MINUTES BROOKINGS COMMON COUNCIL CITY OF BROOKINGS JANUARY 11, 1977

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Robert L. Kerr. Members present were Councilmen Ray Lockman, Tony Leeds, Ellis Dowden, and Darrell Allsup. Also present was City Manager Al R. Hooten.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

MOTION was made by Councilman Allsup, seconded by Councilman Lockman and carried unanimously that the minutes of regular meeting December 14, 1976, be approved as presented.

<u>Consultant Engineer's Report</u> - Joe Stonecypher advised that FHA is still investigating the contract awarded to Sunset Underground on the Chetco Avenue Water Line.

FHA is holding in reserve the amount of \$100,000 for the City which has to be spent by May 8, 1977, or allocated for expenditure.

Mayor Kerr then advised that the grant had not been approved from EDA for assistance in construction of the second water level improvements under the Local Public Works Act of 1976. This application was received in the Seattle office after the deadline for consideration. If this grant had been approved, water improvements would have been for the area of Parkview Drive, Meadow Lane, Upper 7th Street and Old County Road. Mayor Kerr then suggested that H.G.E., Inc. proceed with engineering plans for water improvements on Old County Road in which the \$100,000 would be allocated for. Council were in agreement and Joe Stonecypher was instructed to proceed with the engineering.

The Water Filtration Plant is now complete and the grand opening is scheduled for February 8, 1977.

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION NO. 175.

Recommends to the City Council they authorize zone change on Tax Lots 2600, 2500, 2700, and 2701, Map 41-13-6DD, from ML to MG to permit the existing auto wrecking yard to continue operation and comply with City and State requirements.

MOTION was made by Councilman Lockman, seconded by Councilman Allsup and carried unanimously that a public hearing be held on this zone change request at the February 8, 1977, regular Council meeting.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Report attached.

Al Hooten, City Manager, advised that the CCD Economic Improvement Association is presently involved in an Economic Development Program to diversify and strengthen the economic base of Coos, Curry, and Douglas Counties. They would prepare three county-wide factbooks which would provide information on potential industrial sites, community amenities, utilities, taxes and other development factors. They are requesting the City of Brookings to contribute \$500 towards the development of these factbooks. Council instructed City Manager to add this to the 1977-78 budget.

The Oregon State Correctional Division has made a jail facility inspection of the City jail and advised that the mattresses have to be replaced for they are flammable. Bud Cross, Police Chief, suggested that the City check with the State Department for used mattresses.

OPEN DISCUSSION:

PROCLAMATION - Mayor Kerr proclaimed the week of January 16 - 22, 1977 as Jaycee Week.

Harry Parsi, City Engineer, inquired about the possibility of City going ahead with the EXTENSION OF 8" SEWER LINE ON THIRD STREET BETWEEN EASY STREET AND RANSOM AVENUE. This extension would affect eight landowners. Council instructed City Manager to get cost estimates from local contractors for this project, and then the City will be in the position to advise the landowners of their cost for this sewer extension.

Leo Appel II, inquired from the Council if any RESTRICTIONS COULD BE PLACED ON OUT OF TOWN BUSINESSES who come to town for one or two days at a time, sell their merchandise then leave the area. The City Ordinance now reads that all they have to do is purchase a City license to do business within the City. City Manager will contact the League of Oregon Cities to see if they can supply the City with a possible ordinance that would give more protection to local merchants and restrictions on out of town businesses.

The Dawson Fire District ANNEXATION HAS BEEN APPROVED. The City now has to supply fire protection to a larger area. MAYOR KERR SUGGESTED that City MEET WITH DAWSON FIRE DISTRICT OFFICIALS TO DISCUSS THE POSSIBILITY OF THE CITY RECEIVING REVENUE FROM THE DISTRICT PRIOR TO WHEN REVENUE IS RECEIVED THROUGH PROPERTY TAXES.
