#### CITY OF BROOKINGS SPECIAL COMMON COUNCI/PLANNING COMMISSION STUDY SESSION MINUTES

Mayor Bob Hagbom called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. After the Pledge of Allegiance those present introduced themselves. Attending the meeting were: Mayor Bob Hagbom, City Councilors Rick Dentino, Larry Curry, Frances Johns Kern, and Craig Mickelson; Planning Commission Chair Randy Gorman, Commissioners Bill Smith, Russ Fritz, Jim Collis, Ernest Cofrances, Bruce Nishioka; Curry County Planner Grant Young; City Staff: City Manager Leroy Blodgett, Planning Director John Bischoff, Community Development Director Leo Lightle, and Administrative Secretary Linda Barker and approximately 10 citizens. Representing Oregon States Parks and Recreation Department were Cary Sutter, Kristin Stallman, and Andrew LaTomme.

LaTomme gave a PowerPoint presentation showing the history of Harris Beach State Park. Then Stallman proceeded with a more technical presentation outlining the goals of the Masterplan process and 20-year goals for Harris Beach State Park in particular. Several questions were raised about the stated goals and process. Clarity was given over the City Ordinance for transient businesses and the need for permanent foundations on all buildings as pertaining to a proposed concession area at the lower day use area. There was discussion on an emergency exit from the Dawson Tract area.

Planning Commission Chair Gorman suggested a special meeting of the Planning Commission to take public input on this subject. State Parks Department personnel will work with City Staff to set a date for this meeting. After the special Planning Commission meeting the Commissioners will give a recommendation to the City Council who will act on the request at a regular Council meeting.

By mutual agreement the City Council/Planning Commission joint work session adjourned at 8:20 p.m.





#### What's in a name?


- Named for George Scott Harris, a native of Perth, Scotland

#### **Advent of the State Park**


- Originally acquired by State Highway Commission in 1926 (17.58 acres)

- Today the park totals over 172 Acres















































# Overview of the Master Planning Process to date

- Harris beach SRA Master Plan developed as a component of the Curry County State Parks Master Plan
- Curry County State Park Master Planning commenced in 1999
- Draft Master Plan included 17 state park properties totaling over 9265 acres
- Over 20 county-wide meetings including a meeting with our neighbors along West Harris Heights Road in August 2003
- Harris Beach is the only property included in the draft master plan not under County Jurisdiction.
   Requires separate land use application








#### **Design Parameters**

- Avoiding conflicts with existing park uses and facilities
- Providing good access and circulation for vehicular and non-motorized travel within the park
- Placing facilities, roads, and trails in a manner which is understandable by the public to help them find facilities they are interested in
- Avoid significant impacts to important natural or cultural resources in or adjacent to the park
- Present an appearance that is harmonious to the setting of the park and the region and the state




### Design Parameters Cont.


- Providing choices for park visitors who may have different desires for park amenities and settings

- Providing opportunities for access by visitors with disabilities or different economic backgrounds





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














# **Summary of Traffic Impact Study**

### Goal 8 Recreational Needs Comp Plan Proposed Text Amendment

3. The City of Brookings adopts the Curry County State Parks Master Plan as it applies to Harris Beach State Recreation Area, to serve as a guide to future use and development of the park. The master plan provides for both protection and public enjoyment of the state park resources and provides for the most appropriate recreation related uses for the park based on resource opportunities and constraints, public recreation needs and the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department's role as a public recreation provider.

Through this process, the development proposals outlined in the Curry County State Parks Master Plan shall be allowed as outright use subject to the development review procedures specified in the adopted master plan and applicable county standards.

## Public/Open Space Zoning Designation – Proposed Amendment

40.020 Permitted Uses. The following uses are permitted:

A. Publicly owned parks and/or recreation facilities, including recreational parks, swimming pools, tennis courts, playgrounds and picnic areas. Park uses and facilities consistent with a park master plan adopted pursuant OAR 660 Division 34. The master planned uses must comply with the design standards in the master plan and with other applicable standards contained in the ordinance.
