



Authorize the Public Works Director to direct the City Engineer to proceed with a Change Order to the 2010/2011 Street Maintenance Project to include paving, sealing and striping of the City Hall parking lot in an amount not to exceed \$41,059.40.

#### **Financial Impact:**

There are adequate funds remaining in the street capital improvement fund.

#### **Background/Discussion:**

Staff recognized during City Hall Storm Drain project that the public parking area fronting Elk Drive was in need of a repair, and paving the gravel area at the northwest of the City Hall building would provide additional parking. Additional parking spaces are needed to meet minimum parking requirements for City Hall/Police/Fire and the addition of the Emergency Operating Center (EOC). These additional spaces will also better serve volunteers and others attending training and other events at the Fire Station and new EOC. The parking lot in front of the City Hall building was damaged by heavy equipment responding to the sink hole event. In addition, applying a scalant to the existing paving in the City parking lot would enhance the lifespan of this existing pavement.

Tidewater Contractors, Inc. is the contractor on the 2010/2011Street Maintenance Project. Strahm's Scalcoat and Striping has offered a proposal for seal coat and restriping and would serve as a subcontractor to Tidewater for completion of the change order tasks. Tidewater's change order proposal honors the same unit price as the work on the street project. Staff recommends moving forward with approval of this change order due to a reasonable price to complete this work and to construct before the winter season.

Subject: Social Security Bar

#### Recommended Motion:

Review alternatives and provide direction to staff.

#### **Financial Impact:**

From minor to major depending upon alternative selection. Minor would be cost of signage. Sale of property could generate revenue to City. Park planning would require staff and consultant resources.

#### Background/Discussion:

The City Council has discussed staff and neighbor concerns regarding the City's access to Social Security Bar and the relationship of the City property to activities on the bar. City police and fire services responded to several events occurring on the bar this past summer, including an RV fire that resulted in a death.

The City Council has indicated its desire to maintain unrestricted access to Social Security Bar through the City's property on North Bank Chetco River Road. The City owns a 1.61-acre parcel at this location, upon which the main access driveway to Social Security Bar is located. The City also pays for a portable toilet service on the property.

Staff is coordinating with various State agencies that have jurisdiction on the bar itself to install a more visible and informative sign at the entrance to the bar, drawing greater attention to State regulations including:

- Overnight camping is prohibited on the bar (the bar is posted as closed between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.).
- Fishing and water craft regulations.
- No fires are permitted from May 1 to November 1.

Staff has discussed the long term status of the access and the City property with representatives of the Department of State Lands and the Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). According to State agency representatives, the Oregon State Police, which has law enforcement jurisdiction on the bar, has recommended the installation of a seasonal gate at the bar entrance.

Staff has developed the following long term alternatives with respect to the City property adjacent to Social Security Bar:

#### RETAIN OWNERSHIP, IMPROVE SIGNAGE AND SEEK VENDORS

Under this option, the City would retain ownership of the property, improve regulatory signage and seek vendors to conduct seasonal business activity on the City property, such as kayak rental, food service or bait service. Minimal revenues would be anticipated, but would contribute to the City's cost of maintaining the property and the portable toilet located there.

#### RETAIN OWNERSHIP AND PREPARE PARK DEVELOPMENT PLAN

An expansion of the first alternative and would include developing a plan to improve the property as a public park. Improvements might include picnic areas and improved pedestrian access to the bar. The City could attempt to organize volunteer resources among anglers and pursue grant funding for development of the park

#### **CONVEY PROPERTY TO THE STATE**

The Department of Fish and Wildlife may be willing to accept the property and manage it as an access to the Chetco River. Staff understands that ODFW has made agreements with non-profit anglers groups to manage access at several locations on ODFW-controlled lands. Under this option, the City would no longer have any control or liability associated with maintaining this property. The City would also lose control over managing the access.


#### SELL THE PROPERTY AND RESERVE ACCESS EASEMENT

The property could be sold as surplus to the City's needs to a private party or non-profit organization. As a part of the transaction, the City could provide that a corridor from North Bank Chetco River Road would be reserved as an easement for unrestricted public access.

#### Hi Gary:

As you know the public access at Social Security Bar is a primary boat take-out for salmon and steelhead anglers on the Chetco River. Social Security Bar is also a popular access for bank fishermen.

ODFW's primary interest, as the City considers its management options, is in maintaining angler access. Since all four management alternatives, as presented in the staff report, maintain public access ODFW would be comfortable with whichever alternative the City chooses to pursue. That being said ODFW would prefer that the City maintain ownership. Park development, vendor lease, or any other activities consistent with Curry County planning ordinances would be OK with ODFW, provided that angler access was not impaired. If the City decided to convey the property to another agency ODFW would look seriously at accepting the property in order to maintain public ownership, but I can't give you 100% assurance the we would take on the property. The 4<sup>th</sup> alternative, sell the property while reserving an access easement, generally works pretty well for providing public access although conflicts over terms of the easement are not uncommon, at least in my experience.

Subject: Agreement for Judge Pro Tem Services

#### Recommended Motion:

Motion to approve Agreement for Services as Municipal Judge Pro Tem with James Fallman with a monthly stipend of \$200.00 effective January 1, 2012.

#### Financial Impact:

Substantial additional revenues are anticipated with the addition of traffic cases to the Municipal Court. This agreement would increase the City judicial services cost by \$200.00 per month.

#### **Background/Discussion:**

The City will soon be expanding the existing Municipal Court to include handling traffic violations. Judge Richard Harper and Judge Pro Tem James Fallman plan to hold court two days per month, one day court session and one night court session. The program is scheduled to begin in November with full implementation in January.

Currently, the City provides a \$300.00 per month stipend to Judge Harper for service as Municipal Court Judge, but does not compensate Judge Fallman as his role has been to serve periodically as a substitute for Harper. With the addition of traffic cases, the Court will be convening more frequently and Judge Fallman will be serving more regularly. Judge Fallman has requested a stipend of \$200 per month.

# AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES MUNICIPAL JUDGE PRO TEM

#### **RECITALS**

- 1. City seeks to enter into a contractual agreement with Fallman for the provision of Municipal Judge Pro Tem services.
- 2. Fallman has served City in the capacity of Municipal Judge Pro Tem since April 20, 2006.
- 3. Fallman desires to continue to provide Pro Tem services as defined by this Agreement.

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Parties agree as follows:

#### **TERMS OF AGREEMENT:**

1. <u>Contract for services</u>: City contracts with James Fallman for Municipal Judge Pro Tem services for the City of Brookings.

#### 2. Duties of Municipal Judge Pro Tem:

- a. Pro Tem will fully and faithfully perform all of the duties of Municipal Judge Pro Tem as defined under Chapter 2.25 of the Brookings Municipal Code, and the duties and performance responsibilities set forth in the attached job description, incorporated into this Agreement as Exhibit "A."
- b. It is understood that, from time to time, the Pro Tem will also perform such other duties as may be assigned by the City Council.
- c. The Pro Tem must comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations and faithfully discharge the duties of Municipal Judge Pro Tem to the best of Pro Tem's ability.
- **3.** <u>Compensation</u>: Beginning January 1, 2012, Pro Tem's services will be compensated at the rate of \$200 per month.
- **4.** <u>Term:</u> Pro Tem acknowledges that the City Council may, by majority vote, terminate this Agreement and relieve him of any and all Pro Tem duties and responsibilities, for any reason and with or without notice. City acknowledges that Pro Tem may terminate this Agreement for any reason with or without notice.

#### 5. Status as Independent Contractor:

a. City and Pro Tem enter this Agreement with the understanding that Pro Tem will not be an officer or employee of the City, but rather will serve as an independent contractor. As such, Pro Tem acknowledges that he will not be eligible to receive employee benefits, including, but not limited to: social security, worker's compensation and unemployment benefits.

Municipal Judge Pro Tem Contract

- b. City will not control the day-to-day activities and administration of justice by Pro Tem.
- c. Pro Tem hereby releases, acquits, and forever discharges City from any claims made by Pro Tem, available to him now or in the future, that he is other than an independent contractor.
- d. Pro Tem will indemnify, defend and hold City harmless against any and all damages, costs, fees or expenses (including attorneys' fees) that he may have against City arising from service to City, except as otherwise set forth in this Agreement and excepting claims arising from a negligent act of City.

#### 6. **General Provisions**:

- a. This Agreement, including the exhibits, constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties. Each of the exhibits identified in this Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated by this reference.
- b. Any modification or amendment to this Agreement must be made in writing and signed by both parties.
- c. This Agreement is personal to the Parties. The Pro Tem may not assign nor delegate his duties hereunder.
- d. This Agreement is executed on behalf of City as authorized by its City Council.

## CITY OF BROOKINGS MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE

#### **GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES:**

The Municipal Court Judge is the judicial officer of the City of Brookings and shall preside over the Municipal Court of the City of Brookings.

#### **DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASSIFICATION:**

The Municipal Court Judge shall have authority to issue process for the arrest of any person accused of an offense against the ordinances of the City of Brookings; to commit any such person to jail or admit him to bail pending trial; to issue subpoenas; to compel witnesses to appear and testify in court on the trial of any cause before the court; to compel obedience to such subpoenas; to issue any process necessary to carry in effect the judgments of the court; and to punish witnesses for contempt of court.

#### **SUPERVISION RECEIVED:**

The Municipal Court Judge works under the supervision of the City Council. The Municipal Judge is appointed and may be removed by a majority of the Council.

#### **JURISDICTION:**

All of the incorporated area, now or hereafter, within the City of Brookings shall be within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipal Court and the Municipal Court Judge.

The Municipal Court Judge shall exercise jurisdiction of all offenses defined and made punishable by ordinance of the City of Brookings and of all actions brought to recover or enforce forfeitures or penalties defined or authorized by ordinances of the City of Brookings.

#### **SUPERVISION EXERCISED:**

No employees are supervised by the Municipal Court Judge.

#### **KEY PERFORMANCE AREAS:**

The Municipal Court Judge shall have authority to form and adopt reasonable rules for the conduct of the business of the Municipal Court for the City of Brookings; provided, however, that he/she shall not form or adopt any rule which contravenes the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of Oregon, the laws of the State of Oregon or any ordinance of the City of Brookings.

The Municipal Court Judge shall set the days and hours that the Municipal Court for the City of Brookings will be in session for the transaction of judicial business.

#### Monday, October 10, 2011

City Hall Council Chambers, 898 Elk Drive, Brookings, OR 97415

#### **Call to Order**

Mayor Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

#### **Roll Call**

Council Present: Mayor Larry Anderson, Councilors Ron Hedenskog, Dave Gordon, Jake Pieper, and Brent Hodges; a quorum present.

Staff Present: City Manager Gary Milliman, Public Works Director Loree Pryce, Fire Chief William Sharp, Planning Director Dianne Morris, City Engineer Steve Major, City Attorney Martha Rice and City Recorder Joyce Heffington.

Others Present: Curry Coastal Pilot Reporter Steve Kadel and approximately 10 public.

#### **Ceremonies/Appointments/Announcements**

Mayor Anderson proclaimed the week of October 9<sup>th</sup> as Fire Prevention Week.

#### **Staff Reports**

Authorize the Mayor to sign the Tiger II grant application letter of support.

Director Morris presented the staff report regarding the City's intent to apply for Tiger II grant for the bicycle/pedestrian path.

Councilor Hedenskog moved, a second followed and Council voted unanimously to approve Mayor to sign the letter [of support] in the staff report [regarding the Tiger II grant application].

Authorize the Mayor to sign the new Curry County Mutual Aid Agreement.

Chief Sharp gave the staff report, generally stating that the new agreement will have all of the original signatures on one document.

Councilor Pieper moved, a second followed and Council voted unanimously to authorize the Mayor to sign the new Curry County Mutual Aid Agreement.

Reject proposal to install an alternative sewer system designed by Orenco Systems.

Director Pryce presented the staff report and a revised recommendation to include an Infrastructure Financing Agreement for the purpose of outlining "...the use of a portion of the developer system development funds contributing to the cost of a conventional system."

Deborah Newsome, Riverside RV Resort, Brookings, generally commented that initial costs associated with the Orenco system makes it a more viable option and asked Council to look closely at the statistics provided by Orenco.

David Lepre, Orenco Systems, Sutherlin, Oregon, questioned the number of EDU's being used by the City Engineer in his report, generally stating that operations and maintenance (O&M) costs are significantly less than presented. Lepre also commented that the Orenco system would initially cost less than a gravity system, would offer a "huge environmental benefit" over a gravity system and incur minimal costs for treatment at the plant.

Ron Tribble, Brookings, generally reinforced Lepre's comments, adding that projects would not go forward without the Orenco system and asked Council to allow it.

Marianne Padilla, Brookings, asked Council to keep an open mind about the proposal and generally commented that the addition of waterfront homes and additional property taxes would be a benefit to the City and the local economy.

Mayor Anderson stated, for the record, that this item is somewhat unique in that Council was considering it in advance of an application being submitted due to the potential application costs to the proposer.

City Engineer Steve Major said that he is aware of situations where STEP systems are appropriate, but with the potential number of EDU's involved the long term costs for O&M are significant higher.

Councilor Hodges asked if it would be feasible to put in a gravity system after the STEP system was in place, and Major said it would not be feasible because the STEP system uses a smaller diameter pipe than a gravity system does to pump solids.

Mayor Anderson said that while he shared some of the developer's concerns, he was a little concerned that a local improvement district wasn't being considered for this area.

Councilor Hedenskog said that, as far as actual costs are concerned, it becomes a "he said, she said," situation, and he was unable to make a decision based on O&M costs. Hedenskog said his biggest concern is that developers who are ready to "rock and roll" could end up locking the larger area into a type of system others may not want. His recommendation was for the formation of a local improvement district.

Councilor Hodges said that, in the long term, the deferral of costs associated with a STEP system would seem to benefit the developer, and not the City, and could pose a possible hindrance to future development in that area.

Councilor Pieper said that he agreed with Hedenskog that it's a "he said, she said," situation, and added that, "... basically it comes down to who you trust more or who you pay more, or something to that effect." In his view, Pieper said, the biggest problem was "...saddling everyone else up there with using the same system," and added that it seemed to him there must be another type of alternative system that could work.

Councilor Gordon said that Council's responsibility was to look at long term issues and he did not want to support a project that would ultimately cost more. Gordon also expressed concern that if this system was approved, it would make it difficult to say no to another developer wanting to put in the same kind of system somewhere else.

Councilor Hedenskog asked if there was a combination system that could work and Major said that it's possible to have a combination system, but the question was what the City would require as criteria to determine if and when a STEP system would be appropriate so that this type of system wasn't going in everywhere.

Councilor Hedenskog moved, a second followed and Council voted unanimously to accept staff's recommendation to reject the proposal from the North Bank Landowner's Group [to install an alternative sewer system designed by Orenco Systems].

Councilor Hedenskog moved, a second followed and Council voted unanimously to direct staff to consider a combined system in that [North Bank Chetco] area.

Councilor Hedenskog moved, a second followed and Council voted unanimously that an Infrastructure Financing Agreement be created that outlines the use of a portion of the developer system development funds contributing to the cost of the conventional system.

Award contract for construction of Final Effluent Line Relocation Improvements to Central Pipeline, Inc.

Director Pryce presented the staff report.

Councilor Hedenskog moved, a second followed and Council voted unanimously to award contract as per dialogue given by the Public Works Director [for construction of Final Effluent Line Relocation improvements to Central Pipeline, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$125,808, and authorize the City Manager to execute all related documents].

#### **Public Hearings/Ordinances/Resolutions/Final Orders**

Resolution 11-R-972, accepting jurisdiction of that portion of Parkview Drive that lies within the City limits.

City Manager Milliman presented the staff report.

Councilor Pieper moved, a second followed and Council voted unanimously to adopt Resolution 11-R-972, accepting jurisdiction of that portion of Parkview Drive that lies within the City limits.

<u>Recommended Motion</u>: Motion to suspend the operation of the Urban Renewal Advisory Commission.

#### Background/Discussion:

Of the five members of the seven-seat Urban Renewal Advisory Commission, the terms of Dan Nachel, Joyce Tromblee and Rick Bishop expired October 10, and Mayor Anderson has indicated he plans to appoint Bryan Tillung to the Planning Commission. Tromblee and Bishop have applied for reappointment. The fifth member is Sadie Coberly, who has attended one meeting and was recently appointed to serve as Director of Administrative Services for the Curry County Board of Commissioners.

While the URAC was heavily involved in the façade improvement program and the downtown improvement project design, the role of the URAC is to advise the Agency concerning matters that are referred to the URAC by the Agency. No such referrals have been made or are contemplated. Funding for the façade improvement project has not been budgeted and the Agency is now focusing its efforts on completing additional phases of the downtown street improvement project which have been substantially designed.

Chairman Anderson has suggested that the Commission go into inactive status until such time as the Agency considers new projects.
