Reissue of Audited Financial Statements

Issue:

1998/99 Audited Financial Statements must be reissued.

Background:

It has been brought to my attention that an error was made in the 1998/99 audited financial statements that will require a revision of the audit report. The error was the result of an adjusting entry posted with the incorrect account number and thus the wrong fund was adjusted. The intent was to adjust the wastewater fund and the error resulted in the adjustment of the water fund. Because the amount is material to the overall financial statements and specifically the affected funds (Water and wastewater), the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report has been revised by Musser and Assoc.

Recommendation

Approve the revision and reissue of the 1998/99 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

Independent Auditor's Report

Mayor and Council Members City of Brookings Brookings, Oregon

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the City of Brookings, Oregon, as of and for the year ended June 30, 1998, as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the City of Brookings management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as discussed in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the general purpose financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principals used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general- purpose financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Governmental Accounting Standards Board Technical Bulletin 98-1, Disclosures about Year 2000 Issues, requires disclosure of certain matters regarding the year 2000 issue. The City of Brookings has included such disclosures in Note 15. Because of the unprecedented nature of the year 2000 issue, its effects and the success of related remediation efforts will not be fully determinable until the year 2000 and thereafter. Accordingly, insufficient audit evidence exists to support City of Brookings's disclosures with respect to the year 2000 issue made in Note 15. Further we do not provide assurance that the City of Brookings is or will be year 2000 ready, that the City of Brookings' year 2000 remediation efforts will be successful in whole or in part, or that parties with which the City of Brookings does business will be year 2000 ready.

In our opinion, except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had we been able to examine evidence regarding year 2000 disclosures, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the City of Brookings, Oregon, as of June 30, 1998, and the results of its operations for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

As discussed in Note 17 to the financial statements, certain errors resulting in an understatement of revenues in the Water Fund and an overstatement of revenues in the Wastewater Fund for the year ending June 30, 1998 were discovered by management of the City during the subsequent year. Accordingly, the financial statements for the year ending June 30, 1998 have been restated to correct the error.

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued our report dated December 19, 1998, on our consideration of the City of Brookings' internal control over financial reporting and our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grants.

Our audit was performed for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The accompanying financial information schedules listed in the table of contents as supplemental schedules and the accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards required by U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the City of Brookings. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the general purpose financial statements, and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

4. Assessments receivable

Assessments receivable represent uncollected amounts levied against benefited property for the cost of local improvements. An allowance for uncollectible amounts is not deemed necessary because substantially all amounts, including delinquent assessments are payable over a period of ten years and the City can attach a lien against the property ensuring eventual collection. Assessments bear 6.75% to 8.5% interest, depending on the local improvement district. All assessments are reported as deferred revenue until paid.

The state of Oregon sponsors a program whereby senior citizens can defer payment of their special assessments. After a senior citizen's application for deferral is accepted by the state, the state pays their assessments when due. When the senior citizen dies or disposes of his home, the assessment is paid in full to the City, which then pays the amounts advanced by the state.

6. Interfund transactions

Interfund transactions consist only of operating transfers and are reported in the accompanying general purpose financial statements prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. The following is a listing of the interfund receivables and payables by fund at June 30, 1998, which represents each fund's share of cash and investments, as described in Note 1.

be restored from the City's other funds. The City is required to maintain sewer rates to cover all expenses of operating the new facility plus 105% of the annual loan payment. The City had not established the reserve account as of the date of this report.

Since July 1, 1998 the city has drawn an additional \$477,883 in loan proceeds on the wastewater construction loan from the Oregon DEQ.

The City on December 1, 1998 issued \$1,055,000 in Limited Tax Improvement Refunding Bonds to defease the Special Assessment Bonds issued in 1992. The refunding bonds were issued to save a present value of \$118,972 in debt service.

17. Revision of Previously Issued Financial Statements

The special revenue funds of Water and Waste Water were erroneously interchanged when reallocating revenues collected for the new capital projects Waste Water Reconstruction fund. This error caused the Water Fund revenues and fund balance to be understated, and the Waste Water Fund revenues and fund balance to be overstated.

Compliance

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the City of Brookings' general-purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grants, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed instances of noncompliance that are required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as item 98-1.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit, we considered the City of Brookings' internal control over financial reporting in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the general purpose and individual fund financial statements and not to provide assurance on the internal control over financial reporting. Our consideration of the internal control over financial reporting would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control over financial reporting that might be material weaknesses. A material weakness is a condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control components does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that misstatements in amounts that would be material in relation to the general purpose financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their operation that we consider to be material weaknesses.
