Subject: Fir Street Local Improvement District

<u>Recommended Motion</u>: Direct City Manager and City Engineer to meet with petitioners to review the preliminary engineering report for the Fir Street Local Improvement District and report back to the City Council.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: Total estimated cost of street reconstruction, installation of curb/gutter/sidewalk, drainage improvements, water/sewer line modifications due to street construction, and engineering is \$564,890.

Background/Discussion:

At its meeting of July 26, 2010, the City Council directed the City Manager and City Engineer to prepare a report for the formation of a Local Improvement District to install curbs, gutter and sidewalks along Fir Street. The direction was in response to a petition received from property owners in January requesting the formation of a district.

The City Engineer has prepared a preliminary engineering report (attached) which includes:

- 1. A description of the proposed improvements.
- 2. A preliminary cost estimate,
- 3. Proposed City and property owner shares of the cost.
- 4. A proposed spread of assessment.

In accordance with the Brookings Municipal Code, the City Council may now approve or modify the report, require additional information, or determine to abandon the project. The estimated overall cost of the project, and the amount of proposed assessment per parcel, are significantly higher than earlier estimates.

1. Proposed Improvements

The proposed street improvements for Fir Street consists of reconstruction of AC pavement, AC pavement overlay, installation of new drainage swale, storm drains, and catch basins, adjustment of manholes, pavement markings, and concrete curb and gutter and sidewalk improvements. The Fir Street Local Improvement District (LID) is part of the overall street improvement project.

Proposed improvements for the Fir Street LID: consist primarily of improvements to the concrete curb and gutters, and sidewalks. Concrete Curb and Gutter, and Sidewalk Improvements shall be installed along both sides of Fir Street. The concrete curb and gutter, and sidewalk improvements along the north side of Fir Street shall begin approximately 160 feet from Oak Street and continue to Old County Road. The concrete curb and gutter, and sidewalk improvements along the south side of Fir Street shall begin approximately 370 feet from Oak Street and continue to Old County Road. The new concrete sidewalks shall be five feet wide and shall be placed on 6 inches of new aggregate base.

2. Preliminary Improvement Plan

A preliminary plan of the Fir Street LID Curb and Gutter, and Sidewalk Improvements and Typical Street Section are show on Drawing C1. Typical Structural Street Section for the proposed improvements is shown in Figure 2.1. All Figures are located at the back of this report.

3. Proposed Boundary and Assessment District Plan

The proposed Fir Street LID boundary is shown in Figure 3.1. As indicated in the figure, the proposed LID boundary encompasses those properties that have frontage abutting Fir Street right-of-way.

4. Preliminary Cost Estimate

The total estimated project cost for the Fir Street Improvements is \$564,890. The estimated cost for the street improvements only is \$330,040. The estimated LID cost for the Fir Street Curb and Gutter, and Sidewalk Improvements is \$234,870. An itemized list for the overall Fir Street Improvements is provided in Table 4.1. Tables 4.2 and 4.3 breakout portion of the overall project that are specific to the street improvement that are being funded by the City of Brookings (Table 4.2), as well as the curbs and gutters and sidewalks that are being funded by the LID (Table 4.3).

5. Method of Assessment

The recommend method of assessment for the proposed Fir Street Curb and Gutter, and Sidewalk Improvements is as follows:

Properties directly fronting the proposed Fir Street Curb and Gutter, and Sidewalk Improvements, from Oak Street to Old County Road, shall be assessed on a lineal foot basis. The lineal foot price shall be determined by dividing the Total LID Cost by the Total Frontage. The assessment for an individual property shall be determined by multiplying the frontage of said property by the lineal foot price. The lineal price calculations are listed below.

Total LID Cost \$234.	,870
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Total Frontage (feet) 1886.91 ft

Lineal Foot Price (Cost/foot) \$124.47/ft

Subject: Amendment to Biosolids Agreement with City of Grants Pass

<u>Recommended Motion</u>: Motion to authorize City Manager to execute Amendment Number One to Wastewater Liquid Biosolids Dewatering and Composting Agreement with the City of Grants Pass.

<u>Financial Impact</u>: Three per cent increase in the cost of sludge disposal. The City spends about \$250,000 annually to transport and dispose of liquid biosolids from the wastewater treatment plant. Depending upon the progress of construction of the new biosolids treatment facility, this amount may be reduced in 2011 as we may only need to transport liquid sludge for a partial year under this contract.

Background/Discussion:

The City currently disposes of liquid biosolids from the wastewater treatment plant at a facility owned and operated by the City of Grants Pass. The liquid biosolids are transported to the Grants Pass facility by tanker truck operated by Roto Rooter. The City has a contract with Grants Pass for disposal of the liquid biosolids. Biosolids are typically transported to Grants Pass during the period July-October.

The City is pursuing the development of a biosolids dewatering facility in Brookings which will eliminate the need for transporting liquid biosolids to Grants Pass. Plans for this facility are currently under review by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality. Construction is expected in 2011. Staff anticipates that the City will have a need to transport liquid biosolids to Grants Pass through the summer period of 2011 pending completion of the dewatering facility.

An amendment to the existing agreement with the City of Grants Pass has been developed which authorizes disposal of liquid biosolids at the Grants Pass facility through December 2011. The disposal rate would be \$370 per dry ton (a calculation converting liquid to dry ton is contained in the agreement), a three per cent increase over the 2010 disposal rate of \$359 per dry ton.

AMENDMENT NUMBER ONE TO

BROOKINGS - GRANTS PASS WASTEWATER LIQUID BIOSOLIDS DEWATERING AND COMPOSTING AGREEMENT

This amendment is made and entered into this ______ day of October, 2010 by and between the City of Grants Pass, Oregon, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon hereinafter called "Grants Pass" and City of Brookings, Oregon, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, hereinafter called "Brookings".

Purpose of Amendment. This Amendment shall constitute the first amendment to the original agreement between Grants Pass and Brookings executed in 2008 for the delivery, dewatering and composting of biosolids produced at the Brookings Wastewater Treatment Plant. This amendment shall extend the expiration date of the agreement and adjust the fee for the biosolids delivered to the City of Grants Pass Water Restoration Plant (GPWRP).

<u>Amended Terms of Agreement</u>. It is mutually agreed by and between the parties to amend the Original Agreement as follows:

- 1. **EXPIRATION.** This agreement will run through December 31, 2011. Any extensions must be in writing and signed by the City of Grants Pass. City Manager or Public Works Director. The City of Grants Pass makes no expressed or implied representation that this agreement will be extended beyond December 31, 2011.
- 2. FEE. Brookings shall pay the Grants Pass the following fees for each dry ton of biosolids delivered to GPWRP. January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011 the fees will be \$370 per dry ton delivered. GPWRP will sample each load to determine the solids concentration. The weight will be calculated as follows: Volume x 8.34 pounds per gallon x percent dry weight concentration. If Brookings disagrees with GPWRP's determination it may (at its sole expense) have an independent laboratory split a sample with GPWRP for analysis. The independent laboratory's determination shall be controlling.

Same Terms and Conditions. With the exception of items explicitly delineated in this amendment, all terms and conditions of the Original Agreement shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

Entirety of Amendment. This Amendment, consisting of two (2) pages, represents the entire and integrated Amendment between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representation, and agreements, whether written or oral.

THE PLANNING COMMISSION TOOK THE FOLLOWING ACTION IN THE PUBLIC HEARINGS

At 7:04 pm, Chair McMahan opened the legislative hearing on File No. LDC-3-10, Street Standards, Chapter 17.170 of the Brookings Municipal Code (BMC), City initiated. The criteria used to decide this matter is found in Chapter 17.140 Amendments, of the BMC.

Director Morris presented the staff report which essentially called for a minor narrowing of the City's current street standards. Factors taken into account when revising the standards include, the increasing difficulty in obtaining aggregate materials for paving, and the growing problem of excessive storm water run off coupled with a declining water table. The best way to address these problems is to reduce the amount of paved surfaces created within the City. There was much discussion about the proposed changes and with Commissioner Markham making amotion and Commissioner McClain seconding, the Planning Commission voted 5-1 to recommend approval of File No. LDC-3-10, Street Standards to City Council, with Commissioner Wulkowicz voting in opposition.

By a 6-0 vote (motion: Chair McMahan, 2nd: Commissioner Markham) the PC approved the minutes of the June 1, 2010 PC meeting.

COMMENTS by the PLANNING STAFF

Director Morris announced that the Commission needs to schedule a Community Workshop regarding plans for Bicycle and Pedestrian facilities within the City. October 4th at 6:00 pm was chosen. Sr. Planner Colby-Hanks reported on the status of the two grants the planning department has applied for, the TIGER II grant and the Transportation Enhancement grant. Both of these applications were for improving and expanding Brookings bicycle and pedestrian facilities. Sr. Planner Colby-Hanks handed out the newly updated City Code.

Background/Discussion: Chapter 17.144 has provisions for property seeking annexation to the City of Brookings. 17.144.020(J)(5) deals with utilities. During discussions about a possible annexation of property it was discovered that the Sewer Master Plan had not considered potential development in that area within the Urban Growth Area. Presently the Code requires City Staff to "provide written information regarding existing infrastructure and any improvements that would be necessary to serve the territory proposed to be annexed." This language doesn't make it clear that the City must take into account the property proposed for annexation and the servicing of properties in the UGA beyond the subject property that would use this line in the future. It would be short sited to only consider the subject property. Without information concerning the future area to be served, a smaller main would be installed and then need to be dug up and replaced in the future.

On October 5th the Planning Commission reviewed the proposed revisions as described in this report and voted to recommend approval of Chapter 17.144.020(J)(5), BMC, as follows:

"17.144.020 (J). Written findings of fact prepared by the petitioner(s) or petitioner(s) representatives which address the following:

5. Urban services needed and necessary to service the territory proposed to be annexed, including the availability of the same relative to capacity, condition and cost of extension and/or improvement to urban standards and an estimated timeline for any required improvements. City staff will provide written information regarding existing infrastructure and any improvements that would be necessary to serve the territory proposed to be annexed, as well as any other properties within the urban growth area that would also be served by these improvements in the future."
