<u>Issue:</u> <u>Permission to serve alcohol on City property - golf Course</u>

Background: 1) Please see attached letter.

- 2) It is the policy of the City that alcohol can be served legally on City property, only with the Council's permission.
- 3) The Claveran's are required to obtain liquor liability insurance.
- 4) I have talked with the Claveran's insurance agent and they have made arrangements to purchase the necessary insurance.

Recommendations: Authorize Claveran's to sell alcohol on City owned golf course property as long as they provide liquor liability insurance with the named City as additional insured.

Mayor Bob Hagbom called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

III. ROLL CALL

Council Present: Mayor Bob Hagbom, Councilors Larry Curry, Keith Pepper, Frances Johns, George Ciapusci, and Ex-Officio Councilor Cindi Peterson, a quorum present.

Staff Present: Finance Director/Recorder Gail Hedding and Community Development Department Secretary Linda Barker

IV. CEREMONIES/APPOINTMENTS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

A. Appointment of Census 2000 Complete Count Committee
Finance Director Hedding spoke of the need to establish a committee to
insure an accurate count for the year 2000 census. Special targeted areas
to establish accurate counts are of the homeless, migratory workers and
students. These groups may have been undercounted in the 1990 census.
Census officials are also stating that the year 2000 census may be the last
physical count taken. Computer statistics may be used after that to figure
population.

M:\Sharon\Minutes.99\10-25-99.cc.wpd Councilor Ciapusci moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to appoint Sandy Hislop, Dan McKee, Rev. Gordon Myrah and one or two students from the high school leadership class to work with the Mayor and City Manager to insure a complete and accurate Census 2000 count.

VI. SCHEDULED PUBLIC APPEARANCES

A. Request to sell alcohol on City property - Salmon Run Golf and Wilderness Preserve

Finance Director Hedding presented a letter from the Claveran Group requesting permission to serve alcoholic beverages at the golf course which is located on city property. According to Chuck Hayward, the Oregon Liquor Control Commission has issued a license to the golf course operators. This approval was handled through Curry County. Larry Aslinger, 439 Buena Vista, addressed the Council regarding the city's liability in allowing alcohol to be served on its premises. Councilor Ciapusci stated he felt confident that the city could be insured on the golf course's alcohol policy and that there was no urgency in this matter since the course was not yet open. Mayor Hagbom proposed and it was agreed upon by the Council, to postpone this decision until the next meeting to allow time for the city attorney to address this matter.

VII. ORAL REOUESTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE

- A. Committee and Liaison reports
 - 1. Chamber of Commerce
 None
 - 2. Businesses for a Better Brookings
 Augie Kofoet reported Businesses for a Better Brookings will be
 working with the Chamber of Commerce to restring the Christmas
 decorations. All existing decorations will be restrung by
 December, 2000.
 - 3. Port of Brookings-Harbor
 Councilor Ciapusci said Port Commissioner Ken Byrtus is on a
 two month trip. Ed Gray will attend Council meetings in his place
 whenever possible. The Port's major efforts are restoration of port

facilities. They are currently in the eighth month of an eighteen month project. The Port has been successful in obtaining a bid from Bellingham Marine for a concrete float for Basin #1 that is for less than the Port could do the work.

4. Council Liaisons

Councilor Johns toured Pelican Bay Prison and prison officials are prepared for Y2K. While cell door locks at the prison are not computer operated, and no problems are forseen, all watch towers will be staffed on December 31. In the prison employees bulletin for September the name of the first recipient of the C. David Ham Scholarship was announced. Tom Hoffer, prison resource officer, is retiring and will be honored at a roast December 10. The prison and its populace are very active in the Kiwanis "Coats for Kids" program. Coats are collected by the Kiwanis and cleaned by the prisoners using prison dry cleaning facilities before they are distributed to children in need of a good winter coat.

Councilor Ciapusci stated the Port of Brookings-Harbor is looking for an appointee to its budget committee.

Councilor Curry placed a copy of a report from ODOT on highway access management in each of the Councilors' mailboxes. He attended a CPACT meeting in Florence, October 14 where new CPACT operating principals and procedures were discussed.

B. Unscheduled

Tom Herrod, 1089 Parkview Drive, spoke to the Council about his concerns that the contract the city has with the Chamber of Commerce may be in violation with ORS 279. As Mr. Herrod would not submit his questions in writing, his questions will be pulled from the minutes and presented to the city attorney for consideration.

Lee Tenner, 1235 Moore Street, inquired about the requirements for curbs and sidewalks at new construction. He was told by workmen at a new commercial building on a lot at the corner of Wharf and Spruce streets that they were not putting in curbs and sidewalks. This matter will be brought before city staff.

Don Nuss, 808 Pioneer Road, discussed his concerns with inconsistencies with the Chamber of Commerce contract and purchasing done by the Chamber.

VIII. STAFF REPORTS

Councilor Pepper, Councilor Ciapusci seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to adopt a policy that states the City of Brookings will not accept E-mail as evidence in legislative and quasi judicial hearings before the Brookings Common Council, Planning Commission or any other committee.

2. Request from Vietnam Veterans to extend flags on US 101
Finance Director Hedding presented a request from the Vietnam
Veterans of America, Brookings-Harbor Chapter 757, to use the
City's concrete core drill, to drill holes in the concrete sidewalks.

Councilor Pepper moved, Councilor Johns seconded, and the Council voted unanimously to approve the expansion of the area for the drilling of holes for placement of the American Flag on the specific dates approved earlier, from Center Street northwesterly on Highway 101 and authorize staff to work with Vietnam Veterans of American Chapter 757.

- B. Police
 - 1. Safety City Video

Brookings Police Officer Barbara Palicki presented a short video on Safety City. This video was prepared by Christina Wood, daughter of Marilyn Wood, Brookings Police Reserve, and the Media Department at the University of Arizona where Christina is a student. The video highlighted the classes given to kindergartners in Brookings and will be used to promote the idea to other cities. Safety City helps children learn and understand good safety habits.

XI. REMARKS FROM MAYOR AND COUNCILORS

A. Mayor

Mayor Hagbom reminded the Councilors and audience of the Public Facilities and Services Plan meeting set for Tuesday, October 26 at 7:00 p.m. He stated this is a hearing about getting public services out into the new areas created by the Urban Growth Boundary and not a hearing about the boundary itself. The boundary has been approved by the state agencies and courts and is set in size. This issue will not be discussed at Tuesday's meeting.

He also said the golf course will be announcing its opening in a couple of weeks.

Any Councilor interested in attending the Marine Corps Birthday Ball to be held November 6 needs to contact Sharon Ridens tomorrow. Councilors will pay their own expenses as this is not a city-reimbursed function.

Mayor Hagbom also stated that volunteers are needed for committees on the South Coast Development Council and the OCZMA Workforce Investment Board.

B. Council

Councilor Johns invited all in attendance at the meeting to lunch at the Chetco Senior, October 26 to celebrate the Center's tenth anniversary.

Preparations for the Holiday Light Festival are underway. Councilor Pepper reported there were 10,000 visitors to the show at Azalea Park last year and with a new section, Animal Encounters, being added to the display, more visitors are expected this year. Hilary Thompson is coordinating the volunteers. Volunteering groups are reimbursed for their efforts. Last year the city's employees time reimbursement was donated to "Safety City."

After the Councilors had made remarks, Larry Aslinger again addressed them. He announced the Shriners will be holding a clinic November 6 at Curry General Hospital. All children under the age of 18 needing medical assistance are eligible to be seen at this clinic. All assistance is offered free of charge to participants.

MESSAGES AND PAPERS FROM THE MAYOR

Council Liaison George Ciapusci brought a message from Mayor Hagbom regarding the last meeting of the Public Facilities and Services Plan (August 31, 1999) which answered questions as to why the meeting was opened and immediately recessed to October 26, 1999 without taking any public testimony. The city had received word from LCDC just the Thursday before the August meeting questioning the inclusion of the area west of Oceanview Drive, Harbor, in the Urban Growth Boundary. Until this is resolved the city can not proceed with the Public Facilities and Services Plan since inclusion or exclusion of these lands will have a direct bearing on the Public Facilities and Services Plan and the status of the Urban Growth Boundary as a whole. Public testimony will be

taken at the joint Planning Commission/City Council meeting, October 26. The final decision on the Public Facilities and Services Plan will be made after consideration of these public comments.

Councilor Ciapusci introduced a copy of a flyer called "Hot Buttons" into the record with comments.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING DIRECTOR

- 1. Director Bischoff and Commissioner Krebs summarized the October 4 joint meeting of the City Council and the School District 17C Board, regarding the Deferred Improvement Agreements (DIA). The School Board asked for relief from the conditions of the DIA so money could go to the schools and they also asked for the closure of Easy Street between Pioneer Road and Fern Street. The Council replied that the street improvements need to be done for the safety of the children and that as Easy Street is a primary through-street it could not be closed. Other topics discussed were the school district's summer school program and the city's afternoon recreation program, school use of the city pool and the covering of the pool.
- 2. The next meeting of the Planning Commission is November 2 which is election day. As this is a mail-in election the election department has stated they will have a collection box in the Council Chambers, City Hall that day. They have agreed to move the collection box into the hallway at 6:30 p.m. so the Planning Commission will be held as scheduled.

PROPOSITIONS AND REMARKS FROM COMMISSION MEMBERS

- 1. Commissioner Krebs related that the Tower Ordinance (LDC-5-99) was passed by the City Council at their September 27 meeting. The final approval had a modification from the Planning Commission recommendation, changing the word stealth "capabilities" to stealth "characteristics" and also to allow for the construction of a lattice-type tower.
- 2. Commissioner Smith asked whether the October 26 joint meeting would be advertised. He was assured that there would be a press release to the media about the meeting.
- 3. Chair Lindsey commented on the hedge at the corner of Heather Lane and Chetco Avenue which inhibits a clear view of oncoming traffic. This will be turned over to our Public Works Division. Commissioner Nuss said there is a similar problem at Ransom Avenue and Pioneer Road.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business before the Planning Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
