Issue:

Falcon Cable Franchise Renewal

Background: 1.

- 1. At the Special Council Meeting of August 7, 2000, you concurred with the recommended minor date changes presented by Steve Jolin of MuniCom and negotiator for the cable franchise renewal between Falcon, the City, and the County, and asked that the matter be continued to our next regular Council Meeting set for August 21, 2000. Those changes were on pages 10 and 61, which would also result in a "cover" change.
- 2. You previously received a complete cable franchise renewal agreement. However, as directed by Mayor Hagbom, we will have available for your review a complete franchise renewal agreement with the corrected pages attached (#10, #61 & Cover). The acceptance of the agreement and changes by Falcon, dba: Charter Communications is forthcoming and will be available by Council meeting time.

Recommendation: suggest you approve Ordinance No. 00-O-539 - in the matter of granting to Falcon Cable TV, dba: Charter Communications, a non-exclusive ten year franchise, assuming acceptance by all officials from Falcon are received by meeting time.

3. GRANT OF FRANCHISE

3.1 Grant

Grantor hereby grants to the Grantee a non-exclusive, revocable Franchise for a10-year period from and after the effective date hereof, revocable as provided herein, to construct, operate and maintain a cable communications system, including an Institutional Network, within the Franchise area. This Franchise authorizes Grantee to engage in providing Cable Service, as that term is defined in 47 U.S.C. Sec. 522(6) as amended, and to provide I-Net Capability for voice, video, and data as described in Section 6.5. This Franchise shall not be interpreted to prevent the Grantor from imposing lawful additional conditions, including additional compensation conditions for use of the Rights-Of-Way should Grantee provide service other than Cable Service. Nothing herein shall be interpreted to prevent Grantee from challenging the lawfulness or enforceability of any provisions of applicable law.

This Franchise is subject to the laws of the United States and the State of Oregon, and to the general ordinances of the Grantor affecting matters of general Grantor concern and not merely existing contractual rights of Grantee, whether now existing or hereinafter enacted. The Grantor shall upon request supply the Grantee with copies of any Grantor laws or regulations affecting Grantee's operations.

3.2 Use of Streets and Public Ways

For the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining a cable communications system in the Franchise area, the Grantee may erect, install, audit, construct, repair, replace, reconstruct, and retain in, on, over, under, upon, across, and along the public streets and ways within the Franchise area such wires, cables, conductors, ducts, conduits, vaults, manholes, amplifiers, appliances, pedestals, attachments, and other property and equipment as are necessary, convenient and appurtenant to the operation of the cable communications system. Prior to construction or alteration, however, the Grantee shall in each case file plans as required with the appropriate agencies of Grantor and in accordance with any agreements with utility providers and companies, pay applicable fees, and receive approval as necessary before proceeding. Nothing in this Section shall relieve the Grantee of the obligations of Section 4.6 regarding the trimming of trees and other vegetation.

3.3 Duration and Effective Date of Franchise

Except as otherwise provided herein for revocation, the term of this Franchise and all rights, privileges, obligations and restrictions pertaining thereto shall be 10 years from the effective date of this agreement, at which time the Franchise shall expire and be of no force and effect. The effective date of the Franchise shall be August 22, 2000 unless the Grantee fails to file the Franchise acceptance in accordance with Section 3.7 herein, in which event this Franchise shall be null and void.

13. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

13.1 Compliance with Laws

The Grantee shall comply with all federal and state laws and regulations, including regulations of any administrative agency thereof, as well as all general ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations of the Grantor heretofore or hereafter adopted or established during the entire term of this Franchise, provided that any such ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations of the Grantor hereafter adopted or established shall not conflict or interfere with the existing rights of the Grantee hereunder. The Grantor shall make a good faith effort to provide copies to the Grantee of all general ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, and codes, and any amendments thereto, to which the Grantee is subject under this Franchise. ORS 279.312, 279.314, 279.316, and 279.320, having to do with certain conditions of labor, payment for medical care, workers' compensation insurance, liens, and other matters, are included in this Franchise by reference.

13.2 Severability

If any Section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of the Franchise agreement is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction or preempted by federal or state regulations or law, such Section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions hereof.

13.3 Captions

The captions to Sections throughout this Franchise agreement are intended solely to facilitate reading and reference to the Sections and provisions contained herein. Such captions shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Franchise agreement.

13.4 No Recourse Against the Grantor

The Grantee shall have no recourse whatsoever against the Grantor or its officials, boards, commissions, or employees for any loss, costs, expense, or damage arising out of any provision or requirement contained herein, or in the event this Franchise agreement or any part thereof is determined to be invalid.

13.5 Nonenforcement by Grantor

The Grantee shall not be relieved of its obligations to comply with any of the provisions of this Franchise agreement by reason of any failure of the Grantor to enforce prompt compliance.

Background: 1.

- 1. The City of Brookings recently entered into a lease/purchase agreement for five new police vehicles. The new vehicles replaced five vehicles plus two that were already out of service and that are in various levels of disrepair. A resolution has been prepared, for Council consideration, to declare the old vehicles surplus and dispose of the same.
- 2. One of the cars will be used for training purposes by the Fire Department and then hauled off for salvage. The remaining vehicles will be offered for sale to other government entities for a minimal amount (approximately \$500 each). Those that do not sell within 45 days will be hauled away for salvage.

Recommendation:

Approve the resolution and direct the City Manager to dispose of the vehicles as described in this report.


Background:

ROADWAY DEDICATION

Issue: Cal-Ore Life Flight Ground & Air contract renewal

Background: 1.

- 1. At the February 28, 2000, regular Council meeting, you authorized the City to take over all ambulance dispatching by authorizing Mayor Hagbom to sign a contract between the City and Cal-Ore Life Flight Ground and Air, which became effective March 1, 2000. Because of the short notice at the time, not all language details necessary for a long term contract between the parties had been worked out. However, it was agreed upon that the proposed agreement would suffice until the more detailed agreement was worked through and brought back to you for acceptance. Therefore the contract effective date was continued in effect for an initial term ending April 30, 2000, with automatic renewal for a term of 30 days, and continuing for 30 day terms thereafter unless agreed upon by both parties to terminate.
- 2. This new contract is a result of a meeting with previous City Manager Tom Weldon, Police Chief Ken Lewis, Cal-Ore General Manager Dan Brattain, Cal-Ore Operations Manager Joe Gregorio, and myself, and approval by City Attorney John Trew. Police Chief Lewis and myself feel this is a good working contract and are pleased all parties involved were agreeable in working together, to the specifics of the contract, and to the effective date of August 22, 2000.

Recommendation:

Council authorize City to continue with an ambulance dispatching agreement between the City and Cal-Ore Life Flight Ground and Air by authorizing Mayor Hagbom to sign the attached contract.

CONTRACT

This Contract, effective August 22, 2000, between the CITY OF BROOKINGS, Oregon, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, hereinafter referred to as "CITY", and CAL-ORE LIFE FLIGHT GROUND AND AIR, a division of Westlog Aviation, hereinafter referred to as "CAL-ORE".

The CITY, through its Police Department Emergency Dispatch Center, agrees to provide dispatch service to CAL-ORE for ground ambulance service covering Southern Curry County. This includes dispatching for 4 separate ambulance crews per day, 24-hours per day.

CAL-ORE agrees to pay the CITY a monthly fee of \$1,000 for such services. CAL-ORE further agrees that in addition to the \$1,000 per month fee, CAL-ORE will pay the CITY all direct expenses necessary for the provision of such service as required by CAL-ORE.

Insurance. CAL-ORE agrees to maintain a minimum \$1,000,000 bodily injury and property damage combined single limit coverage under its general and auto liability insurance policy and agrees to add the CITY as an additional insured.

<u>Termination and Renewal</u>. This contract shall become effective on August 22, 2000, and shall be reviewed, including the monthly fee, annually. This agreement may be terminated by either party after 120 days written notice.

<u>Invalidity and Severability</u>. In the event any provision of this contract is determined to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions of this contract shall remain in full force and effect.

Applicable Law. This contract shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Oregon.

Attorney Fees. In the event any suit or action is brought by any party under this contract to enforce any of its terms, it is agreed that the prevailing party shall be entitled to a reasonable attorney fee to be fixed by the trial and appellate courts.

City Manager Weldon thanked everyone for their kind words, and Mayor Hagbom thanked Weldon.

Mayor Hagbom asked to return to the regular agenda order.

V. ORAL REQUESTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE

- A. Committee and Liaison reports
 - 1. Chamber of Commerce
 Executive Director Les Cohen advised the Chamber is currently working on old growth forest grants to get ready for a feasability study for high-tech issues. He noted that as of 5:25PM this date, there were 5,138 "hits" on the Chamber of Commerce website.
 - 2. Businesses for a Better Brookings

 - 3. Port Commission
 Councilor Kuhn advised the Port's meeting had been continued to July 26th, so she had no report.
 - 4. Council Liaisons
 Councilor Curry reported on attending a few meetings including CCD
 Economic Development and Curry Governments who met regarding
 Oregon Health Plan issues and the lack of doctors willing to participate.
- B. Unscheduled

ODOT Assistant District Manager of District 7, Lee Spark-3500 Stewartpark Way, Roseburg reported on designs for south end of Chetco Bridge of which the engineers "stamp" of approval is lacking, but in process. He advised prior to getting final stamp of approval, the hydraulics engineer has to put his stamp. Sparks proceeded to provide a brief background on efforts made to date to solve the problems involved, and informed the Council of progress with TIC for the sign on the bridge for Salmon Run Golf..

Bill Farrell, 19366 Carpenterville Road, Brookings, reported on the status of the living monument committee, a Vietnam Vets project, which included a few problems, changes, and the unveiling for September 24, 2000 - Gold Star Mother's Day, as their goal. Farrell was advised the flag pole needs would need to be referred back to Parks and Recreation Commission, who would be meeting July 27, 2000, for approval and back to the Council for final approval. Public Works would be interested in lighting issues. Farrell advised the Council they have funding for all of the project, including maintenance for the future.

Mayor Hagbom thanked Farrell and stated the Council looked forward to the completion of the project.

VI. STAFF REPORTS

- A. City Manager
 - Liquor License Approval Chives, Inc., dba: Chives Restaurant
 City Manager Weldon presented request for approval of change in official ownership in title only for the Chives Restaurant liquor license.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Kuhn seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the liquor license change request.

2. Ordinance Regulating the sale and distribution of tobacco and tobacco products

Mayor Hagbom asked council to continue to next council meeting.

Augie Kofoet, 787 Ransom, Brookings, was confused about the ordinance, and Weldon clarified the ordinance is designed only to address accessibility, not age-which is taken care of by state law.

Councilor Keith Pepper stated he disagreed with continuing the agenda item and asked that we do something this evening, since five people have come for a third time to address the issue. Mayor Hagbom asked for a show of hands. With a three (3) to two (2) in favor vote, the matter remained on the agenda, but was continued to later on the agenda.

3. Authorize letter to Chamber of Commerce - Transient Room Tax Dollars
City Manager Weldon provided background and recommendations for the
tourism promotion services agreement being reviewed and accordingly,
the legally required procedures for doing same.

Councilor Johns moved, Councilor Pepper seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to authorize Mayor Hagbom to sign a letter to the Chamber President stating the City wished to terminate the present agreement effective June 30, 2001, and to ask for their written confirmation of this action.

Mayor Hagbom and Councilor Pepper commented they were in no way unhappy with the Chamber's services, and that it was just time to "clean-up" the document and appropriate to review it. In order to accomplish this, the appropriate steps had to be taken, which included the official notice to the Chamber.

4. Cable TV franchise - Falcon Cable, dba: Charter Communications
Mayor Hagbom informed t the Council this matter will be addressed again
at a special Council meeting on August 7, 2000, with the Council and

Falcon Cable representatives being present, having been before the County that same date in the morning.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to move the Cable Television franchise agreement with Charter Communications to a Special Council Meeting on August 7, 2000.

5. Air Service to Medford

City Manager Weldon supplied background on meetings being held and proposals to improve air service to this area by linking us with Medford and ultimately Portland and to the south. He recommended approval of the proposed resolution to encourage the Federal Government to help us get in line with this issue and improve the service.

Chamber Executive Director Cohen explained their resolution and their goals.

Rick Jackson of Brooke Lane, asked regarding FAA subsidizing and would the service be cut off after a given length of time. Cohen responded with contemplating larger carriers will pick-up the service.

Mayor Hagbom read aloud the resolution in its entirety.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to approve Resolution No. 00-R-682, in the matter of supporting the efforts of Curry, Del Norte, and Jackson Counties to obtain air service at a reasonable cost to the communities in these counties.

Augie Kofoet, President of Business for a Better Brookings, asked to be added to the agenda.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to add Businesses for a Better Brookings to the Agenda.

Kofoet requested special facilitation to accomplish a "Spruce Street Market" for the Summer 2000, written information provided. Mayor Hagbom asked if this project was sponsored by Businesses for a Better Brookings. It was discussed to review with the proposal with City Manager Weldon and to meet with authors of the proposal to attempt to accomplish their immediate deadline. Council was advised a copy of the proposal had been given to ODOT regarding recommendations/approval of signs. Discussion ensued regarding street closure, other businesses in the area, permits, health department issues, and having a "test" run.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the "Spruce Street Market" for August 12, 2000, subject to the Mayor and City Manager's final approval, up to and including the closure of Spruce Street. Approval would include a report back to the Council on the following Monday.

Mayor Hagbom declared the meeting in recess at 8:45PM.

Mayor Hagbom reconvened the meeting at 8:52PM by singing Happy Birthday to Finance Director/Recorder Gail Hedding.

Mayor Hagbom asked for Council comments regarding the tobacco ordinance and, having already had a public hearing on the matter, not passing the ordinance tonight, but only discussing it. Weldon offered staff recommendations and asked the Council to do something positive on this issue: either pass the ordinance, change it and then pass it, or ask the County Commissioners to pass it. Councilor Pepper recommended the Council pass the ordinance and ask the County to pass a similar one. Discussion ensued including questions from Councilor Kuhn and comments from Councilor Curry who is not favor of proceeding with the ordinance.

Audience comments came from Augie Kofoet of 787 Ransom, Brookings.

Dave Manzella from the Curry County Health Department, 29590 Pacific Street, Gold Beach, read into record showing support from schools within the City: from Principal Chris Mc Kay, asking for the safety and well being of our students to be a high priority in community... making these products less available will make a positive impact on our schools. Manzella asked City of Brookings to show some real leadership to show the communities on how to approach this life threatening problem, and the importance of beginning at the small community level.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted with four (4) ayes, and one (1) nay from Councilor Curry, to direct staff to prepare the ordinance for the agenda of August 14, 2000.

He noted Falcon Cable TV, dba: Charter Communications has participated very cooperatively in the negotiations process, and that this is a good document, placing the City in a good position for regulating the cable performance. There are provisions protecting the city for liability, good customers standards, and penalties for remedies in quality control. With agreement from City Attorney John Trew, Jolin presented the minimal changes as previously presented by the document which were primarily date and in-house modifications as a result of the ordinance and contract approval being addressed at the next Council meeting.

Discussion ensued with the largest concerns being over quality control as a result of citizens' complaints. Jolin assured the Council the penalty provisions in Section 7,

specifically Section 7.7, provided the City with avenues to address these issues and get results. Jolin continued by thanking the City Council for working with prior City Manager Tom Weldon and Nancy Brendlinger and advising it would take only a few days to have the final copy for public availability.

Steve Holmes, Director of Regulatory Affairs for the Northwest Region of Charter Communications, 201 NE Park Plaza Drive, Vancouver WA, asked the Council to review Section 7.7.B, which specifically addressed the issue of credit to consumers when Falcon failed to comply with performance. Holmes continued with presenting background on Charter Communications revamping of cable network performance.

Bob Pearson, General Manager of Charter Communications-Crescent City, Gold Beach, and Brookings-Harbor, 1385 NW Washington Blvd, Crescent City, CA answered technical questions from the Council.
