RE: Signage

Subject: Prohibited signs which contain flashing, blinking or moving letters, characters or other elements.

Background / Discussion: The Brookings Municipal Code states in Section 17.88.050, Signs expressly prohibited, (C) "Signs which contain any flashing, blinking or moving letters, characters or other elements, nor rotating or otherwise movable signs, except for signs that provide public service messages, such as temperature, time of day, and/or upcoming public events".

The Site Plan Committee recently received requests from a church and the theater to install electronic signs with moving or flashing letters. There is also an existing electronic sign within the City that flashes messages. Site Plan Committee discussion resulted in requesting City Council to set a policy for what would be an appropriate time for changes in signs to occur and not be considered flashing, blinking or moving would be 24 hours.

With a set policy, staff could move forward with the approval and enforcement of these electronic signs.

Recommended Motion: For purposes of administering BMC 17.88.050, signs with message, symbols or characters that changes occurring not more than once every 24 hours would not be considered "flashing, blinking or moving".

Subject: Rowland Lane Sewage Overflow

Recommendation:

In lieu of the alarm system staff would recommend to take the same amount of money and for a contract install an 8" overflow line from Rowland Lane to Collis Lane, approximately 140 feet. Staff would recommend putting in the bypass line rather than the alarm.

Background /Discussion:

At a previous meeting council approved to install a level sensor, telemetry, electrical and phone line so that police dispatch is called before overflow occurs so that personnel can have Roto-Rooter on site to pump and haul sewage to prevent future overflows. After construction this past summer on Collis Lane the opportunity to tie in a short overflow line which would reroute excessive flows from the Rowland Lane manhole down Collis Lane to a point below where the existing sliplined pipe ends is now possible. Installation of either an alarm system or bypass line would be viewed as a pre-emptive mitigation measure, and serve likely to lessen any financial penalty by DEQ that might be imposed if an overflow occurs.

Financial Impact(s):

\$15,000 for installation of an alarm system or bypass line to be budgeted for in the upcoming 2007-08 budget.

Council President Anderson said that he did review the workshop recording and generally stated that unless current rates were high or service questionable, neither of which he felt was the case, he would not be interested in seeing the city get involved in the electric utility business. Anderson also generally stated that, based on the city's current financial situation, he would not support hiring an attorney to explore this issue.

Mayor Sherman generally stated that the formation of a municipal electric utility could well result in a decrease in user rates to the citizens of Brookings in addition to providing additional, long-term revenue for the city. The Mayor also generally stated that she would prefer to hear from an expert as to the feasibility of pursuing this project so that any future decision by Council to proceed or not to proceed could be made from an informed position.

Councilor Hedenskog moved, a second followed and council voted, with a nay vote from Council President Anderson, to authorize the City Manager to execute a retention agreement with Beery, Elsner and Hammond, LLP, for legal services in connection with the City's exploration of the possible formation of a municipal electric utility, with a cost not to exceed \$3,600.

CALL TO ORDER

Chair Tony Parrish called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Commissioners present: Patricia Brown, Haley Farr, Elizabeth Grodin, Don Vilelle, & Chair Tony Parrish Commissioners absent: Michelle Benoit, Frances Hartmann

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. A motion was made by Commissioner Brown to approve the minutes of May 24, 2007, motion was seconded and the Commission voted and the motion carried unanimously.

PUBLIC APPEARANCES None

REGULAR AGENDA

- A. Tennis backboard at Bud Cross Park. Reference letter of May 24, 2007 from Rich Hayashi advocating addition of a backboard to the Bud Cross Park tennis facility (letter attached). Discussion ensued. The question of cost in materials and labor was raised as preliminary to seeking funding for this item which has not been budgeted for in the 2007-08 City of Brookings budget. Commissioner Parrish volunteered to obtain materials pricing locally and put together a cost estimate. He will attempt to get Mr. Hayashi involved in design and project proposal. A motion was made by Commissioner Brown that project cost estimates be obtained with the intent of asking for budget approval once a proposal can be written; motion was seconded and the Commission voted and the motion carried unanimously.
- B. Azalea Park Master Plan. In discussions with staff, Chair Parrish and Mayor Sherman it was suggested that a combined work session including the Parks and Recreation Commission, the City Council, and Public Works Director John Cowen be scheduled at the July 26, 2007 Parks & Recreation Commission meeting. Commission will convene, approve minutes, then adjourn the meeting and start the joint work session with the city council to review and discuss the Azalea Park Use Plan.
- C. Easy Manor Park. Commissioner Brown presented preliminary plans for the Fall Ice Cream Social designed to get public interest and input into equipment upgrades for Easy Manor Park. A tentative date of Saturday, September 15, 2007 has been set. A sales representative of Rainbow Playground Equipment in Roseburg has been contacted and has agreed to prepare a color playground design once he has park dimensions and a tentative budget in hand. If the City decides to proceed with this plan, the equipment vender will dispatch a representative to meet with parents and children, as well as City staff and Commissioners on the day of the park event. Pending is a grant possibility through the state to match local funds for this project. Mayor Sherman is in contact with the Oregon State Parks Local Government Grant Program regarding application procedures and timelines. Discussion of this project ensued and the planning subcommittee will proceed with gathering the information necessary to go forth and present progress at future Commission meetings (see Commissioner Brown's report attached).

INFORMATION UPDATES/DISCUSSION ITEMS

- A. Commissioner Farr announced this year's Renaissance Fair is July 28, 2007, in Azalea Park.
- B. Chair Parrish will be presenting the Stout Park railroad project proposal at the July 9th City Council meeting.

Commissioner Farr expressed concerns with what she considers to be rude behavior of the staff toward parents at the Municipal Swimming Pool. It was suggested that she, as a concerned parent, speak to the pool supervisor about her perceptions.

Commissioner Brown applauded Commissioner Vilelle's continuing commitment to picking up trash along Chetco and Railroad, plus the connecting streets, from 5th south to Triangle Park.

The ASPIRE program at Brookings Harbor High School has had great success with our program of assisting high school students as they make plans for education beyond high school. Historically, the ASPIRE program at BHHS has been run by the Americorps program and funded locally by the school district and local businesses. The grant period has run out and BHHS will need to fund its own program if it is to continue. Faced with this situation, ASPIRE students and volunteers conducted a community fundraising campaign during the summer months and raised more than \$6,000 for the continuation of the ASPIRE program this coming school year. In addition, ASPIRE volunteers recently applied for a small grant from the Gordon Elwood Foundation in Medford; we are anticipating a positive response. Though ASPIRE cannot fund a coordinator position at this time, we hope to attract enough grant money for a full-time coordinator next year. This school year, the ASPIRE office will continue to offer programs to students, including much needed bus trips to colleges and college fairs by utilizing our volunteer staff to run the program, as we apply for additional grants and solicit new funding sources beyond our community.

ASPIRE wants thank our new local business partners, as we welcome back students and their mentors to the program, attract new support and continue to increase our program's assets for this year by offering a community barbeque at Azalea Park. Our plan is to ask participating ASPIRE students to invite their families and mentors and our new business partners (who contributed so generously during the fundraising) to a Back to School ASPIRE Barbeque at Azalea Park. Ray's Market has been approached to contribute

meats, drinks, and other food and non-food items that will make this event a success; we can offer cooks and food preparation. Our plan is to sell food tickets at this event with proceeds going to the ASPIRE program. We have games and fun planned for everyone who attends. We expect to serve 100-200 people.

We are applying to the City Council for a waiver of the fees involved in using Azalea Park and the Snack Shack for this affair on September 6, which will begin at 4 p.m. Thank you for your consideration of this request. Clearly, every penny we can raise is desperately needed for the future success of our program; as a non-profit making entity with such an important product, we hope to gain your approval of our request.
