney Rice and agreed upon by Council.

Councilor Hodges moved, Councilor Thompson seconded and Council voted unanimously with an advisory “aye” from Student Ex Officio Bailey to issue a Request for Qualifications for the contract operation of water and wastewater treatment services.

Franchise Fees

Director Howard presented the staff report.

Council discussed the impacts of the fees and the City’s history with franchise fees.

Mayor Pieper reminded Council that this item only approves beginning the discussion. He added that he would like to have Coos Curry Electric Coop and Curry Transfer & Recycling invited to a public meeting to comment.

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Hodges seconded and Council voted unanimously with an advisory “aye” from Student Ex Officio Bailey to authorize staff to contact Coos Curry Electric Cooperative and Curry Transfer and Recycling to initiate discussion concerning adjusting franchise fees.

Trash Dogs Fee Waiver

Director Howard presented the staff report.

Mayor Pieper suggested that there could be a code change that would cover this type of request generally.

Councilor Thompson moved, Councilor Hamilton seconded and Council voted unanimously with an advisory “aye” from Student Ex Officio Bailey to grant a home occupation fee waiver to Trash Dogs a nonprofit corporation combating illegal dumping.

Council Liaisons

Mayor Pieper explained the impetus of this item and advised Council that they were under no obligation to volunteer.

Mayor Pieper read through the list of open liaison assignments and Councilors volunteered as interested.

Mayor Pieper requested that the finalized list be brought back to a future Council meeting for approval.

Council took no other action on this item.

Consent Calendar

1. Approve Council minutes for March 27, 2017

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Hamilton seconded and Council voted to approve the Consent Calendar with four Councilors voting "aye" and Councilor Thompson abstaining, and with an advisory "aye" from Student Ex Officio Bailey.

Remarks from Mayor and Councilors

Councilor Hamilton noted that a comment had been made regarding that he had not announced the Cub Scouts' Pinewood Derby. He advised that he is not the liaison for the Cub Scouts.

Mayor Pieper spoke about his attendance at his first Border Coast Regional Airport Authority meeting last week.

Mayor Pieper advised Councilors to be thinking about the possibility of County law enforcement failure due to budget constraints, how that failure may impact Brookings citizens and what this Council may need to do to address the issue.

Mayor Pieper noted that he had received information about the Monarch City U.S.A. designation. He would put the information in the Council information box for those interested in looking it over.

Adjournment

Councilor Hodges moved, Councilor Hamilton seconded and Council voted by voice to adjourn the meeting at 8:02 p.m.


CHAIR ANNUAL REPORT

RE: Removal of 60 Trees in Azalea Park

Many people who enjoy Azalea Park, the majority who live in Brookings-Harbor but including former residents and those who visit from outside the area, are asking the City of Brookings to halt its plan to cut more than 60 trees in the park.

More than 500 individuals opposed the tree removal in an online petition started by Brookings residents just a few days after the City publicized its imminent plan to cut the trees. And the opposition continues to rise.

The decision to cut the 60 plus trees, which was planned for today, April 24, 2017.

It makes sense that there are things to be done before removing 60+ trees and before making any other major modifications to the park.

The decision to remove the trees apparently was made after they were determined to be "hazard trees". This identification was made, according to city officials, after a "brief walk" through the park with an "Urban Forester". The identification was aided by a pamphlet "How to Recognize and Prevent Tree Hazards". No other criteria was used or expert opinions requested.

Concerned citizens have contacted a professional arborist, willing to look at the situation and give an opinion without cost to the City, regarding tree removal.

City residents also are confused after hearing that some trees have been cut because they are shading the park's native Azaleas and this may continue. None of the trees to be cut are shading the Azaleas. A professional landscaper also has agreed, without cost, to look at the park and give an assessment.

Azalea Park is included in the City's Master Plan for its parks, updated in 2011. It states that Azalea Park include organized group activities, community focal points and preserving open spaces and unique landscapes.

These are positive, but minimal, guidelines. Azalea Park, as far as can be determined, has never had an environmental inventory; if a more detailed Master Plan for the park exists, concerned citizens can't locate it.

In order to know how to best manage what many consider one of the best parts of Brookings, an environmental inventory and a Master Plan for the park are essential.

Solid, detailed, knowledge of the trees and plants, open spaces, wetlands and animals of the park, in addition to thoughtfully determining human wants and needs, are essential to developing a Master Plan.

A Master Plan, specifically made for Azalea Park, will help insure its best future and flexibility regarding its use by people.

The citizens of the City of Brookings respectfully request that the City not proceed with the removal of 60 trees from Azalea Park. Please find attached a petition and signatures from local residents who do not want the trees to be removed.
