

Subject: Elmo Williams' request

#### REPORT

Approximately five months ago Elmo Williams proposed to the City Parks & Recreation Commission to build a chapel in Azalea Park as a tribute to his deceased wife Lorraine. Parks & Rec. Commission expressed an interest in the project and instructed Mr. Williams to gather more information and preliminary design for their consideration. Mr. Williams then traveled to Arkansas to meet with the architect and made arrangements for them to visit the proposed site. Mr. Williams ask the City Manager for permission, which was granted, to remove the brush and berry vines from the site so the architect could do a thorough site inspection and get elevations.

Mr. Williams then requested permission of the Parks & Rec. Commission to proceed with construction of the project. On December 16, 2004, the Commission held a meeting to listen to Mr. William's request and receive public input. After much discussion and public input the Commission decided to refer the issue to City Council without any recommendation. Mr. Williams will be at the January 10, 2005 council meeting to present his request.

Below are some of the concerns:

#### Church/State issues:

The term "chapel" has raised many concerns. The building will actually be used as a quiet place for meditation and to hold small concerts, weddings and other events. The facility could be called anything such as pavilion and some people may feel better. I have checked with our City Attorney and he informed me that there is no Church/State issue, but he also suggested a term for the building that was less related to religious use.

#### Maintenance & Vandalism:

Mr. Williams has indicated that the facility would be maintained by volunteers. Much of the maintenance of Azalea Park is accomplished with volunteer labor and money. We hope that is the case with the proposed facility. However, it may not be wise to count totally on volunteerism for long term maintenance and repair of the facility. Much of the facility will be constructed with glass making the potential vandalism repairs more expensive. Assuming the City spent an average of 2 days per month on maintenance and



repair the labor cost would be approximately \$4,000 per year. Material for repairs is difficult to estimate, but to be safe we may figure up to \$1,000 per year. With these assumptions the annual cost would be approximately \$5,000.

#### Land Use:

The Public Open Space zone allows for many recreational and public uses. The proposed facility is not specifically listed as an allowed use; however it would impossible to list every potential use that might be in a park. For example, a food concession or a gazebo is not listed as a permitted use, but is considered part of a public park. The same could be considered for the proposed facility.

## Long Term Commitment:

Mr. Williams has not requested a long term commitment from the City to maintain and preserve the facility. Even if there is not a written commitment, in the future there may still be a community obligation. An example is the Bankus fountain. In that case there is no written commitment to preserve the fountain, however, when the issue came up to remove it for highway improvements the Commission felt the "memorial" should remain and if the highway needed more room it should be relocated in the same area with a similar design. If the project is approved I suggest there be a written agreement that allows the City to remove, modify or relocate the facility if deemed necessary in the future.

## Does it belong in Azalea Park?

This is probably the most difficult question to answer. It is probably also the most important question and the basis for a final decision. The answer is based on opinion, not any specific criteria or fact. There seems to be many different opinions on this subject.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Because the basis of a final decision is mostly based on the question of whether the facility belongs in the park staff is not prepared to make a recommendation. If it is approved staff will review plans to make sure it meets building codes and conditions of approval.

Earlier this year the Fire Department submitted a request for grant to the Federal Government for the "Fire Act" grant program. The grant would fund 90% of the cost to purchase 41 sets of new Fire Jackets/pants and a Thermal Imaging Camera. On November 12, 2004 we received notification of award of the grant. The total amount of the grant is \$61,200 with the Federal share of 90% being \$55,080 and the City's share of 10% being \$6,120. The Total amount requested for the 41 sets of Turn-outs is \$49,200 and \$12,000 for the one Thermal Imaging Camera. Fire Department budgeted funding for the City's 10% portion of the grant.

# IV. Ceremonies/Appointments/Announcements

#### A. Ceremonies

 Presentation of U.S. Flag flown in Afghanistan-Lt. Col. Jerry Law, Commander of Jalalabad Provincial Reconstruction Team
 On behalf of the City, Mayor Hagbom accepted a U.S. Flag from Lt. Col Jerry Law. The flag was flown over Osama Bin Laden's house in Jalalabad Afghanistan on February 7, 2004. Law said he is a citizen of Curry County and was just glad to be home after his tour of duty in Afghanistan.

# V. Scheduled Public Appearances

Mark Leedom, ODOT-Highway 101 Improvements

Mark Leedom, ODOT Project Leader, addressed the Council, giving a general overview of the U. S. Hwy 101 Lone Ranch Beach to Chetco River Bridge Project. This is a continuation of last summer's project which went from Thomas Creek Bridge to Lone Ranch Beach. The project will include grinding out and replacing road surfaces, replacing guard rails and any broken or obsolete signs. There are improvements planned for the downtown area such as replacing sidewalks from Fifth Street to the bridge and adding sidewalks on the east side of the highway from Oak Street to the bridge. Overhead utility lines will be buried in the downtown section and new pedestrian lighting will be installed. Leedom thanked City Manager Blodgett and Economic and Urban Development Director Wait for their help in refining the plans.

Leedom also said ODOT is trying to minimize disruptions to traffic, residents and businesses during the construction phase of the project. To accomplish this ODOT has pushed the contract let date back to June with the construction starting after Labor Day, 2005. Paving will wait until late spring or early summer 2006. To lesson impacts there will be no work on weekends, holidays or during special community-wide events. To accomplish the paving, traffic will be restricted to one travel lane in each direction with night work between 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. being considered. Leedom said it has not been determined whether the north end or south end of the project will be the first phase.

Blodgett said all ODOT staff has been very cooperative with City staff and he appreciates all ODOT is doing.

# VI. Oral Requests and Communications from the Audience

- A. Committee and Liaison reports
  - Chamber of Commerce
     Chamber President Les Cohen reported the Business Outlook 2005 conference is shaping up to be an excellent event with several topnotch speakers on board.

Cohen attended the Oregon Business Plan Leadership Summit in Portland where Senator Ron Wyden spoke on the state's economy.

He said the latest issue of Business Watch (South Coast edition) listed Brookings with the greatest number of Chamber of Commerce walk-in inquiries in October, far surpassing other south coast cities. The numbers show the efforts of promoting the Brookings Harbor area are effective.

Cohen concluded by saying it has always been a pleasure working with Mayor Hagbom.

#### 2. Council Liaisons

Councilor Anderson said he attended an Emergency Preparedness meeting, the Community Agency meeting December 1 and two watershed council meetings.

Councilor Mickelson attended the shortest Planning Commission meeting of the year. Only one item was on the agenda. He and City Manager Blodgett also attended a CCD Business Development Corporation meeting where he was appointed to the budget committee for the coming year.

Councilor Johns Kern attended the Pelican Bay Prison Oversight Committee meeting last week.

Councilor Dentino represented the City at the Local Public Safety Coordinating Council in Gold Beach and the Safety in the Schools Committee meeting the next morning. He attended the City's Christmas tree lighting on December 5.

#### B. Unscheduled

City Manager Blodgett gave an overview of the City's exploration of alternatives to spreading biosolids. Our permit through DEQ prohibits spreading from October through May. During this time the City is looking at various sites around the county and exploring composting of biosolid such as is being done by Josephine County. The City has made application for renewal of the DEQ permit as the one biosolid disposal option the City has cannot be lost.

Larry Aslinger, 439 Buena Vista Loop, asked if the City locates sites other than the Smith Ranch for biosolids disposal would DEQ be able to authorize another entity to use those fields. It was noted that DEQ has authorized biosolid application on sites near the Winchuck River by an entity located in a neighboring state.

Susan Lynch, 99544 North Bank Chetco Road, spoke about growth and problem arising from it. She noted an alarming growth rate in Cancers that have left local doctors puzzled. She also noted that people along the Chetco River are showing signs of neurotoxicity. She has concerns that the City has no plan to deal with these problems that she attributes to biosolid disposal.

Judi Krebs, 15951 Bay View Drive, stated she knows Mayor Hagbom has served the City well and wished him well on his retirement from the

Council. Stating it had just been a year since the Council authorized signing a letter of intent with Asante, she asked about the hospital feasibility study currently underway. City Manager Blodgett said there has been significant progress and a meeting has been scheduled in late January to finalize the feasibility study and announce the study results. Following publication of the study there will be a public meeting.

Bill Nokes, PO Box 6998, Brookings, relayed an incident in Alaska during the late 1980s where, after a change in laws, the state of Alaska and the City of Fairbanks were required to dig up and remove contaminated soil even though the original mediation plan had been approved and signed off by EPA. Nokes said if there are contaminates in materials spread on the Smith fields the City would be liable as would the land owner and the disseminator. He strongly suggested testing if the City is going to continue using the Smith fields.

# VII. Staff Reports

- A. City Manager
  - 1. Public Works Director Job Description
  - 2. Community Development Director Job Description City Manager Blodgett said he was combining the two job description agenda items into one report. He said with Community Development Director Lightle retiring on January 3 it was a good time to look at the organizational structure of the department. The proposed reorganization creates a stand alone department of Public Works. The Community Development Department would be responsible for building, planning, code enforcement, GIS mapping, urban renewal and public works inspections. The new Public Works Department would be responsible for engineering, water treatment, sewer treatment, parks, maintenance of water, sewer, streets systems and other public facilities. The first step in implementing the plan is to approve the job descriptions for the Community Development Director and a Public Works Director which would be a new position in the City. It would be required that the Public Works Director be an engineer allowing in-house review of some projects that are currently being outsourced for review.

Two other positions in the Community Development Department would be created by the reorganization: Public Works Inspector and GIS Coordinator/Surveyor. Funding for these positions will be looked at during the budgeting process for FY 2005-2006.

If the reorganization is approved, current Economic and Urban Development Director Ed Wait would move into the Community Development Director position and advertising would begin to hire the Public Works Director.

Councilor Mickelson moved, a second followed, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the job descriptions for a new position of Public Works Director and the position of Community Development Director.

## 3. Writ of Mandamus

City Attorney John Trew reviewed the process of resolving a Writ of Mandamus. Council had given staff authorization to resolve the issue with the Bruce Bros. LLC, committing the City to honor the Writ approving the Ransom Creek project with additional Conditions of Approval. The Court has the final Writ in hand, however it has not been signed at this time. Once the Writ is signed the project will move forward in its own time.

Councilor Mickelson moved, a second followed, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the application of the Bruce Bros. LLC, File No. PUD-2-04, with the conditions of approval as ordered by the Curry County Circuit Court in the Preemptory Writ of Mandamus, Case No. 04CV0769.

# 4. Golf Course lease amendment

City Manager Blodgett handed out a draft lease amendment for Salmon Run Golf Course. This year there was significant damage to one of the greens due to landslides from adjourning property. Repairs have been made by Salmon Run employees and contractors. Not only have there been damages and expenses to repair the green, it has been unusable for many months and may still not be playable until spring. Salmon Run has not asked for direct reimbursement of expenses but have asked for an amendment to the lease. Blodgett said under the current lease payments were to start in 2010. The draft would extend that beginning date to 2012. The payment amounts would start at \$30,000 instead of the current lease figure of \$20,000. Payment amounts for the first seven years would be as follows:

Year 1 (2012) \$30,000

Year 2 (2013) \$35,000

Year 3 (2014) \$40,000

Year 4 (2015) \$45,000

Year 5 (2016) \$50,000

Year 6 (2017) \$52,500

Year 7 (2018) \$55,125

Payments after the seventh year would increase each year by the consumer price index up to 5% as is written in the current lease.

Councilor Mickelson stated for the record that he works part time at Salmon Run and that any action on the lease would have no financial impact to him.

Councilor Johns Kern moved, a second followed, and the Council unanimously voted to approve the amended lease agreement with The Claveran Group, LLC.

Councilor Anderson said it may seem like splitting hairs but during *Unscheduled Public Appearances* the comment was made that the City is depositing sewage and septage. He believes the technical term is sludge and there is a considerable amount of difference. City Manager Blodgett said the term is biosolids.

Larry Aslinger returned to the podium and said in a publication provided by DEQ the material was called biosolid septic D.

B. Mayor

Mayor Hagbom revealed this had not been an easy evening for him. He read a prepared statement which is attached and made a part of these minutes, listing City achievements during his time on the City Council. He said the City has a strong Council, a great staff and a community full of volunteers.

The meeting was recessed from 8:00 to 8:12 p.m.

## X. Executive Session

At 8:13 p.m., Mayor Hagbom stated the Council would go into Executive Session. The regular meeting reconvened at 8:40 p.m.

Councilor Anderson had questions about the salary structure for employees and said he has requested information on statewide salary trends. He wasn't sure that a 5% increase in salary would result in a salary that was comparable to those for City Managers in other Oregon cities. Stating it was not uncommon to loose people because of low salaries he requested the City provide data to the Council showing how Brookings wages compare to the rest of the state.

City Manager Blodgett said he did an informal survey of 42 to 44 cities via email. He received replies from cities with populations from 200 to 30,000. League of Oregon Cities, through Local Government Personnel Institute, does a compensation survey each year that will next be available in mid-January. Blodgett said from what he's seen a 5% increase is comparable with other cities in Oregon.

Councilor Anderson moved, a second followed, and the Council voted unanimously to approve a 5% salary increase for the City Manager and to do a salary review at a later date.

#### **Call to Order**

Chair Boynton called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the pledge of allegiance led by Tony Parrish.

#### **Minutes**

Commissioner Dave Gordon moved the approval of the minutes from the September 23, 2004, meeting. The Commission voted unanimously to approve the minutes as written.

#### **PUBLIC APPEARANCES**

#### Bankus Park:

Greg Holthoff, Environmental Project Manager for ODOT, distributed a handout of his report on the analysis of Bankus Fountain and its impact on the Downtown Brookings Highway 101 Traffic Solutions Project. He explained while doing an environment assessment study the location of the Bankus Fountain became an issue and has slowed down the process. According to the NEPA (National Environment Policy Act) an Environment Assessment study must be completed according to federal regulations. He stated the purpose of the study is to define traffic problems, assess the impact of solutions, followed by public disclosure and decision-making. NEPA has a multitude of federal environment regulations which all ODOT projects must follow. Part of those regulations is Section 4(f) which states federal transportation projects must "protect publicly owned parks, recreation areas, etc." He outlined the purpose of the Section 4(f) regulation, and how it applies to Bankus Fountain.

Elmer Bankus Fountain is part of the City of the Brookings park system and the City must decide several issues concerning the fountain with a solution that will have minimal impact on the park. The problem is the Fountain will be impacted because it is located on the northeast corner of Highway 101 and Fifth Street, one of the busiest intersections in the city, and one that is part of the Highway 101 project.

Holthoff outlined two of the alternatives for the project.

- Alternative #6 bypassing Railroad would have no impact.
- Both Alternatives 4 and 5 could be modified to avoid the park.

- Alternative 4 could be used to avoid the park but the high cost (\$17 to \$19 million) may not be feasible.
- Alternative 5 could be re-designed to avoid the park. The modifications would greatly affect businesses at 4-corner intersection: Fred Meyer, Taco Bell, KFC, and Washington Mutual Bank. This plan would reduce their frontage parking. Modifications would cost approximately \$1 million.

Holthoff concluded that Alternative 4 has the least harm to Elmer Bankus Fountain, both alternatives could be re-designed to bypass the park, and Alternative 5 may cost the least, but would have expensive impact to the businesses. He stated one option would be to rebuild the fountain in its present location, but farther north of Chetco Avenue. The second option would be to relocate the fountain east of Fifth Street.

He emphasized until Section 4(f) is satisfied, plans cannot be finalized until a decision has been reached whether to rebuild, relocate, or do nothing. Gary posed 4 questions for the Commission:

- 1. What is the true use and value of the park to the citizenry?
- 2. How do the citizens feel about moving the park?
- 3. What is the process of moving the park?
- 4. Is the city in agreement with the possibility of moving the park?

City Manager Blodgett commented he was in favor of keeping the park. He related a little history stating the Bankus family deeded the property to the city to be used for streets or parks. He stated there was nothing in the deed that specified a fountain must be in the park.

Chair Boynton read a memo from Dave Lentz, Parks and Recreation Supervisor. He stated the fountain has several leaks and is in dire need of serious repair. Lentz suggested removing the fountain and rebuilding it farther north of the park utilizing the old rock.

Holthoff discussed the steps required before he can finalize his report. He said if a decision can be made, with a letter addressing the decision, he would be able to release the assessment report within the required 40 day time limit mandated in the regulations. He also emphasized he was not asking for a decision immediately, but to have the Commission move forward in a timely manner to resolve the problem.

Discussion ensued. Ideas were discussed ranging from whether to remove the fountain, move the fountain back from the roadway, or relocate it across the street along the north side of Chetco Avenue as this property is part of the Bankus property deeded to the city. Chair Boynton stated he thought revamping the fountain was a good idea and while redesigning it, do it in a fashion that would satisfy the required perimeters. City Manager Blodgett stated his real concern was the fact the land belongs to the city and is defined a park. If we are going to change the existing configuration of the park, research needs to be done to find out if there are any Bankus heirs who might want to have some input and any citizens who might have a vested interest in it.

Blodgett concluded the city could declare Bankus Park no longer a park, which would satisfy the land needed for both Alternative #4 and #5. If it is removed from the park system, that would take care of Section 4(f) which would take care of the issue of "avoidance" with the transportation project.

Commissioner Gordon moved the Commission consider removing or relocating all or a portion of Bankus Fountain from the park, to allow modification to the Fifth Street and Chetco Avenue intersection, and to have staff research and bring information to the Commission regarding the Bankus deed, and to schedule a public hearing to receive public input. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Dori Blodgett made a motion to have the public meeting on December 2, 2004, at 7:00 p.m., followed by a regular meeting on December 16, 2004. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

<u>Stout Park</u>: Commissioner Parrish circulated photographs to explain his concern about spraying at the park. He added there is a continual litter problem from Chetco and Oak streets to the schools.

City Manager Blodgett circulated several trash container examples for the commission to discuss and review what type would best fit at Stout Park. It was decided the *Upscale* 38-gallon Waste Container was the best choice. It was decided to order 6 containers. Blodgett explained the Stout fund is required to have \$15,000 in its account; there is currently approximately \$19,000. The money for the containers will come from the Stout Trust Fund.

#### Chetco Point Park:

Chair Boynton read a report from Commissioner Pat Sherman regarding possible student art, science, and leadership groups from the schools participating in the Waste Water Treatment Plant project to decorate the bare walls. She is working with Ed Wait, Economic and Urban Development Director, who is putting together a packet of information on the park.

#### **Bud Cross Park and Softball Fields:**

Commissioner Gordon had no report.

<u>Kidtown</u>: Commissioner Dori Blodgett reported the park continues to look wonderful. When she recently drove by the park, she noticed the swings were being worked on by Park and Recreation personnel.

<u>Easy Manor Park</u>: Commissioner Gothard reported she is attempting to think about some ideas for raising money for the park upgrades. One thought is to have an open house as an opportunity to get public opinion for what they would like to see happen at the park.

#### Azalea Park Fountain:

The annual meeting will be held November 11. The Foundation would like the Commission to formulate a master plan for the park.

#### STAFF ANOUNCEMENTS/CONCERNS/FOLLOW-UP

Financial Report: No Discussion.

#### City Managers Report

City Manager Blodgett mentioned the new ban on commercial burning. The City is required to abide the ban which presents the problem of what the City should do with their brush. An alternative is purchasing a chipper.

Chair Boynton mentioned two commissioners terms will expire in February 2005.

With no further business before the Commission, Commissioner Gordon moved the meeting be adjourned at 9:08 p.m.

# MINUTES BROOKINGS PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION City of Brookings 898 Elk Drive, Brookings December 2, 2004

#### Call to Order

Chair Boynton called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the pledge of allegiance led by Paul Cleary.

#### Roll Call

Commissioners Present: Dave Gordon, April Gothard, Bill Boynton, Dori Blodgett, Tony Parrish, and Pat Sherman.

Commissioners Absent: Daryn Farmer.

Ex Officio Commissioner: Paul Cleary.

Staff Present: City Manager Leroy Blodgett, Parks Supervisor Dave Lentz, Councilor Frances Johns Kern, and Cathie Mahon, Secretary.

Media: Brian Bullock for The Pilot.

There were approximately 5 people in the audience.

#### **PUBLIC APPEARANCES**

#### Bankus Park:

Chair Boynton stated the purpose of the meeting was to decide the future of Bankus Park. At the October 28, 2004 meeting, a representative from ODOT, explained to the commission that when a study was done to define traffic problems at the intersection of Highway 101 and Fifth, Bankus Park became an issue. One of the regulations states when a Federal Transportation project is being prepared, an Environment Assessment is conducted and during the process the issue of Section 4(f) was raised. It states federal transportation projects must protect publicly owned parks, recreation areas, etc., and this applies to Bankus Park. Several traffic designs were presented at the meeting, outlining the impact on Bankus Park. He pointed out, before the Commission can make a decision regarding the park, public input was very important and necessary.

City Manager Blodgett stated the issue for the commission to decide is how important is the park and whether to allow any encroachment, and if so, how much. Bankus Park is in the parks system and a problem for ODOT because of Section 4(f), there cannot be any encroachment into the park unless the City allows it. ODOT cannot continue with their Environment Assessment report until a decision is rendered.

Handouts for Alternative 4 and 5 were distributed to the Commission, which outline the ODOT proposals at the Highway 101 and Fifth Street intersection. He used slides to illustrate the two configurations, and pointed out how each design would affect Bankus Park. Blodgett summarized the two designs. The original design for Alternative 4, a couplet, is a narrower design and takes out a piece of the park. Alternative 5, a non-couplet, is an 8-lane highway, and affects Taco Bell, A&W, the drive-thru for Washington Bank, and some of Fred Meyers parking.

Blodgett reported he could not find a lot of history on the donation of the land to the City. There is a restriction noted in the deed, stating the land can only be used for landscaping or streets. He introduced Mr. Don Horton, who built the fountain under Mr. Bankus' supervision. He stated he and his brother, worked with Elmer Bankus for three years before beginning construction. An architect from Portland made several trips to Brookings to confer with them about the design. Mr. Horton stated Elmer was a great guy and had such an interest in the fountain, he took them on many trips up the Chetco River to his property to pick out the right stones for the fountain. In 1973 the fountain was completed. Mr. Horton concluded he would not be in favor of having it changed from its current spot, plus it would be a huge undertaking.

Chair Boynton stated when ODOT was at the recent meeting, it seemed like there was a good chance they (ODOT) would pay to rebuild the fountain. But nothing can be done until a decision is made on how to satisfy Section 4(f).

City Manager Blodgett stated the city will have to fix the leak regardless of the decision. He addressed the Commission reiterating, the issue is not whether there is a couplet or not, it is will you allow encroachment into the park.

Discussion ensued. Suggestions from audience participants were considered such as moving the fountain and using the original stones. Don Nuss, a member of the Stakeholders Committee, encouraged the Commission to make a decision so that ODOT can finish their environment study and move forward. Sue Ross addressed the Commission expressing how much the fountain means to long-time residents, and her family uses it as a meeting place, especially during the Azalea Fest. Commissioner Parrish stated he wanted to make certain ODOT pays for an architect to draw up streetscape and landscaping plans.

City Manager Blodgett stated if the commission decides this park is a significant asset to this community, then ODOT has to come up with an alternative to avoid the park. The modified alternative 5 shows there are ways for them to do that, but it affects the businesses at the Chetco and Fifth Street intersection. Blodgett concluded if the city decided to declare Bankus Park no longer a park, this would satisfy the land needed for both Alternative 4 and 5.

Commissioner Sherman moved that we allow ODOT to move the fountain 20 feet in the same area. Discussion ensued about relocating the fountain and reclaiming part of Ray's parking lot. Commissioner Sherman then amended the motion:" that there is no significant impact to the Bankus Park as long as the fountain is reconstructed and designed in the same area at the expense of ODOT. The commission approved the motion by a vote of 5-1 (Commissioners Gordon, Gothard, Dori Blodgett, Sherman and Boynton voted in the affirmative; Commissioner Parrish voted no).

Commissioner Gothard questioned who would decide where the foundation would be. Blodgett stated he would include in his letter that the commission will approve the design, location, and construction of the fountain.

Blodgett stated staff would draft a letter to ODOT on the Commissions decision to permit encroachment to the park as long as there would be no significant impact to

the park and the fountain be rebuilt in the same area with the same design as it currently is. When they do their 4(f) report, they have to tell the federal government that they are impacting Bankus Park but the city has said there will not be a significant impact as long as certain things happen such as rebuilding the foundation.

With no further business before the Commission, the Chair moved to adjoin the meeting at 7:40 p. m.
