

RESOLUTION NO. 298

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A CITY TAX BASE ELECTION IN THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, OREGON, ON MAY 18, 1982, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, OREGON THE QUESTION OF ESTABLISHING A NEW TAX BASE FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPLYING THE LIMITATION ON TAXATION SET FORTH IN ARTICLE XI, SECTION 11, OREGON CONSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Brookings, Oregon, has determined that a new tax base should be established as authorized by Article XI, Section 11, Subsection (2), Oregon Constitution, in order to permit the proper operation of the City affairs within the limitation contained in Article XI, Section 11, Oregon Constitution, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to submit the question of establishing a new tax base to the legal voters of the City of Brookings, Oregon;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

Section 1. Date of Election. The measure set forth in Section 2 shall be submitted in the manner prescribed herein to the legal voters of the City of Brookings, Oregon, at a city tax base election to be held on May 18, 1982.

Section 2. Form of Question. At the city tax base election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Brookings for their approval or rejection, the following measure:

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, May 18, 1982, an election will be held in the City of Brookings, Curry County, Oregon. The polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The following question shall be submitted to the qualified voters thereof:

CAPTION: ESTABLISHING A NEW TAX BASE

QUESTION: Shall the City of Brookings be allowed to establish a new tax base of \$505,392 in fiscal year 1982-83?

PURPOSE: The Constitution of the State of Oregon Article XI, Section 11 allows municipalities a 6% annual increase of their tax base without specific voter approval. Funds received from this tax base are added to State shared revenues, Permit and License fees and Interest earnings to provide Police and Fire protection, Administrative and Planning services, Legislative, Judicial and Legal services as well as Library, Parks and Recreation activities.

The over-all budget for the City of Brookings is decreasing over \$20,000 and the difference between projected revenues and projected expenditures remains \$505,392. Approval of this tax base will increase the present base from \$141,400 to \$505,392.

If approved this will be the first tax base adjustment outside the 6% constitutional limit since the City's incorporation in 1951.

If this measure is approved, \$505,392 of the taxes levied in the 1982-83 fiscal year will be financed partially by the State of Oregon.

Section 1. Date of Election. The members set forth in Section 2 shall be elected in the manner prescribed herein to two yearly terms in the City of New York, to wit: one on the first day of January, 1901, and the other on the first day of January, 1902.

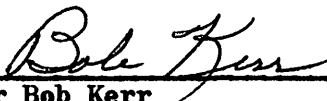

Section 3. Notice of Election. Notice of the city tax base election shall be given by publication twice in the Curry Coastal Pilot, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Brookings, Oregon, not more than thirty (30) nor less than ten (10) days before the election. Notices of the city tax base election shall be posted for not less than twenty (20) days before the election in three public places within the city. The notice in the newspaper and that posted in three (3) public places shall be substantially the same as the ballot measure in Section 2 of this Resolution.

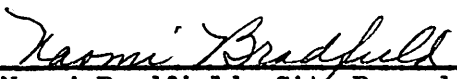
Section 4. Posting of Notices; Voters' Pamphlets Unnecessary. The City Recorder shall advertise and post or cause to be posted the notices required by Section 3 of this Resolution. The notices of the city tax base election required to be given by Section 3 shall constitute the only notice necessary. It shall be unnecessary for either the City of Brookings or any official thereof to furnish the legal voters at the city tax base election pamphlets containing either (a) the text of the proposition or (b) arguments in support of or in opposition to the proposition.

Section 10. Posting of Notices: Notices of election shall be posted on or near the entrance to the building of the city and shall be given by the city clerk or any other person authorized by the city council. It shall be necessary to file with the city clerk a copy of the notice of election and a copy of the text of the proposition or of the proposition and its amendments in support of it or in opposition to the proposition.
