

MINUTES
BROOKINGS COMMON COUNCIL MEETING
MARCH 14, 1988
7:00 P.M.

The City Council of the City of Brookings, Curry County, Oregon, met in regular session in the Council Chambers of the Brookings City Hall on the 14TH day of March, 1988, at 7:00 p.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER

Vice Mayor Batty called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

IV. CEREMONIES/APPOINTMENTS

1. Budget Committee Appointments

Vice Mayor Batty advised that he has received two letters of interest in the position of budget committee member, one from Eldon Gossett and one from Clinton Hisle.

Councilor Nidiffer moved to appoint Eldon Gossett to the budget committee, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Hoselton. A vote was taken with the following results:

2. Connie Croy from Coos-Curry Council of Governments gave a brief update report on the Senior Nutrition Program in Curry County.
3. Dan Potilechio presented the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce Promotion Plan and Budget to the Council. Mr. Potilechio was informed that this matter would come before the Budget Committee in April.

A. Mayor Announcements

1. Vice Mayor Batty reported that Mayor Kerr is doing very well following heart surgery.

B. Council Announcements

1. Councilor Hoselton - Report on Coos-Curry Council of Governments

Councilor Hoselton reported that she, as the representative to the Coos-Curry Council of Governments, visited the CCCOG offices in Coos Bay, and after consideration, recommended that the City of Brookings remain in the Coos-Curry Council of Governments.

Councilor Hoselton moved to ratify the by-laws amendment which was requested and tabled at the last Council meeting, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Nidiffer. A vote was taken with the following results:

D. City Manager Announcements

1. Brookings Harbor Little League is requesting permission to reserve the fields at Bud Cross Park for the coming Little League Season

City Manager Roy Rainey presented this item to the Council in the form of a letter from Michael Hahn, President of the Brookings Harbor Little League.

Following discussion, Councilor Peterson moved to approve the request, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Nidiffer. A vote was taken with the following results:

Vice Mayor Batty declared the motion carried and the Bud Cross Park fields reserved for the Brookings Harbor Little League for the coming season.

2. Request from Mahesh Amin to remove the parking on Chetco Avenue in front of the Beaver State Motel

City Manager Roy Rainey presented this item to the City Council and recommended approval of the request.

Following discussion, Councilor Peterson made a motion to approve the request, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Hoselton. A vote was taken with the following results:

Vice Mayor Batty declared the motion carried and the request for no parking in front of the Beaver State Motel approved.

3. Letter from Department of Environmental Quality concerning infiltration and inflow in Brookings

City Manager Roy Rainey presented the Council with a letter from DEQ outlining the conditions which must be met by the city prior to obtaining the Step 4 grant for the wastewater facilities plan.

Following discussion, Councilor Peterson made a motion to accept the conditions, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Hoselton. A vote was taken with the following results:

Vice Mayor Batty declared the motion carried and the conditions of the DEQ letter accepted.

4. Water Treatment Systems Operator II Certificate to Paul A. Strader from State of Oregon; and
5. Water Treatment Systems Operator I Certificate to Lee H. Perry from State of Oregon.
6. Letter from Coldwell Banker Real Estate suggesting that the City apply for grant monies from South Coast Business Employment Corporation for Economic Development

Mr. Rainey presented the letter to the Council and Councilor Hoselton volunteered to check into the possibility of the grant request.

7. Consideration of formation of a local improvement district on Fifth Street

Mr. Rainey explained the circumstances surrounding the proposal recommended that the Council approve the first phase of consideration of an LID.

After discussion, Councilor Nidiffer moved to approve the first phase in the process of consideration of an LID on Fifth Street, that being preparation of preliminary design and cost estimates by a registered engineer to be approved, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Hoselton. A vote was taken with the following results:

Vice Mayor Batty declared the motion carried and the first phase in the process approved.

8. Agreement for Engineering Services for the Wastewater Facilities Plan with Brown and Caldwell Engineering

City Manager Roy Rainey presented the document to the Council for consideration and recommended some minor modifications. City Attorney John Babin also recommended some slight modifications to the wording.

After discussion, Councilor Nidiffer moved to authorize the signing of the agreement after discussion with Brown and Caldwell regarding the modifications, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Peterson. A vote was taken with the following results:

Vice Mayor Batty declared the motion carried and the agreement approved, with conditions.

9. Draft of Water Intake, Treatment Plant and Distribution Study from CH2M Hill Engineering

City Manager Roy Rainey presented the Council with copies of the draft proposal.

The Council was in agreement that since the proposed draft has just been received, they would recess after tonight's meeting and reconvene a study session March 22, to further study the draft proposal.

10. City Manager Absence

City Manager Roy Rainey requested and received approval to be away from the City for a week in April in order to attend the 60th wedding anniversary of his parents.

11. Request for Local Improvement District on Easy Street

Mr. Gordon Myrah, 1200 Easy Street, requested permission from the Council to begin the process of forming a local improvement district on Easy Street from Pioneer Road to Highway 101 for the purpose of installing sidewalks for the safety of pedestrians, especially school children walking to and from school.

The Council wholeheartedly agreed with the request and offered any assistance the city staff may be able to provide.

E. Attorney Announcements

City Attorney John Babin informed the Council that the city has been successful in the acquisition of the water line easement on the Alexander property.

City Attorney John Babin gave a brief update on the proposed golf course site at Jack Creek.

Building/Fire Safety Officer Marshall Ferg presented the request which totals approximately \$5,000 in equipment.

City Engineer Richard Nored presented the engineering report on the proposed project.

City Attorney John Babin asked for testimony in favor of the proposed local improvement district.

Raymond and Helen Weaver, 522 Hassett Street, and Scott Kline, 1253 Tolman Creek Road, Ashland, Oregon, spoke in favor of the proposal.

City Attorney John Babin asked for testimony from opponents of the proposal.

Bruce Perkins, P.O. Box 6783, Brookings, testified that he was not opposed to the proposal for the neighboring properties, but requested that his parcel be exempted from the local improvement district.

City Attorney John Babin closed the public hearing at 9:40 p.m., and turned the meeting back to the Council for consideration.

After discussion, Councilor Nidiffer moved to approve the local improvement district as presented by the staff and the city engineer, which motion was duly seconded by Councilor Peterson. A vote was taken with the following results:
