

MINUTES  
BROOKINGS COMMON COUNCIL  
February 8, 1972

The regular meeting of the City Council was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Les Williams. Those present were: Councilwoman Wilma Kemp, Councilmen Rush Long and Cal Gorte. Councilman William Higham was absent.

Students present were: Cathy Remington and Brian Wimberly.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

MOTION was made by Councilman Gorte, seconded by Councilman Long and carried that the minutes of January 11, 1972, be approved as posted.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Mr. Ken Thompson, Administrator of Curry General Hospital, informed those present of the need for doctors in Curry County. As of April 1 there will be only one doctor in Brookings, there are two in Gold Beach and one in Port Orford just three days a week. One of the reasons it is so hard to obtain a doctor in Curry County is that in the Medford area they are employing doctors for the emergency room only in the hospital, which would be a 40 hour week, for the fee of \$34,000.00 a year. In this area the doctor has to put in many hours plus the fact that they have to equip an office. Mr. Thompson is trying to obtain five doctors for Curry County through the Federal program. If doctors are obtained through the Federal program, they have to be provided with facilities, which would be at the expense of the community. Mr. Thompson suggested that the community try to come up with some solution to obtain more doctors in Curry County. Mr. Thompson stated that he would be available at any time to offer his assistance.

Mr. Gerald V. Thom requested that his property located in the Elizabeth Tract be served by city sewer. Mr. Elmer Lee, Superintendent of Public Works, informed Mr. Thom that he is in the process of working up a sewer district that would take in the property of Mr. Thom. This program will be completed in the near future and will be presented to the Council.



ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO LIVESTOCK WITHIN CITY.

Mr. Paul Fauerso, on behalf of horse owners within the city, presented their views and suggestions. Mr. Fauerso presented a roughed-out ordinance to be reviewed by the Council for their ideas and recommendations. In this roughed-out ordinance it provides for registration and strict control over livestock within the city. Mr. Fauerso ask Mr. Cameron C. Thom, City Attorney, on the legality of amending or deleting the present ordinance. He was informed that an amendment can be added to the present ordinance providing for livestock within the city with control. To delete the present ordinance there must be filed with the city a petition for initiative with 47 signatures of registered voters. After much discussion, Councilman Long offered to meet with the committee to see if they could come up with some solution. The Mayor then appointed Councilman Long as Chairman of a committee to meet with the interested people and report back to the Council at the next regular council meeting.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

City Attorney - None.

City Engineer - Gary Dyer reported that the Mill Beach pump station is in operation but not 100% complete. On the infiltration study, two parts of it have been completed. Upon completion it will be discussed with the Council. The sewer plant design is progressing satisfactory.

Superintendent of Public Works - None.

LEGISLATIVE ACTION:

1. FUEL BIDS FOR CITY BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT.

Only one bid was received. After some discussion it was suggested that the city readvertise.

MOTION was made by Councilman Long, seconded by Councilman Gorte and carried that the City Recorder readvertise for fuel bids to be considered at the next regular council meeting of March 14, 1972.

2. SUPPLEMENT TO 1971-72 BUDGET.

MOTION was made by Councilman Long, seconded by Councilman Gorte and carried that the City Recorder proceed with necessary procedures to prepare the supplement budget for public hearing.

Mayor Williams brought it to the attention of the Council that Ben Franklin, Jr., budget member, has moved out of the city and could no longer serve on this committee. Mayor Williams recommended Tim Griffin to replace Mr. Franklin.

MOTION was made by Councilwoman Kemp, seconded by Councilman Long and carried that Tim Griffin be appointed as a Budget Committee Member for the remaining term of Ben Franklin, Jr.


ADJOURNMENT:
