

BACKGROUND

The City of Brookings included in its Fiscal Year 2004 Budget funding for review of the streets, water, waste water, parks and storm drain system development charge methodologies. HGE Incorporated Engineers & Planners prepared a system development charge report for the City in 1991. The City and the development within has changed substantially since 1991 prompting the need for a new study. This is a request for staff to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) to various consulting firms for the analysis and development of City system development charge methodologies and rates.

Staff recommends approval of request to issue an RFP for System Development Charge Review.



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that REQUESTS FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) will be accepted at the City of Brookings Finance Department, 898 Elk Dr., Brookings, Oregon 97415, until 4:30 PM, October 31, 2003.

The City of Brookings is seeking proposals for a review of street, water, waste water, parks and storm drain systems development charges methodology.

The City reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals or to postpone the consultant selection process for no more than 60 calendar days. City may further reject any proposal not in compliance with all prescribed public proposal procedures and requirements, and may reject for good cause any or all proposals upon a finding of the City that it is the public interest to do so.

Street, Water, Waste Water, Parks and Storm Drain Systems Development Charge Methodology Review Request for Proposal

Scope of Work

The City of Brookings is desirous of retaining a consulting firm to perform a review of its street, water, waste water, parks and storm drain systems development charges methodology and make recommendations related to the SDC rates. The selected consultant will be expected to provide full services associated with development of SDC methodologies and the development of rational, defensible system development charges for streets, water, waste water, parks and storm drains. This project will be issued under a purchase order establishing the work required and is to be based on the costs submitted by the consulting firm in this proposal.

Specifically, the City is looking for a consultant to do the following tasks:

- Review existing City SDC Ordinance and methodologies and charges for each utility.
- Review updated water master plan, parks master plan, public facilities plan and capital improvement plan.
- Meet with City of Brookings staff to collect data and review land development assumptions and level of service standards.
- Develop a draft of SDC methodologies and presentation for City of Brookings staff and City Council that identifies an appropriate SDC for each of the five systems and a comparison of those charges with other comparable cities in the region. All methodologies and charges are expected to be in accordance with SDC related Oregon Statutes.
- After input from City Council and City Staff, develop a final report that identifies methodologies and an appropriate SDC for each of the five systems.
- Attend public hearings and provide expert testimony for consideration by the City in adoptions of any changes to the methodologies or charges suggested for each of the five systems.

In the event it becomes necessary to revise any part of this RFP, addenda will be provided to all contractors who received the basic RFP.

Response Date

To be considered, contractors must submit a complete response to this RFP, using the Scope/Format in this RFP, and the response must arrive at the Issuing Office on or before the due date, October 31, 2003, 4:30 PM.

■ Modification/Withdrawal

Further, the City of Brookings will consider the selected contractor to be the sole point of contact with regard to contractual matters, including payment of any and all charges resulting from the contract.

An appeal of the Planning Commission's denial for a variance, File No. VAR-1A-03, to encroach 5 feet into the required 10 foot side yard setback; located at 251 Marine Drive; Assessor's Map 40-13-32 CD, Tax Lot 1702; SR-20 (Suburban Residential) zone; Peter Castellini, appellant; File No. APP-3-03. The criteria used to decide this case is found in Section 136 of the Land Development Code.

The first hearing began at 7:05 p.m. Councilor Mickelson declared a site visit. No Councilor declared personal bias or conflict of interest. No one objected to the jurisdiction of the Council to hear this matter.

After Planner Bischoff gave his staff report the following testified in the hearing:

Castellini presented the Council a petition from property owners within 250 feet of his property supporting his proposed 5-foot setback.

There were no others testifying. The applicant waived his right to seven (7) additional days for written argument. The hearing was closed to the public at 7:30 p.m.

Councilor Dentino moved, a second followed, and the Council voted unanimously to uphold the appeal of the Planning Commission's denial of File No. VAR-1A-03, a variance to encroach five (5) feet into the required 10 foot side yard setback; located at 251 Marine Drive; Assessor's Map 40-13-32 CD, Tax Lot 1702; SR-20 (Suburban Residential) zone; Peter Castellini, appellant.

B. An appeal of the Planning Commission's denial of a request for a minor change in the Conditions of Approval, File No.SUB-6-02/MC-1-03, for Chetco Point Terrace Subdivision, to allow a minor change to the configuration of an existing berm; located on Wharf Street and the Wastewater Treatment Plant; Assessor's Map 41-13-07 A, Tax Lot 409; R-2 (Two-family Residential) zone; Noah Bruce, appellant; File No. APP-4-03. The criteria used to decide this case is found in Section 176 of the Land Development Code.

The second hearing of the evening opened at 7:34 p.m. Site visits were declared by Councilors Mickelson, Dentino and Johns Kern, and Mayor Hagbom. Johns Kern declared a conflict of interest and recused herself from the hearing. John Babin, attorney for the appellant, had no objection to Johns Kern remaining on bench but not participating. There was no objection to the jurisdiction of the City Council to hearing this case.

Planner Bischoff gave his staff report with a staff recommendation of not granting the minor change sought by appellant Noah Bruce. Questions from the Council were answered by Bischoff.

Babin entered into the record appellant's exhibit Y—The Cove, Phases I-IV, conceptual plat; appellant's exhibit Z—letter from Daryn Farmer; appellant's exhibit AA—Letter from Cynthia Beaman; appellant's exhibit CC—letter from Dave and Joanna Coito; and appellant's exhibit DD—Stuntzner Engineering Topographic Map of Current Berm, Chetco Point Terrace, August 2003.

Georgeff entered into the record three (3) exhibits: a copy of a fax from Yvonne Dunn regarding the landscaping on the berm (Cove Exhibit M); a copy of a fax from Yvonne Dunn of Real Estate Transfer Disclosure Statements signed by original buyers at The Cove (Cove Exhibit N); and four (4) pictures of the berm, pictures marked on back October 7, 2003 (Cove Exhibit O).

There was no testimony from interested parties or public agencies.

Rebuttal was given by Babin who introduced a topographical map from Stuntzner Engineering showing the current height of the berm. Georgeff rose to a point of order that this was not rebuttal but new testimony. City Attorney Trew accepted the map as evidence.

Bischoff and Community Development Director Leo Lightle made additional staff comments. Babin requested additional time for T. J. Bossard, engineer of the original berm design to appear before the Council. Georgeff said although he had concerns about continuing the hearing he would defer to Trew's opinion.

Mayor Hagbom opened the final hearing of the evening at 10:10 p.m. No Councilor declared bias or conflict of interest and there was no objection of the jurisdiction of the Council to hear the matter.

There were no questions for staff after Bischoff presented his staff report recommending adopting the Ordinance. No one testified on the matter and the hearing was closed to the public at 10:12 p.m.

Councilor Johns Kern, who was present, did not participate as she declared conflict of interest at the previous session of the public hearing.

The appellant's attorney, John Babin introduced Tim Bossard, T. J. Bossard and Associates Civil Engineers, whose firm is located at 133 NW "D" Street, Grants Pass, Oregon. Bossard related his involvement with The Cove project and the berm beginning in 1989. Using drawings he showed the berm as he designed it in 1991 and its present state. He said the berm was designed to block views and mitigate odors from the sewer treatment plant and he believes a configuration equivalent to the original berm can be worked out based on amount of odors produced and the direction they travel. Bossard answered questions from the Council and staff.

Babin introduced into evidence a photocopy of part of a construction drawing labeled *Plan, Profile Berm/Retaining Wall The Cove* dated September 16, 1991. The photocopy was labeled Appellant's Exhibit EE.

Community Development Director Lightle and City Engineer Nored testified for staff. Mayor Hagbom asked if anyone in the audience wanted to speak at which time Babin rose to a point of order saying he understood the purpose of the hearing was to hear comments of the engineer only. He asked if the appellants would have a chance to rebut any participant's comments. City Attorney Trew said that if the hearing were reopened to comments, yes they would need to allow rebuttal from the appellant. Trew advised closing the public hearing.

Councilor Dentino moved, a second followed, and the Council voted 4-0 (Councilor Johns Kern not participating) to close the public portion of the hearing. The public hearing was closed at 8:15 p.m.

City Manager Blodgett recommended one of three options: outright denial, outright approval, or denial of the appeal as proposed with a condition that application be made by the appellant showing exactly what is being proposed including engineering specifications showing no increase in odors from any proposed change. This new proposal would go through staff and the Planning Commission.

Babin said the City Attorney should be consulted as to what effect a denial with a condition to reapply would be as opposed to outright approval. Trew said there were two choices: approve or deny. Discussion ensued about granting an appeal with conditions.

Trew said he was making no comment on whether to deny or grant the appeal, just to procedure.

Councilor Dentino moved, a second followed, and the Council voted 4-0 to deny APP-4-03 as proposed.

Councilor Mickelson moved, a second followed, and the Council voted 4-0 to direct staff to prepare findings and a Final Order for consideration at the Common Council meeting of November 10, 2003.

Babin asked that the record be left open to mark exhibits that had been presented at the hearing. Drawings used by Bossard in his presentation were labeled Appellant's Exhibit FF.

The reconvened meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

Exceptional or extraordinary conditions applying to the property that do not apply generally to other properties in the same zone or vicinity, which conditions are a result of lot size or shape, topography or other circumstances over which the applicant has no control, and to which the applicant has not contributed.
 - B. The variance is necessary for the preservation of the property right of the applicant substantially the same as is possessed by owners of other property in the same zone or vicinity.
 - C. The authorization of the variance shall not be materially detrimental to the purpose of this code, be injurious to property in the same zone or vicinity in which the property is located or by otherwise detrimental to the objectives of any city development plan or policy.
 - D. The variance request is the minimum variance from the provisions and standards of this code, which will alleviate the hardship.
- 2. The Brookings Planning Commission duly considered the above described application on the agenda of its regularly scheduled public hearing on August 5, 2003; and
- 3. Recommendations were presented by the Planning Director in the form of a written Staff Agenda Report dated July 14, 2003 and by oral presentation, and evidence and testimony by the applicant and the public at the public hearing; and,
- 4. At the conclusion of the public hearing, after consideration and discussion of testimony and evidence presented in the public hearing, the Planning Commission, upon a motion duly seconded, accepted the Staff Agenda Report and denied the request for the subject application and directed staff to prepare a Final ORDER and Findings of Fact to that effect.

WHEREAS, the appellant appealed the Planning Commission's denial of the variance, pursuant to Section 156, Appeal to the City Council, and

- 1. The Brookings City Council duly considered the above described application on the agenda of a public hearing on October 13, 2003, and
- 2. Presentations were made by the Planning Director in the form of a written Staff Agenda Reports dated July 14, 2003 and by oral presentation, and evidence and testimony were presented by the appellant, the applicant and the public at the public hearing; and,
- 3. At the conclusion of said public hearing, after consideration and discussion of testimony and evidence presented in the public hearing, the City Council, upon a motion duly seconded, considered the Staff Agenda Report and overturned the Planning Commission decision and granted the variance, and directed staff to prepare a Final ORDER and Findings of Fact to that effect.

THEREFORE, IT IS BE HEREBY ORDERED that the application for a variance on the subject parcel is approved. This approval is supported by the following findings and conclusions:

FINDINGS

- 1. The applicant is requesting a variance of 5 feet from the required 10-foot side yard setback along the northerly boundary of an 8,276.40 sq. ft. subject property.
- 2. The subject property is zoned S-R-20 (Suburban Residential, 20,000 sq. ft. minimum lot size) and is designated as Residential by the Comprehensive Plan.
- 3. When the subject parcel was created, the property was zoned R-1-6 (Single Family Residential, 6,000 sq. ft. minimum lot size).
- 4. The lot is triangular shaped with 111.36 feet of frontage on Marine Dr. and is provided access from a common driveway located along its southerly boundary.
- 5. Approximately 2,500 sq. ft. of the lot consists of steep slopes along the street frontage and the common driveway.
- 6. The S-R-20 Zone requires a 10-foot side yard setback. The original R-1-6 Zone required a 5-foot side yard setback plus 1/2 feet for each foot over 15 feet in building height.
- 7. An electrical transformer box is located 30 feet from the street property line and 24 feet from the common driveway. The electrical provider requires that the buildings be at least 8 feet from this box. The underground power line enters the property at the top of the slope about 16 feet from the street, extends to the transformer box and then leaves the box, exiting the northerly boundary about 13 feet inside the northwest corner.

CONCLUSIONS

- 1. The subject parcel of land was created when the property and the surrounding area was zoned for a minimum lot size of 6,000 sq. ft. and although the surrounding hillsides are steeper, the subject lot has average slopes of less than 15% and the hillside development standards at that time allowed the lot to be smaller than a lot with slopes of greater than 15%. The R-1-6 Zone required a minimum side yard setback of 5 feet.
- 2. When the property was rezoned to SR-20 (Suburban Residential, 20,000 sq. ft. minimum lot size), the side yard setback increased to 10 feet. Since the lot is small to begin with, is triangular shaped and constrained by slopes on two sides and by underground electrical cables that run on two sides of the property and a transformer box at the corner of the property, all on the top of the slopes.
- 3. These constraints reduce the buildable area of the lot and the additional 5 feet of setback required by the new SR-20 Zone limits the lot even further. Due to the configuration of the lots adjacent to the side of the subject property subject to this request, the nearest house will be at least 30 feet from the applicant residence with the granted variance.
- 4. The applicant has meet the requirements of the criteria listed above.
