#### SAFETY CITY

Safety City is a child pedestrian and traffic safety program combined with a life safety course. This program is conducted for children entering kindergarten in the upcoming school year. Safety City includes classroom instruction and outdoor practice in a miniature city complete with streets, sidewalks, small buildings, traffic lights and stop signs.

Issue:

Improvements along Old County Road by Azalea Park

#### Background:

- Attached is an application from Richard Woodel requesting permission to be allowed to do this project.
- The project consists of:
  - 1) Clearing brush from the area between Old County Road and the embankment in Azalea Park, and
  - 2) Leveling of this area and spreading gravel provided by the City.

Doing this work will provide a relatively safe open walkway for pedestrians in this area.

- Woodel would do this work by supervising two "residents" from the Curry County Community Justice Department's Work Crew. The two workers are well screened people who have shown a positive attitude towards working while in custody and are considered very low "flight risks". Curry County provides insurance for this work.
- I have reviewed this proposed project with Parks and Recreation Commission Chair Craig Mickelson and he does not consider it a park project (and I agree) and he thinks it is a good, needed project.
- Leo and Dennis Barlow had been talking about the need to do this work before Rick came forward with his proposal.
- The only expense to the City would be for gravel, estimated at \$500.

#### Recommendation:

Authorize Richard Woodel to do this project as outlined in his proposal, city staff to work with him on this, and expenditure of approximately \$500 for gravel for the walkway.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 98-R-648**

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A POLICY ON VOLUNTEER PROJECTS AND/OR SERVICES SPONSORED BY THE CITY.

WHEREAS, the Brookings volunteer City Council is elected to oversee City assets and City provided services; and

WHEREAS, Brookings has a wealth of volunteers and volunteer groups. Hundreds of these individuals and many groups have been associated with the city and have provided wonderful things-projects and services the citizens of this community would not have enjoyed without these volunteers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brookings' insurance covers volunteers working on City property and those volunteers working under the name of the City of Brookings while providing services; and

WHEREAS, all City-related volunteer projects/services take some City staff time, as volunteer efforts need to be coordinated with other City activities; and

WHEREAS, before new projects or services are implemented, potential future resource requirements must be addressed. Projects or services provided by volunteers oftentimes become a permanent part of what the City does. Volunteer efforts are not always permanent as funding or volunteer worker time may stop. This may put the City in the difficult position of having to continue the service/maintain the project improvements or discontinue funding maintenance of a project or providing a service the community likes and assumed was permanent.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS THAT:

- 1. Volunteer projects on city-owned property or services provided in the name of the City must be approved by the City before work begins. This includes changes to existing projects or services and projects or services funded by grants or donations.
- 2. All grants must be approved by the City Council before they are applied for.

- 3. New minor projects or services or changes may be approved by the City Manager.
- 4. Other projects or services or changes must be approved by the City Council and this requires that volunteers work with the City Manager (or other designated staff) and any appropriate city volunteer advisory committee, such as the Planning Commission or Parks and Recreation Commission before being considered by the City Council.

Ground Ambulance Application in Del Norte County

Dear Mayor and City Council Members:

This letter concerns Cal-Ore Life Flight's application to Del Norte County to operate a ground ambulance service from Sutter Coast Hospital to the Crescent City Airport.

Cal-Ore Life Flight applied for a permit in January, 1999 to provide ground ambulance transportation for its air ambulance patients from Sutter Coast Hospital to the Crescent City Airport. Due to the opposition of Del Norte Ambulance, the Board of Supervisors chose to hire an administrative law judge to conduct a hearing and to direct the Board of Supervisors as to a

Following a hearing in April, 1999, the judge recently rendered his decision. His decision informs the Board of Supervisors that it is within the law to either approve or deny the application, with adequate evidence to support either


Unlike Curry County, ambulance services have never gone out to bid in Del Norte County. In the County ordinances, there is simply a permitting process with the main emphasis being on issuing a permit based upon "public need and convenience."

The call volume for Del Norte Ambulance is approximately 2,800 calls per year, while Cal-Ore Life Flight's call volume is approximately 1,800 calls per year in ASA 2 and ASA 3. The approximate number of transfers to the Crescent City Airport which Cal-Ore wishes to provide represents approximately 150 calls or 5% of the Del Norte Ambulance annual call volume.

The Board of Supervisors has now scheduled a public hearing for June 22, 1999 at 4:00 PM, at which time they will take public testimony (limited to three minutes per speaker). Additionally, both Cal-Ore Life Flight and Del Norte Ambulance will be granted 15 minutes each to present their respective points.

We believe that this issue is of extreme importance and interest to the residents of Brookings and Curry County for the following reasons:

- \* <u>Cal-Ore Life Flight has approximately 3,000 members in Curry County (most in the City of Brookings), all of whom would benefit by this service being added to their membership package.</u>
- \* In 1998, <u>Cal-Ore Life flight transported approximately 150</u>

  <u>patients by air ambulance out of Crescent City</u>. This was
  approximately half of the total air transfers from Sutter Coast.
- \* Del Norte Ambulance testified that they do not believe this issue should involve Curry County.
- \* According to Sutter Coast personnel, approximately 25% of their business is from Curry County.
- \* If approved, Cal-Ore Life Flight's services will provide the user a <u>reduction of over \$150</u> for the airport transfer.
- \* As a member of Cal-Ore Life Flight, insurance reimbursement will be accepted as payment in full for both air and ground services.

We would ask that the City Council consider drafting a resolution supporting this permit as it will directly benefit the City of Brookings residents. In addition, we would ask that a representative from the Council speak at the hearing slated for June 22, 1999.



#### VII. ORAL REQUESTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE

- A. Committee and Liaison reports
  - 1. Chamber of Commerce

Executive Director Les Cohen congratulated the Council on their selection of Riley Smith to the Planning Commission. He updated the Council on the upcoming Azalea Festival on the next weekend and asked that all keep in mind the purpose for our Memorial Day Holiday and for all those giving their lives for the freedoms we enjoy. Cohen also indicate the lodging survey for the upcoming holiday weekend is very high and continued by thanking the City for donating their parking lot for the non-profit street fair organizations.

2. Businesses for a Better Brookings

Vice President Augie Kofoet informed the Council of the placement of American Flags during the announced Americanism week and Memorial Day weekend. Mayor Hagbom thanked the organization for their combined efforts to clean-up the downtown in preparation for the Azalea Festival.

Mayor Hagbom acknowledged the presence of Port Commissioner Ken Byrtus, and the liaison from the Port Commission. Along with Byrtus was his wife, Virginia, who is currently a member of the City's Budget Committee.

3. Council Liaisons

Councilor Frances Johns advised the Council she attended the Brookings-Harbor 17C School District Board meeting and the School District's Facilities Task Force Committee since the last Council meeting, which included much listening, reading, and learning. She encouraged any and all to attend these same meetings.

Councilor Keith Pepper reported there is a Canopy Project meeting scheduled for the coming Thursday afternoon.

Councilor George Ciapusci informed the Council he had attended the Port Commission meeting recently which proved to be the fastest held meeting he had ever attended. He continued reporting that the Harbor Master announced the wave surge suppression project was on fast track and that Port Commissioner Ken Byrtus had volunteered to be the liaison to the City Council.

Councilor Larry Curry attended the Annual Meeting of the Coos County Douglas Development Corporation last Thursday in Gold Beach. He continued, for the audience, to explain the purpose and some background of the CCD Development Corporation, which is comprised of 27 people from the three counties (nine each) of Coos, Curry, and Douglas. Councilor Curry was elected Chair of group's Board of Directors.

Mayor Bob Hagbom stated he had spent 1-½ days in Salem with representatives from the State Land Department and several other state agencies dealing with the continued efforts for building our golf course. Additionally, Hagbom spent "Mayor's Day" last Thursday, listening to the Governor, the President of the Senate and four other legislative members regarding bills on transportation and education.

#### B. Unscheduled

Citizen resident Al Bernhard spoke regarding an agenda item and was asked to speak later when the matter would be called in order from the agenda.

City Manager Tom Weldon presented a request from Kim Gumm, owner of Cousins & Co. Music & Antiques at 777 Cottage Street, asking for road closure in front of their shop at same address on Saturday May 29<sup>th</sup> from 12:00 Noon until 8:00 PM, for a musical jam session, involving numerous bands and people listening to the music. Weldon discussed with and recommended to the Council the road closure, especially since the Police and Fire Chiefs, Community Development Department, and Dragon Gate Restaurant owner George Lee had no objections.

Councilor Curry moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to add to the agenda the closure of Cottage Street on May 29th, as requested.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Ciapusci seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the closure

# of Cottage Street on Saturday, May 29th from 12:00 Noon until 8:00 PM, for the purposes of a musical jam session.

#### VIII. STAFF REPORTS

- A. Finance Department
  - Financial/Utility Billing Computer Software System Selection Mayor Hagbom asked Finance Director Gail Hedding to explain the request for a new financial and utility billing computer. She explained the City's existing systems were not only non-Y2K complaint but they do not interface with each other, which could mean system failure and shutdown on January 1, 2000. Hedding informed the Council of information she gathered after meeting with the City Auditor, making various inquiries with Finance Directors in other cities and trade shows, and calling current users of several different software packages. She recommended the Council authorize purchase of the Caselle package of products to serve the City's finance and utility billing system needs. She recommended staff be authorized to enter into a contract for this purchase, after approval by the City Attorney. She continued by stating Caselle has demonstrated stability in the governmental software market since 1977 with over 450 installations and would meet our city's parameters. There was no comment or discussion from the public or Council.

Councilor Ciapusci moved, Councilor Pepper seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the purchase of a new financial/utility billing computer software system through Caselle at \$34,070, by Resolution No. 99-R-660.

#### B. City Manager

1. The westside of U.S. 101 - Ransom to Harris Beach State Park entrance road

Mayor Hagbom questioned the audience in general for proponents and opponents of those in attendance. City Manager Tom Weldon explained the request from volunteers offering to remove underbrush vegetation and trees to create an ocean viewshed on ODOT right-of-way between Ransom Avenue and Parkview Drive. After a review of the project with the volunteer co-ordinator Cliff Misener, and ODOT representative, City Staff, and other volunteers and nearby residents, Weldon stated he had some concerns, including the addition of potentially dangerous traffic situations. Additionally, several adjacent residents had called and

sent correspondence objecting to the thinning. The state permit allowing such a project would be in the City's name, and would ultimately hold the City responsible. Weldon continued by informing the Council the State had received a request to purchase the property from a private property owner, of which Weldon would recommend against. A lengthy discussion ensued, including concerns of side streets emptying into traffic congestion, park entrances, traffic speed, staff recommendations for regulations if the project were to be done, and comments from Community Development Director Leo Lightle advising ODOT had informed him they were concerned about traffic congestion in that area, but not to the point of stopping such a project.

Mayor Hagbom asked for comments from the audience. Citizens and property owners in the area Cliff Misener of 1343 Homestead Road, Nancy Brendlinger, Harris Beach Park Manager Don Higginson, Dale Pinkston of 1408 View Court, Richard Johnson of 1431 Chetco Avenue, Al Bernhard of 1575 Beach Avenue, Parks & Rec. Commission Member Augie Kofoet, and Archie LeCoque of 17717 Rainbow Rock Road provided extensive comments to the Council.

Concerns and questions ensued from the Council regarding safety hazards, wetlands, scenic byway program, supervision and procedures of volunteers, land sale, view loss, City's liability, noise levels, speed conditions, ODOT's management concerns, establishing another viewpoint, and compromises.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Ciapusci, and the Council voted unanimously to have the Mayor send a letter to ODOT advising them to not sell the property, and to give the City of Brookings first option, if they do decide to sell the property in question.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Ciapusci seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to table the request from volunteers offering to remove underbrush vegetation and trees to create an ocean viewshed on ODOT right-of-way between Ransom Avenue and Parkview Drive until further information is received from the State, including the issue of

#### selling the property.

Mayor Hagbom called for a ten minute recess at 8:47PM.

Mayor Hagbom reconvened the Common Council meeting at 8:57PM.

2. Committee to study pool issues Mayor Hagbom reviewed the Council packet information provided by staff and asked City Manager Tom Weldon to work with Council Frances Johns on the volunteer project for establishing a committee to study the covering of the pool. Weldon asked the Council to make this an official short-term Council Advisory Committee or a Parks and Recreation Sub-committee, which would recommend a typ of pool cover and determine rough cost estimates for construction of such a cover. The committee would also determine the feasibility of raising enough funds to cover the swimming pool, and recommend a budget, including expenses and possible sources of additional income to operate a covered swimming pool year round. Weldon explained he would look to recruit approximately ten people for the committee from the School Board an/or Administration, young people at large, Brookings-Harbor Youth Association, Churches, student groups and other youth connected groups, citizens at large, and businesses. including the Council liaison Frances Johns and a liaison from the Parks and Recreation Commission.

Councilor Pepper requested monthly reports to the Parks & Rec. Commission. The Council by consensus agreed to form a City Council Advisory Committee, immediately, to work on covering the swimming pool at Bud Cross Park.

City Manager Weldon presented the request from Nature's Coastal Holiday to designate the present entrance/exit at this parking lot at Pacific to an entrance only, and to pave the temporary entrance/exit from this parking lot that was created for the light festival and designate it as an exit only, resulting in a safer drive through. He noted Nature's Coastal Holiday offered to fund the paving and signing with no costs to the City, and that the Parks and Recreation Commission had reviewed the request on April 22, 1999, and recommended the project for approval.

Councilor Johns moved, Councilor Ciapusci seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to

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accept the staff and Parks and Recreation Commission recommendation to approve the change of traffic circulation pattern at Kidtown parking lots and paving of the second driveway.

4. DRAFT Curry County State Parks Master Plan
City Manager Tom Weldon made comments on the "DRAFT"
Curry County State Parks Master Plan, including how pleased he
was with OPRD in getting so many people involved, the successful
public meetings, and that parts of this plan will ultimately come
back to the Council for review before it is officially adopted by
OPRD.

Harris Beach Management Unit Director Manager Don Higginson was present to help with questions, noting he felt the report was important reading. Councilor Pepper thanked Weldon for going through the lengthy Master Plan and registered this is not a contract with Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) to do "all this", but the Master Plan is their "wish list", which makes it much easier to move forward when a project is presented, having already been addressed in their established list/plan.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to send a letter from the Mayor with the staff's recommendations and comments as noted previously.

Councilor Curry moved, Council Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the Consent Calendar as printed, with Councilor Pepper abstaining due to his absence at the May 10<sup>th</sup>, 1999, Council Meeting.

## THE PLANNING COMMISSION TOOK THE FOLLOWING ACTION IN THE PUBLIC HEARINGS

1. By a 5-0 vote (motion: Commissioner Breuer, second: Commissioner Ciapusci) the Planning Commission approved (File No. M3-1-99) a request for a minor partition to create two lots from a parent parcel located on the east side of First Street, approximately 245 feet south of Ransom

Avenue; zoned R-2 (Two-family Residential); Keith Smith, applicant, Lloyd Matlock, representative. The motion included changes to the conditions of approval as follows:

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Call To Order

The Board met in the council Chambers at 898 Elk Drive, Brookings, Oregon at 1:35PM on April 13, 1999. Members present were Bob Krebs, Russ Fritz and Tim Adsit. Larry Smith and Jim Collis were absent and excused from the meeting. Members present constituted a quorum. Mayor Nancy Brendlinger, City Manager Tom Weldon, Community Development Director Leo Lightle, and Finance Officer Gail Hedding were also present.

Review of prior Meeting Minutes

The Vice Chair noted that minutes of the January 19th were distributed and approved.

City Staff and Financial Reports

Mayor Brendlinger announced that she would be resigning as Mayor on April 26, 1999. The Vice Chair thanked the Mayor for her participation with this Committee in the past. The Mayor announced that she hoped to attend the SDCRB meetings as a member of the public. Tom Weldon explained the replacement process to the Committee.

Leo was unaware that the SDCRB did not get the same report that he got and at the last meeting Chair Collis handed out a printout that Leo did not understand and that led to a misunderstanding of the two documents. Leo does not receive a financial document; he receives a distribution and treatment report.

Jim Collis comes into the financial office and gets figures for the current month. Jim keeps a report recapping the expenses and interest payment and total dollar saved and it may or may not agree with what the Finance Officer has booked. The closest thing that we have to indicate we have adequate funds to do something if the City came to us with a capital expenditure need, Jim Collis' report is the only tool we have to judge if we have the money to accommodate that expense.

Leo stated that part of what this Committee is to supposed to do is to review the funds are spent in the right manner. Ms. Hedding and Mr. Weldon stated they would like to see a report that covers these needs. Mr. Weldon hopes that when the new system is UP, we should have these.

Currently there is no breakdown between water collection and water distribution. The SDC Committee needs a way to match revenues and expenditures. Tom Weldon states he would like to see one system, one report of the revenues monthly spread among the five funds. This new procedure will be reviewed in the July SDCRB meeting.

At the July meeting, Leo will come to the Committee with a request for approximately \$6,000 more of SDC money for the Oak Street job (Spruce to Railroad portion).

Member Report/Comments

Bob Krebs gave the Committee an update of the Hogan situation of delinquent SDC fees. He also commented on the article in the Triplicate regarding expansion of Pelican Bay Prison and Del Norte County's request for SDC fees.

Next meeting was scheduled for1:30PM on July 13, 1999. The meeting was adjourned at 2:20PM

#### **Division Statistics**

 Building permits were issued for 2 single family dwellings; 9 single family additions; 1 multi-family residential (9-unit condominium) and 4 commercial changes. Total value of the new construction was \$1,500,750.

## We thought you'd want to know

 Planning Division staff was kept busy after the mailing of the notice on the Public Hearing for the Public Facilities and Services Plan for the Urban Growth Boundary. State law, as passed by the voters last November, requires municipalities to send written notice to every property owner within their jurisdiction whenever a change to the Comprehensive Plan is proposed.

Staff fielded close to 150 inquiries about the notifications. The state-law-required statement that "the city has determined that the adoption of this ordinance will affect the permissible uses of your property and may reduce the value of your property" understandably had many residents concerned.

Once the whole process was explained and the area involved was shown most constituents were satisfied that while it would be a interesting meeting their property rights were not being put in jeopardy.

- Public Works did a dandy job of sprucing up the city for the Azalea Festival. Spring clean up is continuing with additional curb painting and crosswalk demarcations. The city is using a hottape application instead of paint for many of the high use crosswalks. This tape has proven to be longer lasting than the paint used in the past.
- Two new employees began work at the Treatment Plants in May. David Branham moved from Corvallis to fill the position of Operator and Thomas Moody of Brookings began work in the Operator Assistant position.

- A new 10" waterline on Parkview Drive is tied into our system. This line, which replaces the old 6" line, allows for a new fire hydrant on Parkview giving better fire protection for residents of that area. The water line was put in by Jay Patel, M.D. to serve his assisted living facility. Sheetrock is being hung in the building at this time.
- Los Amigos Mexican Restaurant has taken out building permits for a major remodel of their building's exterior. Grading has begun for a new mini-storage building behind the mini-lube on Railroad Avenue and architects for the new post office are inquiring about pulling permits for city services.

## **Projects in Progress**

Brown and Caldwell, engineers for the WWTP
Expansion Project hosted a retreat for their staff and
families in Brookings, May 1. Like most office
personnel, Brown and Caldwell's staff hears voices
over the phone and reads about project locations. This
trip gave them a chance to put "faces to the voices" and
see the project first hand. Several city staff and elected
officials joined in the tour of the plant.

Work on the project continues on schedule. Some very large deep holes have been excavated. There was a slight delay in getting rebar which needs to be installed before the concrete can be poured. The rebar arrived June 7 so the contractor should be able to remain on schedule.

- While the Ransom Street Pedestrian Walkway project looks complete portions of the project did not meet the specifications, therefore they will be reconstructed.
- The city has received the Supplemental Environmental Project for signature by the city and then it will be forwarded to the Department of Environmental Quality's Director for his signature. This project, to plant trees in the Chetco River watershed, was to use 80% of the wastewater system violations fine to enhance the local watershed instead of forwarding all of the fine to the State of Oregon.

RE: May Finance Department Report

The Finance Department is now fully staffed and everyone has settled in from the transition in personnel.

In addition to the routine functions performed by the department, the focus in the month of May has been on the evaluation and selection of a Financial and Utility Billing system. The evaluation was extensive and recommendation was made to the City Manager and City Council to approve the purchase of the products offered by Caselle, Inc. City Council approved the recommendation and the contract with Caselle was negotiated. System implementation will begin in August/September and will result in participation by all members of the Finance staff over the subsequent three-four months.

The time for renewal of business license is drawing near and we were faced with a Business Licensing system that could not perform the needed renewal process without significant investment of resources. With the decision to purchase the Caselle Financial and Utility Billing systems, we made inquiry regarding the Business License product they offer. The City of Brookings has agreed to serve as a beta site for Caselle and their Windows based Business License system. As compensation for functioning as their beta (test) site, we did not have to pay for the software. Staff is in the process of entering the Business License data (800-1000) records into the new system in preparation for the renewal billing in June of 1999.

The financial reports for the month of April were completed and distributed to all department heads and the City Manager.

The City Council meeting on May 24 was the forum for the public hearing on the 1999/2000 budget and proposed uses of state revenue sharing dollars. There were no comments from the audience. The formal resolution adopting the 1999/2000 budget will be presented in June.

We are very pleased with the decision to recognize Hilary Thompson as employee of the season. Hilary contributes a great deal to the department and deserves the recognition by management and City Council.

#### BACKGROUND:

The City Council, at their July 13, 1998 meeting, allowed a narrower roadway and sidewalk cross section to be built to preserve trees.


One tree would be removed at the intersection of Lundeen Lane and Old County Road. The health of the tree and the fact that the root system would be disturbed during construction makes it necessary to remove the tree.

In preparing to pave the street Coos-Curry Electric is willing to do some undergrounding of their lines, removing some poles and, through the changes, make the installation of a street light at the northeast corner of the intersection.

To do the undergrounding Coos-Curry needs to install a transformer. The transformer would be above ground and is approximately 5 feet by 5 feet by 5 feet in height. Coos-Curry Electric is agreeable to screen the transformer with plants to help blend the transformer into the park.

## RECOMMENDATION:

The City Council give permission for Coos-Curry Electric to construct a transformer that is approximately 5 feet by 5 feet by 5 feet in height near the intersection of Lundeen Lane and Old County Road.

Recommendation: The City Council establish the road width of 20 feet with no parking for the first 500 feet beginning at the intersection with Old County Road with the

improvement along the northerly portion of the right-of-way.

Rationale:

The city wishes to preserve the Kidtown improvements and to maintain a buffer between the street improvements and Kidtown and

to preserve the existing trees.

**Background:** 

The street improvement required by the development by Shelter Resources, Inc. on Lundeen Lane would require removal of several trees and would, when the street is completed, put the improvements within less than five feet of Kidtown (see attached drawings). Drawing A shows full street; Drawing B shows 20 feet travel lanes with no parking either side of the street

When reviewing the improvements staff looked for options to allow a buffering area and a means to keep from removing any more trees than necessary.

In Section 80.040.F, the Land Development Code gives the authority to determine the needed improvements in the Public Open Space Zone to the City Council with input from the Site Plan Committee. Azalea Park is Public Open Space, therefore the Council has authority on the south side of the street to specify improvements. In as much as the north side of Lundeen Lane has to be built to accommodate the improvements on the other side of the street, the city in fact is able to determine the road width on the north side of the project.

Staff met with the developer's representatives and they did not want to negatively impact Kidtown or the park and were willing to work with the city to find an acceptable solution to the problem. The developer is providing parking for their development on their site, therefore they are not concerned about not having parking on the street.

The Park and Recreation Commission met and supports the idea of preserving the trees and buffer area between the improvements and the park area.
