You are to be applauded for having the foresight to form the Urban Renewal Advisory Committee. By forming this committee you are taking a positive step for the future of Brookings Urban Renewal District.

I wish to serve on this committee because I have a long history of concern for a viable downtown Brookings and the economic development of successful small businesses that occupy our town. My husband and I have owned our business for over ten years and have always realized that it is just good business to support and encourage other small businesses.

When we opened our storefront at 623 Chetco Avenue, we were alarmed at the number of vacancies, the lack of commerce and the deterioration of the downtown area.

In June of 1998, we formed an organization called Businesses for a Better Brookings (B4BB) to address these concerns. We solicited businesses and raised \$1,150.00 to help fund services from Oregon Downtown Development Association (ODDA).

Starting with our own business, we placed public trash cans, flower boxes, and benches to encourage other businesses to invest in the downtown area. In August, 1999, B4BB established a 24 hour Visitor Center at 541 Chetco Avenue. The funding for these projects came from a fundraiser founded by my husband, Don, called 'Avenue of Flags' which displays almost three miles of American flags on Highway 101 in Brookings and Harbor on the national holidays. Over 300 sponsors pay 35.00 per year for this project.

B4BB has satisfied the IRS conditions of a 501(c)(3) charity and can be used as a tool for further improvements in the Urban Renewal District. This type of organization was recommended by members of ODDA as a way to apply for grants and other aid to encourage a vital downtown Brookings.

I look forward to help shape the future of downtown Brookings by guiding the Urban Renewal District as an additional tool and hope you will consider my application.


City Manager Recruitment

Automated Meter Reading Equipment

BACKGROUND

The current city budget includes \$20,000 to purchase handheld water meter data storage equipment and software. This will eliminate the current practice of hand writing all the meter readings each month. Also, the information in the handheld units automatically download to the utility billing system, eliminating the manual data entry process. We have purchased the software application that is applicable to our utility billing system for \$2,750. This leaves a remaining budget of \$17,250 to purchase the equipment and other necessary software. One piece of the equipment is an attachment for the handheld unit that when applied to a touchread meter, the reading automatically is entered into the handheld unit. This type of meter eliminates the step of manually entering the reading to the handheld unit and decreases human error. Our original plan was to convert the existing meters to the touchread meters over the next few years and to begin installing the touchread meters for new connections.

United Pipe and Supply, the City's vendor for water meters, will supply the remaining equipment and software to the City at no cost if we purchase 600 of the meter conversion kits at a cost of \$65 per, for a total of \$39,000. This would allow the City to convert approximately 20% of the current meters. This would require an additional \$21,750 which would come from contingencies. Budgeted contingencies in the Water Fund are \$363,478. The adjustment would be made during the supplemental budget process.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of a transfer of \$21,750 from Water Fund contingencies to Water Fund distribution capital outlay.

Sections: Section 1. Ordinance identified Section 2. Ordinance amended
The City of Brookings ordains as follows:
Section 1. Ordinance Identified. This ordinance amends Ordinance No. 315, enacted June 19, 1979, titled An Ordinance Regulating the Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages on Public Premises.
Section 2. Amendment to Ordinance No. 315.
Ordinance No. 315 is amended to read:
Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to drink, consume, transport, carry, or possess any alcoholic liquor, except in the original package with the seal unbroken, on any public premises.
Section 2. The term alcoholic liquor, as used in this ordinance, shall be construed to mean and include any liquid intended for human consumption containing more than one half of one per cent by volume of alcohol.
Section 3. For the purpose of this ordinance, public premises shall include city parks, city buildings, city parking lots, and other premises under the control of the city, but shall not include public highways.
Section 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.
