

RESOLUTION NO. 3

Whereas the Forestry Service of the United States has requested the sum of \$17,000,000.00 to be appropriated by Congress to be used in the construction of access roads within the National Forrest Reserve located in the States of Oregon and Washington and has placed its request regularly before Congress, and

Whereas these said access roads are to be constructed and used for the purpose of salvaging timber located upon the said Forrest Reserve, and

Whereas it is reasonable to assume that certain of these said access roads will be constructed upon that portion of the Forrest Reserve extending between Brookings and Grants Pass, and

Whereas it is reasonable to assume that access roads to be constructed in this area will be constructed along the line of a highway proposed to be constructed between Brookings and a point on U. S. Highway 199 located in the vicinity of Selma, Oregon, and

Whereas it now becomes apparent that the road construction proposed by the Forrestry Service in this area shall prove to be a valuable link in connecting two highways now in use as the same are presently constructed Northeasterly from Brookings and Southwesterly from Selma, and


Whereas the time appears to be appropriate, on the part of the residents of Southern Oregon, to show the immediate necessity for the construction of a highway from Brookings Northeasterly to U.S. Highway 199, and

Whereas the construction of a continuous highway from Brookings to Grants Pass, through the State of Oregon, is in the best interests of the State of Oregon, NOW THEREFORE :

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, OREGON:

1. That a continuous highway through the State of Oregon from Brookings to Grants Pass should be immediately constructed.
2. That the City Recorder be, and she hereby is, authorised to call a public meeting to be held in the Brookings-Harbor High School on March 25th, 1954 at 8.00 o'clock P.M. of said date.
3. That this meeting shall be called for the purpose of creating a permanent body to take such action and make such plans as shall be necessary to bring about the immediate construction of the said highway.
4. That the City Recorder notify all religious, fraternal and civic organizations within Southern Curry County of said meeting and request each of the same to send representatives to the said meeting and further to publicise this meeting in the Brookings-Harbor Pilot and in such publicity invite all residents of Southern Curry County, who are interested in the construction of a highway from Brookings to U. S. Highway 199, to attend this meeting.
