Earlier this year, a diverse group of eight Curry County residents under the partial sponsorship of the Curry County Tourism Project spent an intense two weeks in Belize learning the parameters of a sustainable nature tourism economy.

On March 18, 1997, at the Chetco Community Public Library, this group will report to the Curry County Commissioners and the people of Curry County. Issue: Awarding bid on public works pickup truck

Synopsis: The 1996-1997 budget includes \$17,100 for a pickup truck for the Public Works Division. The cost of the truck is divided evenly

between the Streets, Water Distribution and Wastewater Collection Divisions. A Request for Bids was advertised in the Curry Coastal

Pilot and bids were opened March 4, 1997.

The low bid of \$15,668.92 is \$195.69 higher than the amount paid in 1996 for the last pickup truck purchased by the City for the Public

Works Department.

Special Cities Allotment - Oak Street Project

Dear Council Members, Mayor, and City Manager:

As of January 1, 1997 the US CPI had a 3.3% increase during 1996, This is the rate adjustment authorized by our Solid Waste Disposal contract (Sec. 7) with the city. CTR, in our continuing efforts to stabilize rates has elected to ask for only 85% of the CPI increase. This represents only an .89% increase from July of 1994.

Establishment of bank account

Issue:

Establishment of a Money Market bank account to hold and disburse funds not to exceed \$50,000 for the Narcotic Investigator's use in the course of his duties.

Synopsis:

During the course of some investigative situations, the Narcotic Investigator has need for immediate funds with minimal people involvement, for the sake of the investigation and the safety of those involved. To meet this need, the Investigator and I consulted with the City auditor the procedure to provide the funds within the guidelines of State and local statutes. The auditor recommended setting up a separate account in accordance with ORS 294.035; and for the Council to authorize the Narcotic Investigator and one signatory from the City administration.

This Money Market account will be at the Brookings branch of U.S. Bank, along with the other accounts of the city, and will be reconciled and handled according to State and local law.

#### Recommendation

That Council authorize the establishment of a Money Market account not to exceed \$50,000 at any one time for the holding and disbursement of funds for the Brookings Narcotic Investigator's use in the performance of duty; and that in addition to the Investigator's signature on the account, the City Manager or Finance Director/Recorder must also sign to disburse funds.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 97-R-614

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MONEY MARKET ACCOUNT FOR THE HOLDING AND DISBURSING OF FUNDS FOR THE CITY OF BROOKINGS NARCOTICS INVESTIGATOR'S USE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF DUTY.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funds to be held in this account shall not exceed \$50,000 at any one time; and, that in addition to the signature of the Narcotics Investigator, one signature is required from the City Manager or Finance Director/Recorder to disburse funds.

Issue:

Application for Special City Allotment Program Grant: Oak Street

Project

Synopsis:

The City of Brookings meets the criteria for the Special City Allotment Program, and Oak Street meets the criteria for a street improvement project. The Council needs to pass a resolution and forward the resolution as well as the application to the Oregon Department of Transportation so it is received by them before July 1,

1996.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the City Council selects the Oak Street Project for the Special City Allotment Grant for \$25,000 and authorizes the Mayor and City Manager to sign the necessary documents for the

application.

Rationale:

The Oak Street Project seems the best project in as much as it meets the state requirements for this grant. Not only does it take care of the wear and deterioration of the street driving surface but it addresses a collapsing storm water piping system and installation of sidewalk in a congested area where there exists substantial pedestrian traffic.

Background:

The State of Oregon makes funds available for street projects to cities of less than 5,000 population based on the latest federal census, for streets that are inadequate for capacity or the condition of the street. Due to limited funds the practice has been to allot no more than one project per year per city. See attached guidelines and working agreement the time distance.
