Background /Discussion:

The City Council established a Community Relations Fund in the 2007-08 Budget in the amount of \$2,000. Nine applications were received totaling \$9,280. A committee consisting of Councilor Willms, the City Manager and the Police Chief reviewed the applications on September 21 and made the recommendations for funding. The funding allocation for fireworks would include the cost of providing portable toilets for the event, with the total City contribution not to exceed \$950.

In addition Councilor Willms has provided guidance to one applicant who was not recommended for funding on other resources that may be available through the Oregon Arts Commission. The committee recommended that the request from the Azalea Park Foundation be considered as a part of the City's ongoing responsibility for the maintenance of Azalea Park and be budgeted for accordingly. The City Manager will meet with the Brookings Harbor Community Helpers to explore federal grant funding opportunities for their construction project.

Financial Impact(s): The above allocations will fully deplete the Community Relations Fund.

Please describe your project/event: Community Food Share intends on building a warehouse to house its' operation and store the necessary products to fill our clients food boxes. There are off-site improvements necessary to begin this project.

Why are public funds dollars needed to fund this project/event: Although Community Food Share receives donations from individuals, businesses, clubs and churches, those dollars are used to purchase product and cover operating expenses. There is an approximately \$2,000 per month shortfall that is covered by our reserve account. The curb, sides and gutter project would create a great deficit in our reserves. The preliminary estimate for this phase is over \$6,000.00.

How will this project/event benefit the citizens of Brookings: Families with children, seniors and individuals benefit greatly by having Community Food Share available for them. There is no discrimination; anyone who meets the USDA income guidelines is eligible for a food box once a month, plus three miscellaneous food products and bread every day that we are open. The centrally located property afforded Community Food Share is large enough for a permanent site warehouse from which to serve clients, and store backup products. The food stamp program has bee drastically cut and unemployment is high in this area. By providing food boxes to those in need, our clients are able to concentrate on paying housing and utility bills more readily. Children are assured of having three to five days of meals (USDA standard).

Azalea Playground Improvement Plan

We propose to install 2 benches to our playground and add 1 or 2 per year. They will be located on the playground on the south edge of the walkway at the corner of the new building. They will be backless benches approximately 6' long, 18" tall and 13" wide; constructed of Trex Deck" material, welded steel frame and set in concrete. No maintenance will be required.

Costs will include concrete, steel and fabrication, hardware and decking material. The welding will be done by a licensed welder and the benches will be assembled and installed by community volunteers.

Background /Discussion: The above named submitted an application for a Facade Improvement Project grant in accordance with the guidelines established by the Urban Renewal Agency. The application was reviewed by the Urban Renewal Advisory Committee on September 20, 2007 and was recommended for approval. The project involves repainting the building. Not included as a part of the façade project, the property owner will be performing rain gutter repair.

The Committee had earlier established a minimum project size of \$2,500 for the façade improvement program. The Committee modified the minimum at this meeting to \$1,500 finding that the higher amount might be considered exclusionary and that smaller projects should be encouraged as they contribute to the overall goal of the program.

<u>Financial Impact(s)</u>: An \$800.00 expenditure from Urban Renewal Agency funds for this project is consistent with the adopted budget and funds are available.



SUBJECT: Façade Improvement 604 Railroad Avenue

A review of the façade improvement project at the above listed location is scheduled for the Agency meeting of September 24.

At its meeting of September 20, the Urban Renewal Advisory Committee voted to recommend to the Agency that the design modifications that were made subsequent to the approval of façade improvement grant funds for this project be approved with no modification to the grant amount. The program guidelines provide that design changes must be requested by the applicant and approved by the Agency prior to commencement of construction, and that failure to do so could result in a voiding of the entire grant amount.

The Applicant told the Committee that he believed that, as the Agency did not agree to participate in funding the roof portion of the project...and he subsequently decided not to proceed with the roof portion of the project...he had the ability to modify the design to retain the awning. The Applicant also provided documentation that the cost of stucco work was \$10,000 higher than he had included in the original cost estimate, which more that compensated for the deletion of the "trusses and awning removal" work listed as an \$8,000 item in the original proposal.
