

Azalea Park Holiday Lighting Display

Mission: To provide a holiday attraction for the community, to raise money for City Park

maintenance and to involve local youths in the project.

Focus: To provide a holiday lighting display with an emphasis on lighted 3 dimensional


sculpture which is realistic and indigenous to the Northwest. (For example-whale,

otter, owl, elk, deer, bear, cougar, salmon, starfish, pelican)

Location: Azalea Park Gardens. See attached.

PRELIMINARY DETAILS:

- Open for 9 days covering 2 weekends in December, possibly the 19th-28th.
- ► A fee will be charged likely \$1-2.
- ► Electricity- 200A available at the stage, also power pole @Kidtown and lower parking lot.
- Security- likely small motor home parked at entrance after closing, with 24 hour surveillance.
- Community involvement- once concept approved and design finalized, presentations to numerous community organizations to elicit volunteer hours and or financial contributions. (Example: \$5 to light a plant, \$25 to light an azalea...)
- Youth involvement: Contacting the schools, youth groups, church organizations for involvement, such as:
 - Contest to develop sculpture designs.
 - Materials provided to school for construction of sculpture(s).
 - Youth organizations to provide entertainment, sell cookies, cider etc. to raise funds for their group(s).
 - Youth to assist with installation, removal, afternoon and evening security.
- Plant safety- lights will be laid on plants, not wrapped.

Background:



<u>Issue:</u> Wastewater improvements project - local payment plan

Synopsis: Council needs to adopt a plan to pay for this \$13.1 million project

Recommendation:

1. Council adopt Resolution No. 97-R-619 (attached) increasing wastewater system development charge as shown in that resolution effective September 1, 1997.

2. Council adopt Resolution No. 97-R-620 (attached) increasing monthly sewer user fees as shown in that resolution, effective September 1, 1997.

We <u>are</u> going to make major improvements to our wastewater facilities! DEQ has made that quite clear. The citizens of Brookings and Harbor will be the primary users of these improvements, thus it follows they will be the ones to pay for these improvements.

 We need to adopt a plan to show people - Brookings voters as well as DEQ - how we will finance these improvements.

 The rates shown in the 2 recommended resolutions are those developed by the City's wastewater engineering firm's Chief Economist and are projected to pay for this project during the term of the loan. We need to make these improvements.

3. The recommended rates are those selected by the Council June 23rd as your "preferred" choices for a single family residence. Monthly sewer user fees would increase \$5.76, going from \$22.04 to \$27.80. This includes the \$2.50 monthly sewer replacement fund charge. Wastewater system development charges for a new single family residence would increase \$1,622, going from \$1,378 to \$3,000.

- 4. Making these new rates effective September 1st gives our Finance Department time to make the rate changes in their computer utility software program and test run the new rates before sending the bills out.
- These rates are based upon our receiving a DEQ state revolving fund loan at a very low interest rate. If we do not receive this loan, these rates will need to be revised up.
- 6. Resolution No. 97-R-620 also includes an increase in our returned check charge of \$15.00 to cover our costs of handling these checks and is in line with what many other companies charge.

I spoke with Marv Weiner today. The sewer SDC amount for the last three blank spaces on the chart attached to Resolution No. 97-R-619 in your packet should be as shown on the attached revised chart. These dollars are based on the Council's "preferred" choice on financing this project. To determine these amounts, we look at the "Report on Systems Development Charges" July 1991 by HGE Inc., page 7-21. The chart on this page uses a single family unit as one EDU and as the base for figuring other types of development's appropriate EDU count. The other numbers are based on their impact on our sewer system compared to a single family residence. A multiple family unit counts as 0.80 of 1 EDU, a restaurant with less than 25 seats as 4.00 EDU's, a restaurant with between 25 and 50 seats as 5.00 EDU's and an office/small commercial as 3.00 EDU's. To determine the correct amount for each type, multiply the base EDU by the appropriate number.

Issue:

Deed for land around the Mill Beach sanitary sewer pump station.

Synopsis:

The city has received a deed for a 1,775 sq. ft. area around the pump station.

Recommendation:

Acceptance of the deed.

Rationale:

The city would own the land around the pump station in fee rather than by

easement.

Background:

As a condition of approval for a minor partition of a portion of their property located around the pump station, South Coast Lumber Co. was required to deed the land in fee to the city. Prior to the minor partition the area was occupied by easement only. This deed will give the city full ownership of the pump station land, including sufficient land to park a truck or operate

equipment.



Coos Curry Electric is rebuilding their power grid in or adjacent to the downtown area. In order to upsize the power line on Hemlock Street they need a site for the guy wires at the intersection of Hemlock and

Wharf Streets.

Recommendation:

The City Council authorize the Mayor to sign the easement agreement with Coos Curry Electric to place a pole with an anchor and guy wires

on Assessor's Map 41-13-6DD Tax Lot 400.

Rationale:

Coos Curry Electric needs to upgrade their system to maintain and

provide additional service to handle growth.

Background:

Coos Curry Electric is rebuilding their power grid in the downtown and adjacent areas including rebuilding their line on Hemlock Street. The uncertainty of locating the poles in a permanent site on Railroad Street due to the couplet planned for the Railroad Street alignment makes it more appealing to place poles on Hemlock Street.

Coos Curry Electric is asking the city to provide an area on city property to guy the pole that will be placed at the intersection of Hemlock and Wharf Street. The angle necessary for the guy wires and anchors cause intrusion into the city-owned lot by 30 feet, at an angle that takes up an area essentially 30 feet by 30 feet. City staff has looked at the project with Coos Curry staff for alternate locations and there isn't an acceptable alternate site. The city, as it grows, needs to encourage the other utilities to upgrade their systems to accommodate growth. Therefore staff is recommending approval of the easement

Gentlemen:

Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative, Inc.(CCEC) is planning to upgrade power lines within the City of Brookings.


