4. PETITION FOR STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT ON PIONEER ROAD BETWEEN EASY AND HASSETT STREETS.

Mayor and Council suggested that requests for Improvement Districts be set up on a priority list, and the City Engineering Department prepare cost estimates for these improvement districts.

5. REQUEST FOR NO PARKING SIGNS AT PINE AND OAK AND PINE AND FERN BY MRS. PALM STOUT.

MOTION was made by Councilman Lockman, seconded by Councilman Allsup and carried unanimously that the Police Department investigate this report then make their recommendations to the Council at August 9, 1977 meeting.

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6. PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSIONER RESIGNATION AND APPOINTMENT OF NEW COMMISSIONER.

The resignation of Clarence Fix, effective June 2, 1977, was accepted.

Mrs. Virginia Manley was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Clarence Fix. Term of office to expire December 31, 1980.

7. CONSIDERATION FOR RESOLUTION IN THE MATTER OF ESTABLISHING BROOKINGS MEMBERSHIP IN OREGON COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT ASSN.

MOTION was made by Councilman Allsup, seconded by Councilman Leeds and carried unanimously that this be tabled until the continued Council meeting scheduled for July 26, 1977.

8. PAYMENT OF VOUCHERS.

MOTION was made by Councilman Lockman seconded by Councilman Allsup and carried unanimously that vouchers in the amount of \$38,142.72 for the month of June 1977 be paid.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT.

City Manager Al R. Hooten advised the Council that the 1974 Case Backhoe had been advertised for sale. The only bid received was from F & C Construction along with a check in the amount of \$14,500.00

MOTION was made by Councilman Lockman, seconded by Councilman Leeds and carried unanimously that this bid and check in the above named amount be accepted.

Mayor Kerr, with the approval of Council, appointed John Wheeler as Councilman, Position No. 4 to replace the unexpired term of Ellis Dowden. Term to expire December 31, 1978.

Mayor also advised that a budget committee meeting is scheduled for the 25th of July, 1977, at 7:30 p.m. to discuss State Revenue Sharing to the City of Brookings.

MOTION was made by Councilman Allsup, seconded by Councilman Lockman and carried unanimously that this meeting be adjourned to reconvene on July 26, 1977 at 8:00 p.m.
