Staff presented the proposal for rezoning the area on the north and south side of Hwy. 101, from Rubio's to Easy Street from existing zoning of C-G (Commercial General) to proposed zoning classification of C-4 (Tourist Commercial).

The following persons spoke offering comments, opinions, expressing concerns and/or asking questions:

1. Shirley Beaman

(a) Read a statement from property owners in Oceanview Shopping Center who were opposed to rezoning from C-G to C-4 (Tourist Commercial). Proposed zoning would limit businesses that could go into the center. All six existing businesses were opposed. The list of business owners community-wide who were opposed was read.

2. Terry Beaman - Carpetland

(a) Don't have foot traffic onto the center; automobileoriented; not pedestrian - oriented; type of businesses which are able to service in the center.

Mayor Kerr, Councilors Batty, Peterson - "No gain to be
making change."

3. Nick Beaman

- (a) Difficult to get onto 101 due to steepness of driveway and curve of Hwy. 101.
- (b) People do not walk to this site.

Comment from Leo Appel: Leave Beaman property north to Easy Street in C-G equivalent zone, (C-3; Central Commercial).

4. Don McDonald, 807 Paradise

(a) "Imposing burden on existing center. No demonstrated need for the change."

5. Nancy Brendlinger, 925 Marina Heights

(a) "Don't restrict highway uses at all."

6. Ray Nidiffer, Ray's Sentry Market

(a) Proposed to develop a row of apartments along north part of Ray's Sentry Market administrative offices property - 100 feet wide strip by the depth of the subject parcel.

7. Lee Musser, Part Owner of Tax Lot 600

(a) Not opposed to PO-1 zone being applied to their property, but thinks that Tax Lot 3000 should also be rezoned similarly along with the City Hall site, for continuity and proper transition from General Commercial to residential along Fifth Street from Hwy. 101 to Easy Street.

8. Nick Beaman

(a) Agrees with Nidiffer.

<u>Councilor Hoselton</u> - questions "daycare, nursery schools and kindergartens," being listed as a permitted use in the PO-1 zone.

General comments from Mayor, Councilors and Commission members, regarding elements of the draft Land Development Code:

<u>Mayor Kerr</u> - questions necessity of Architectural Review process; will have difficulty in getting people to serve and town has no theme by which to evaluate projects.

Councilor Batty -

- (a) Commercial developments are required to have to have an architect or engineer prepare plans. Questions need for Architectural Review process.
- (b) Concerned about changing the height of building in residential zones..
- (c) Requiring major street improvements on remodeling projects is inappropriate and repressive.

9. Nancy Brendlinger, 925 Marina Heights

(a) "Two lending institutions backing off on deferred improvement agreements."
