#### **Call to Order**

Mayor Pieper called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

### **Roll Call**

Council present: Mayor Jake Pieper, Councilors Bill Hamilton, Roger Thompson and Dennis Triglia present; Councilor Brent Hodges absent; a quorum present.

## **Ceremonies**

Worldwide Candle Lighting Day

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Thompson seconded and Council voted unanimously to proclaim the second Sunday in December as Worldwide Candle Lighting Day.

Georgia Cockerham, representing The Compassionate Friends Northwest Coast Chapter accepted the proclamation.

#### **Scheduled Appearances**

Curry Community Health

Ken Dukek and other staff members of Curry Community Health presented to Council regarding the services provided by the clinic.

#### **Oral Requests and Communications from the audience**

No audience members requested to address Council on non-agenda items.

#### **Staff Reports**

Azalea Park Tree Removal

City Manager Milliman explained the three options recommended by staff.

Councilor Triglia moved, Mayor Pieper seconded and Council voted 2-2 to strike staff recommendation #1 from the option list. Motion failed.

Parks and Planning Manager Baron presented the staff report.

Council asked staff to clarify several specifics about the options.

Council discussed the various options, costs, and safety issues.

Councilor Triglia moved to remand the measure back to Parks and Recreation Committee for more discussion and new recommendation. Motion died due to lack of second.

Councilor Hamilton moved to table the decision to a subsequent Council meeting where all Councilors could be present. Motion died due to lack of second.

Councilor Thompson moved, Mayor Pieper seconded, and Council voted 3-1 with Councilor Triglia voting 'Nay,' to authorize the removal of 35 trees within the Azalea Park tree removal work plan area.

Possible Moratorium on Marijuana Dispensaries

City Attorney Rice presented the staff report.

Gordon Clay of P.O. Box 12, Brookings spoke in opposition to the moratorium.

Council discussed current laws, current enforcement issues, free market implications.

Council took no action on the measure.

Golf Course Property Tax

City Manager Milliman presented the staff report.

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Hamilton seconded and Council voted unanimously to authorize the City Manager and City Attorney to pursue an appeal of the property tax assessment for the Salmon Run Golf Course to the Curry County Property Tax Board of Appeals.

Brookings Harbor Community Theater Fee Refund

Parks and Planning Manager Baron presented the staff report.

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Hamilton seconded and Council voted unanimously to refund park use fees in the amount of \$123.00 to the Brookings Harbor Community Theater.

Beat the Brewers Event Evaluation

City Recorder Davis presented the staff report.

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Thompson seconded and Council voted unanimously to accept the Beat the Brewers Relay Event Evaluation report.

Rock the Chetco Event Evaluation

City Recorder Davis presented the staff report.

Councilor Thompson moved, Councilor Triglia seconded and Council voted unanimously to accept the Rock the Chetco Event Evaluation report.

Councilor Triglia moved, Councilor Hamilton seconded and Council voted unanimously to approve the Consent Calendar.

# **Remarks from Mayor and Councilors**

Councilor Hamilton stated he is disappointed with the vandalism in parks specifically at the Stout Mountain Railroad.

Mayor Pieper commented that the tree issue is a difficult one. He believed, however, that some good did come out of it such as an increase in volunteerism and community involvement.

Councilor Thompson moved, Councilor Triglia seconded, and Mayor Pieper adjourned the meeting at 9:37 p.m.
