Mayor Kerr announced that he had attended a meeting of the Local Officials Advisory Committee which is an advisory committee to L.C.D.C., and gave the Council a brief overview of the meeting.

B. Water Situation

Mayor Kerr asked City Manager Roy Rainey to brief the Council on the water problem. Mr. Rainey explained that due to low river flows and high tides, the City is experiencing a problem with an infusion of sea water in the City water. Leo Lightle, Engineering Technician, explained that the staff is working on the problem and progress is being made to correct the problem. Mr. Lightle explained that the Department of Health has determined that there is no health hazard involved, but persons who are on low sodium diets should drink bottled water.

Mr. Bill Cunningham, 325 Mill Beach Road, read a statement into the record (a copy is attached to these minutes).

A brief discussion followed and the consensus of the Council was to direct staff to pursue a Water Study for the City of Brookings.
