Issue:

Changes to Ordinance 115, Temporary Uses of A Recreational Vehicle

Synopsis:

Attached is a copy of the ordinance with suggested wording changes to allow for the use of an RV in a medical hardship. When we amended the ordinance in June, we left in a lot of definitions that were no longer pertinent to the new ordinance, so I am recommending changes there also. If the Council decides to proceed with an amendment to the ordinance, staff is recommending that a new ordinance number be assigned to this ordinance and Ordinance 115 be deleted in its entirety

As to the issue of the proposed use, staff is recommending against amending the ordinance to allow the use for the following reasons:

- 1. Enforcement. Although the city may obtain written agreement to vacate the use once the medical reason is no longer needed, enforcement of this requirement can be difficult. It is already difficult to find, document and cite those who are currently living illegally in RV within the city. If the city is never informed of when there is no longer a need for the permitted use of an RV for a residence, the situation is exasperated. In some situations the subject RV will be located in such a manner that it is not visible from the street and thus it is not possible to determine if the unit has been connected to water and/or sewer service.
- Unsightly. There is no way to police the appearance of the RV unit nor
 where on the property it will be placed. In some cases it may not be
 possible to place the unit beside or in the rear of the care receiver's
 property.
- 3. There is the chance that the care receiver will end up in the RV unit and the caregiver living in the primary residence.
- To change the ordinance for this reason will tend to set a president to change it again for some other seemingly valid reason.
- 5. Home care is already available through existing home health care businesses in the area.

ORDINANCE NO. 58-O-115

ORDINANCE NO. 58-O-115, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE TEMPORARY USE OF A TRAILER-COACH RECREATIONAL VEHICLE WITHIN THE CITY OF BROOKINGS"

Sections:

Section 1. Conformance to city ordinances.

Section 2. Definitions.

Section 3. Temporary uses.

Section 4. Violations.

Section 5. Penalties.

Section 6. Severability clause.

Section 7. Repeal of Ordinance No. 52-O-018.

The city of Brookings ordains as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Conformance to city ordinances. All auto and trailer parks within the city of Brookings shall conform to the electrical, fire, health, building, and plumbing ordinances of the city of Brookings, as amended, except as hereinafter specified.

Section 2. <u>Definitions.</u> For the purposes of this ordinance, certain words and phrases are defined as follows, and certain provisions shall be construed as herein set forth, unless it shall be apparent from the context that they have a different meaning. Words used in the singular include the plural, and the plural the singular. Words used in the present tense include the future.

- A. (1) "Trailer-coach" "Recreational vehicle" means any camp-car, trailer, camper or other vehicles, with or without motive power, designed and constructed to travel on the public thoroughfares at the maximum allowable speed limit, and in accordance with the provisions of the Oregon vehicle code, and designed or used for human habitation. "Trailer" also means "trailer coach."
 - (2) A dependent trailer coach recreational vehicle is one not equipped with a toilet for sewage disposal facilities.
 - (3) An independent trailer-coach recreational vehicle is one equipped with a-toilet for sewage disposal facilities.

B. "Auto and trailer park" "Recreational vehicle park" means any area or tract of land where space is occupied or rented or held out for rent to one or more users or owners of trailer coaches, or where free parking is permitted

owners or users of trailer coaches for the purpose of securing their trade. Wherever the term "trailer park" is used in this ordinance, it shall mean "auto and trailer park."

- C. "Trailer site" means any portion of an auto and trailer recreational vehicle park designed for the use of [or] occupancy of one recreational vehicle.
- DC. "Approved," when used in connection with any material, appliance or construction, means meeting the requirements of the building code of the city of Brookings.
- E. "Building" means public toilets, public baths, laundry rooms or other structures and includes a compartment containing a toilet or bath, or both, constructed for the exclusive use of an occupant of a trailer site.
- F. "Liquefied petroleum gas" means petroleum hydrocarbons or mixtures thereof, in liquid or gaseous state, having a vapor pressure in excess of 26 psi at a temperature of 100°F. Whenever the symbol "LPG" is used, it shall mean liquefied petroleum gas.
 - G. In an auto trailer park, "nuisance" includes any of the following:
 - 1. Any nuisance known at common law.
 - 2. Whatever is dangerous to human life or is detrimental to health.
 - 3. Overcrowding of any trailer with occupants.
 - 4. Insufficient ventilation or illumination of any room or trailer.
 - 5. Inadequate or unsanitary sewage or plumbing facilities.
 - 6. Whatever renders air, food or drink unwholesome or detrimental to the health of human beings.
- Section 3. Temporary uses. It is unlawful to use a trailer coach for living purposes within the City of Brookings except when parked within a licensed trailer park. A trailer coach may be used for temporary sleeping purposes within the City of Brookings There are two circumstances under which the temporary use of a recreational vehicle for living purposes may be allowed provided as follows:
 - A. Temporary Sleeping Purposes. A recreational vehicle may be used as for temporary sleeping purposes provided as follows:

- 1. That the trailer coach vehicle is located entirely on private property;
- 2. That no connection may be made to the City's water or sewer system; and
- 3. That the period of use shall not exceed seven (7) days out of any calendar year.

[Section 3 as renumbered by Ordinance No. 97-O-115.B, effective March 12, 1997]

- B. Temporary Medical Hardship Occupancy. A recreational vehicle may be used as a temporary residence when it can be demonstrated that the use is necessary to provide medical assistance to an occupant of the primary residence on the property, provide as follows:
 - 1. The applicant provides evidence to the City Manager that there is necessary for medical purposes;
 - 2. The applicant provides evidence that living accommodations in the primary residence for the caregiver is not feasible or practical;
 - 3. That the vehicle is located entirely on private property;
 - 4. If the living accommodation is a camper, it shall be at all times attached to the associated vehicle.
 - 5. That no connection may be made to the City's water or sewer system;
 - 6 Alternate. The recreational vehicle may be connected to the City's water and sewer system upon the payment of a non-returnable System Development Charges (amount to be determined);
 - 7. The use of a recreational vehicle for this purpose shall be limited to a 90 day period, renewable for one additional 90 day period.
 - 8. The applicant shall sign and have notarize a letter of agreement providing that the city will be notified once the need for the caregiver residence ceases and that the recreational vehicle shall be removed from the property or its use as a residence and connections to the water and sewer systems be terminated within 30 days after the reason for the medical assistance is no longer required.

<u>Section 4. Violations.</u> It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation owning or operating a trailer park occupying a recreational vehicle

under the provisions of Section 3 above in the city of Brookings to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation owning, maintaining, or in control of any trailer recreational vehicle, or the occupant or tenant of any trailer recreational vehicle in whatever capacity, to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance. [Section 4 as renumbered by Ordinance No. 97-O-115.B, effective March 12, 1997]

Section 5. Penalties. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, or disregarding any lawful order of the enforcement agencies or findings of the City Council with respect to said trailer park recreational vehicle under the provisions of this ordinance or contributing in any way to the violation of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof may be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00, or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Every person, firm, or corporation violating or contributing in any way to the violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each day during which such violation continues, and may be punishable therefor as herein provided. [Section 5 as renumbered by Ordinance No. 97-O-115.B, effective March 12, 1997]

<u>Section 6.</u> [Severability clause.] [Section 6 as renumbered by Ordinance No. 97-O-115.B, effective March 12, 1997]

<u>Section 7.</u> Repeal of Ordinance No. 52-O-018. Ordinance No. 52-O-018 of the city of Brookings, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed. [Section 7 as renumbered by Ordinance No. 97-O-115.B, effective March 12, 1997]

George Ciapusci, liaison for Nature Based Tourism, referred to an October 25, 1997 Oregonian newspaper article that he felt did not appropriately portray what Nature Based Tourism is about.

Joe Oxendine, a resident of Brookings, asked the Council to expedite a decision to begin the development of Jack Creek golf course.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING DIRECTOR

As follow up to items mentioned at the August 5, 1997 Planning Commission meeting Planning Director Bischoff reported:

- Staff contacted Mrs. Musser of School District 17-C and gave approval for the District to place temporary caution signs in the street at the major intersections if the District desired to do so.
- Street repairs are done on the availability of asphalt as the city cannot buy and store
 asphalt. When it becomes available, for cost reasons, the city cannot buy just enough
 for one street patch. Therefore some street cuts must wait until there is sufficient
 need for asphalt.
- 3. Boomerangs and the Thrift Shoppe have been personally contacted regarding their low-hanging signs. Boomerangs had responded the sign would be in compliance after

painting of the building was completed. Since no building painting has been done staff sent a letter asking the sign be raised to the required height. An employee of the Thrift Shoppe was asked to have the owner contact the city. No contact was made by the owner so they also have received a letter asking for removal of the sign.

4. A letter requesting removal of a RV Parking sign has been sent to the property owner

on Memory Lane.

5. In response to questions about boats on display in front of Lorings Lighthouse Sales further research is being done on the issue of displaying merchandise on city sidewalks.

6. The curb to curb distance of Pacific Avenue at its intersection with Railroad Street is built to a standard 50 feet. It is the intersection of Pacific Avenue at Highway 101 that is oversized (new construction replaced existing curbs). When the intervening section of Pacific is constructed the sidewalks will be blended together. Staff will look at striping on the south end of Pacific to see if it is in the correct position.

PROPOSITIONS AND REMARKS FROM COMMISSION MEMBERS

After the County Referral was heard the Planning Commission voted 6-0 (motion: Commissioner Krebs, second: Commissioner Lindsey) to direct staff to contact the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) regarding ODOT's plans for improvements to Highway 101, specifically Highway 101 from Easy Street to Carpenterville Road and to relate concerns expressed by both the public and Commissioners at tonight's Planning Commission meeting and at the meeting regarding the Nazarene Church.

Commissioner Krebs asked about the request for additional law enforcement at the schools during hours when the children are arriving and leaving. Staff will make this recommendation to the City Council.

Commissioner Breuer asked about the sign above Matt's Grocery. It has been replaced by a new sign leading Commissioners to believe the business is not closing. A new sign has also appeared for a pawn shop business in the same business center. Commissioner Pepper asked for clarification on signs and the distance they are allowed to extend from a building. He suggested a citizen's task force to assist staff in the sign enforcement area.

The minutes of the July 28, 1997 joint meeting with the City Council have been distributed to Council members and the public, however the Planning Commission has not received copies of these minutes. The Planning Commission secretary will mail these minutes to the Commissioners.
