Skate Park Committee Membership

BACKGROUND:

The Skate Park Committee was established to oversee the development of a skate park in Brookings. With the construction nearly done, the Committee has been working on issues related to the park and an ordinance regulating use of skate boards within the City.

The Committee currently has five members. Although there was not a quorum, those members present at the last meeting agreed that two additional member should be added to the Committee.

The first recommended new member is Keith Delaney. Keith is fifteen years old. He has been present and participated in nearly every Committee meeting. Those members present at the last meeting felt it would be beneficial to have a student on the Committee to provide another perspective.

The second recommendation is to appoint Jeff Anderson to the Committee. Jeff is a substitute school teacher at Azalea Middle School. He is also a skate boarder and often uses the new skate park. He has helped in educating the students at the school by conducting on going meetings with students and their parents regarding safety issues, good manners, rules, supervision, and what consequences are to follow when one breaks the "rules". He continues to encourage and educate our students regarding skate boarding on his own time.

RECOMMENDATION:

Move to appoint Jeff Anderson and Keith Delaney as Citizens-at-large to the Council's advisory Skate Park Committee.

Re: Chamber of Commerce Request

BACKGROUND

The Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce has made the usual request for permits and waivers of certain requirements for the upcoming Azalea Festival. This is the 63rd year for the annual event. Each year the local citizens and visitors come to enjoy all the activities.

The requests made by the Chamber are ones that have been approved for past Azalea Festival events and have not caused any problems. Two provisions are recommended as a condition of approval.

- 1. Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce should obtain a City Business License in its name to cover all event participants.
- Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce should contact Ray's and other effected business as to when streets will be closed and parking areas used.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approve the requests of the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce with the condition that the Chamber of Commerce obtain a business license from the City and inform effected merchants of street closures and/or use of parking areas.

In anticipation of the 63rd Azalea Festival, scheduled for the Memorial Day Weekend, May 24th through the 27th, 2002, the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce asks the City to permit the following requests:

- 1. The closure of the Frontage Road in the area bordering Highway 101, in front of Chetco Pharmacy, Video and More and Washington Mutual Bank (see attached map), from 5 p.m., Friday, May 24 to 7:00 p.m., Monday, May 27, 2002.
- 2. The closure of Ross Lane the area between Mory's and the entrance to Chetco Pharmacy & Gifts (see attached map), for the same time frame as in request #1.

BOTH OF THESE CLOSURES ARE TO INSURE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY. AN ADEQUATE EMERGENCY VEHICLE LANE WILL BE MAINTAINED.

- 3. Request for a sufficient number of city barricades for both closures.
- 4. The waiving of the City's Sidewalk Sale Ban during the time frame stated in request #1. We believe that by allowing merchants along Chetco Avenue to create an atmosphere of interest and festivity, more foot traffic will be generated and retail and restaurant sales will benefit.
- 5. Waiving requirement for the need for a Brookings Business License for Azalea Festival Street and Crafts Fair participants.
- 6. Waving the fee for the use of the Azalea Park Garden Area on Friday, May 24, 2002, for the Azalea Festival Mixer, and "Stage Under The Stars" for the Park Program component of the festival on Saturday, May 25, 2002 (please see attached "Park Use Application Form").
- 7. Declaring "No Parking" on Chetco Avenue during the hours of 8:00 a.m. through Noon, on Saturday, May 25, 2002, to coincide with the parade.

Page Two – 2002 Azalea Festival Requests

- 8. Use of parking area south of City Hall (between City Hall and the Elks Lodge), for use by non-profit organizations, to set up booths to promote their organizations as an expansion of the Street Fair. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained.
- 9. Use of public right of way by fountain area adjacent to parking lot in front of Ray's #1, Hwy 101.

With the above requested assistance from the City of Brookings we are confident that this year's Azalea Festival, our community's 63rd, with its theme of "Whales, Pails and Gales" will again be a big success.


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

UMPQUA Community Development Corporation (Umpqua CDC) Representative Ernie Luna - "one stop" regional housing collaborative Umpqua CDC representative Ernie Luna presented the regional housing center concept to Council. The Center would provide low and moderate-income households with services such as first-time homeowner programs, housing rehab programs, weatherization, and down payment assistance. He noted this regional concept leverages CDBG funding to obtain additional funding from other sources that allows the participating entities access to funding which may have been difficult to obtain in the past. 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2. Council Liaisons

Councilor Dentino attended the Port of Brookings-Harbor Commissioners meeting, an American Music Festival meeting, the Community Agencies meeting at the Chetco Senior Center, the Governor's Community Solutions Team breakfast meeting, and participated in last week's Immersion Week organized by the RBF Consulting's Urban Design Studio. Also, on behalf of the Mayor, he attended a SWACT meeting in Roseburg, and on behalf of Councilor Kuhn, the Planning Commission. He will attend the Harbor Sanitation District meeting tomorrow.

Mayor Hagbom recalled his and Council President Curry's involvement last year with the Girl Scouts whereby the scouts sent individual hand made cards to our military personnel overseas. Hagbom read a letter received from USAF Col. Stephen L. Wolborsky thanking Curry, Hagbom and the Girl Scouts for the "wonderful cards your city government and Girl Scouts sent to my deployed airmen." (His letter is made a part of these minutes.) Hagbom encouraged the citizens to write our military service personnel. Mayor Hagbom relayed information secured at the recently attended Mayor's meeting, which included the increased costs and lowered income for city governments. Court is held on the third Monday of each month at 9:00 a.m., unless Court demands scheduling for a different time or date. Only City Ordinance violations are cited in to this Court. All active prior cases are monitored by the Clerk, and addressed as time allows regarding financial obligations,

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probation obligations, alcohol treatment obligations, etc. Failure to comply results in sanctions on defendants' drivers licenses and eventually being brought in to Court to address their non-compliance or phone calls from the defendants, because they wish to clear their driving records.

Receipts are received in two forms. One is the result of new charges by our officers cited into the Circuit Court in Gold Beach and the other is from efforts of the Municipal Court's monitoring of existing files and new City Ordinance violations. The calendar year 2001 brought in \$15,101.54, from the State Courts, and \$3,297.00, from the accounts receivable collections - totaling: \$18,398.54. More time given to the monitoring of the prior active Court cases, could result in additional income. Our Municipal Court docket for 2001, included City ordinance violations regarding control of domestic animals and dog bites, noise control, burning, youth curfews, skate board issues, and scattering rubbish.
