

RESOLUTION No. 389

WHEREAS, an emergency is found to exist pertaining to the immediate need for the construction of a waterline from the City of Brookings along U.S. Highway 101 to the South-coast Lumber Company; and


WHEREAS, the emergency conditions necessitating the prompt execution of a contract for the construction and installation of said waterline is that if such construction is not substantially completed on or before August 25, 1986 that approximately 240 people will be laid off from their employment; and,

WHEREAS, the lay-off of such a large number of the work force at the largest employer in Southern Curry County would have drastic economic consequences for the Southern part of the County and the City of Brookings; and,

As a result and consequence of said emergency it is hereby

RESOLVED that a public contract be let without formal competitive bidding and said contract be promptly executed for the construction and installation of that certain project known as the "U.S. HIGHWAY 101 WATERLINE IMPROVEMENTS", said contract being let to the person or organization who can best effectuate a substantial cost savings to the City of Brookings in the construction of said project; and further that the actual letting of said contract be done and performed by the Contract Review Board of and for the City of Brookings.
