Mayor Kerr called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

IV. CEREMONIES/APPOINTMENTS

Mayor Kerr welcomed Judy Pectol, newly appointed Recorder/Treasurer.

A. Mayor Kerr requested approval from the Council for the appointment of Jim Izett to the Planning Commission.

Councilman Geraghty made a MOTION, seconded by Councilman Nidiffer, to appoint Jim Izett to the Brookings Planning Commission; MOTION carried unanimously.

V. MINUTES FOR APPROVAL/ACCEPTANCE

- A. Approval of Council Meeting Minutes
 - 1. December 11, 1984 Regular Council Meeting Minutes

Councilman Nidiffer made a MOTION, seconded by Vice Mayor Batty, to approve the December 11, 1984 Regular Council Meeting minutes; MOTION carried unanimously.

B. Acceptance of Planning Commission Meeting Minutes

Councilman Geraghty made a MOTION, seconded by Councilman Nidiffer, to accept the minutes of the December 4, 1984 Planning Commission Meeting; MOTION carried unanimously.

VI. SCHEDULED PUBLIC APPEARANCES

A. Liquor License Request - The Tea Room

Mr. Stuart advised the Council that this is a change of ownership and that there is an existing liquor license at the Tea Room in the name of the former owner. Mr. Stuart indicated that both the Police Department and the Planning Department have reviewed this request and both departments recommend approval of the liquor license.

Mayor Kerr asked for public comment and there being none, Vice Mayor Batty made a MOTION, seconded by Councilman Rogers, to approve the liquor license application request for the Tea Room; MOTION carried unanimously.

VII. COMMUNICATIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

A. Mayor Announcements

Mayor Kerr reviewed the progress of the Council and the community during the year of 1984.

Mayor Kerr previewed some of the priority projects which the City will be working on in 1985. Mr. Rhodaback previewed a work schedule for the Planning Commission in 1985.

C. Manager Announcements

1. Storm Water Study Proposals

Mr. Stuart indicated that at the November, 1984 Council meeting, staff requested authority to call for proposals for a storm water study. Mr. Stuart then advised the Council that the following four (4) proposals had been received:

- (1) Marquess and Associates
- (2) Gary Dyer
- (3) CH₂M Hill
- (4) H.G.E.

Mr. Stuart indicated that staff recommended that the H.G.E. Alternative Number 3, at a cost not to exceed \$10,995, be accepted.

Councilman Rogers expressed his support of staff recommendations and made a MOTION, seconded by Councilman Nidiffer, that the H.G.E. Alternative Number 3 proposal be accepted for the storm water study; MOTION carried unanimously.

2. Findings of Fact Document - Bernice Abbott

Mr. Stuart indicated that this document is the finding of fact document which will complete the decision making process in a Minor Partition Request, which the Council took action to deny at the December, 1984 Council Meeting.

Vice Mayor Batty made a MOTION, seconded by Councilman Geraghty, to adopt the Findings of Fact Document; MOTION carried unanimously.

3. Chamber of Commerce Report

Mr. George King, Chamber of Commerce Manager, announced that during the month of December, 1984, 3 new members joined the Chamber of Commerce, 122 visitors registered at the Chamber of Commerce Office, and 55 written inquiries were answered. Mr. King also announced that President Mike Rue has resigned and left the Brookings area, and Molly Bonser is the new President of the Chamber of Commerce. Ed Roszel, Dorothy Deck, Norma Fitzgerald and Jay Pilant have been elected to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors.

VII. COMMUNICATIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

D. Attorney Announcements

City Attorney Coutrakon announced that the Land Use Board of Appeals has made a decision on the rezoning appeal which was filed by Mr. Fred Hummel. Mr. Coutrakon explained that L.U.B.A. had remanded the matter back to the City to issue findings on certain rezones, but had upheld the City's actions on all substantive and procedural points.

After some discussion by the Council concerning possible alternatives in the matter, Vice Mayor Batty made a MOTION that Council direct staff to take the issue back that has been remanded, to review it and prepare recommendations for establishment of procedures by the Council and Planning Commission. Councilman Rogers seconded the MOTION; MOTION carried unanimously.

Mr. Coutrakon also announced that during the next month, he will be researching the laws pertaining to medical bibls about which are incurred during the time a person is in custody.

VIII. CALL FOR BIDS

A. Sale of Surplus Equipment

Mr. Stuart explained to the Council that the Fire Department has as surplus equipment, one Cornelius High Pressure Air Compressor. The use of this piece of equipment has been discontinued and staff requests the authority to call for bids on this piece of equipment.

Mayor Kerr asked if a minimum bid had been established, and Fire Chief Tom Kerr advised that he is working on that at this time. Mr. Stuart indicated that if the Council approved the call for bids, a minimum bid would be established before any public notices were posted.

Councilman Geraghty made a MOTION, seconded by Vice Mayor Batty, to authorize the City Manager to call for bids on the surplus equipment, with a minimum bid; MOTION carried unanimously.

Mr. Stuart indicated that the bids will be opened at 10:00 a.m., Friday, February 8, 1985, and the bids will be reviewed by Council at the February 12, 1985 Council meeting.

IX. REPORT ON BIDS

A. Mr. Stuart advised the Council that at 10:00 a.m., Friday, January 4, 1985, bids were opened for the purchase of a patrol vehicle for the police department. The following bids were received:
