MOTION was made by Councilman Leeds, seconded by Councilman Lockman and carried unimously that the minutes of January 10 and 18, 1978 be approved as presented.

MONTHLY REPORTS

LEGISLATIVE ACTION:

1. ACTION OF COUNCIL CONCERNING THE ENGINEERING ON THE DISTRICT 5 SEWER PROJECT (MARQUESS & ASSOCIATES)

Council inquired from Cliff Shaw, Engineer, as to the approximate cost to do preliminary engineering for cost factor of this improvement district, and was advised that it would be approximately \$2,000.

MOTION was made by Councilman Leeds, seconded by Councilman Lockman and carried unimously that Marquess & Associates proceed with the preliminary engineering for District 5 Sewer Project, with the stipulation that the City Attorney first advise on the financing.

2. ENGINEERING WITH H.G.E., INC. ON UPPER LEVEL WATER PROJECT

MOTION was made by Councilman Lockman, seconded by Councilman Leeds and carried unimously that the contract with H. G. E., INC. be approved and that the Mayor and City Manager are authorized to sign said contract.

3. BIDS - INTERIM FINANCING ON UPPER LEVEL WATER PROJECT

No bids were received.

MOTION was made by Councilman Wheeler, seconded by Councilman Allsup and carried unimously that the Recorder be authorized to readvertise for bids.

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4. ACTION OF COUNCIL CONCERNING THE WHARE STREET SEWER EXTENSION AND APPROVAL TO PROCEED (NIEMI & THORP)

City Manager advised that the engineering cost would be approximately \$975. and overall cost approximately \$3,500.

MOTION was made by Councilman Wheeler, seconded by Councilman Leeds and carried unimously that the City proceed with the necessary extension onf Wharf Street and Niemi & Thorp proceed with the engineering.

5. HOUSING AUTHORITY PROGRAM

Resolution by City. This Resolution was tabled.

6. <u>AUTHORIZATION TO ADVERTISE FOR CITY PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE</u>

MOTION was made by Councilman Allsup, seconded by Councilman Leeds and carried unimously that the City Recorder advertise for bids.

7. AUTHORIZATION TO LET FOR BID THE OXFORD, MAPLE, CEDAR STREET PROJECT

MOTION was made by Councilman Allsup, seconded by Councilman Leeds and carried unimously that Marquess & Associated be authorized to advertise for bids. Bid opening to be on March 16, 1978 at 2:00 p.m.

8. RESLOTUION FOR TRANSFER OF FUNDS FOR CHETCO AVENUE WATER PROJECT.

Reslotuion No. 205 was read in full.

MOTION was made by Councilman Wheeler, sceonded by Councilman Lockman and carried unimously that Resolution No. 205 be adopted.

PAYMENT OF VOUCHERS

MOTION was made by Councilman Lockman, seconded by Councilman Allsup and carried unimously that vouchers in the amount of \$26,719.51 for the month of January, 1978 be paid.

Mayor Kerr advised that all long distance phone calls are to be logged in the future. Also parts that are purchased from supply companies are to be identified as to what piece of equipment they are being placed on. Tools are to be put on inventory and are to be checked periodically for possession.

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MANAGER'S REPORT

OTHER MATTERS

Mayor Kerr stated that he wanted it to go on record that he was in favor of having five (5) men for Curry County Commissioners instead of the current requirement of three (3) men.

MOTION was made by Councilman Allsup that it is to go on record that the Brookings Common Council would support the requirement of a five (5) man County Commission. Motion was seconded by Councilman Lockman. Councilman Leeds voted no. Motion carried.

Gladys Tegarden presented the Council with a petition to create a public authority for the purpose of providing a hospital facility. This petition is circulated by the Brookings-Harbor Medical Foundation.

Council will take this under advisement.

ADJOURNMENT

MOTION was made by Councilman Allsup, seconded by Councilman Wheeler and carried unimously that this meeting be adjourned until 7.30 p.m. on March 7, 1978. The meeting then adjourned at 9:20 p.m.
