# MINUTES BROOKINGS COMMON COUNCIL NOVEMBER 9, 1971

The regular meeting of the City Council was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Les Williams. Those present were: Councilwoman Kemp, Councilmen Rush Long, William Higham and Cal Gorte.

Also present were six students from the eighth grade: Kathy Remington, Elizabeth Kockritz, Mike Swigert, Brian Wimberly, Ernie Fiegel and Lisa Samuel. Students from the local schools will be attending regularly.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

MOTION was made by Councilman Long, seconded by Councilman Gorte and carried that the minutes of October 12 and 27, 1971, be approved as posted.

#### PUBLIC HEARINGS:

NONE.

#### MONTHLY REPORTS:

City Attorney - None.

City Engineer - Gary Dyer reported that the Mill Beach Pump Station project is progressing satisfactory. The sub-service is complete and one pump is installed. This project should be complete within a month and ready for operation.

Superintendent of Public Works - None.

#### LEGISLATIVE ACTION:

- 1. PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION NO. 145 CONSTRUC-TION OF PAN-ABODE INTERLOCKING LOGS WITHIN THE CITY.

  This recommendation was tabled until the next regular meeting December 14, 1971.
- 2. ORDINANCE NO. 229 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 217 PROVIDING FOR FILING AN INCREASED NUMBER OF PRELIMINARY PLATS.

MOTION was made by Councilman Higham and seconded by Councilman Gorte that Ordinance No. 229 be read the second time by title only. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCE NO. 230 - AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF ORDINANCE NO. 216 BY DELETING MULTI-FAMILY DWELLINGS FROM THE PERMITTED USES IN THE RM\_ZONE.

MOTION was made by Councilman Long, seconded by Councilman Higham that Ordinance No. 230 be read the second time by title only. Motion carried unanimously.

MOTION was made by Councilman Long, seconded by Councilman Higham that Ordinance No. 230 be adopted. Motion carried unanimously.

4. PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION NO. 148 - EXTENSION OF PRESENT CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT HELD BY GLENN R. BABB FOR ANOTHER ONE YEAR PERIOD.

MOTION was made by Councilman Long, seconded by Councilman Higham and carried that Recommendation No. 148 be accepted. Motion carried unanimously.

5. PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION NO. 149 - RESEARCH
OF RECORD TO DETERMINE IF A 40 FOOT ROADWAY REFERRED TO
AS BARBARA LANE HAS EVER BEEN ACCEPTED BY CITY.

The Council was informed that this roadway has not bee deeded to the city. An ordinance had been prepared in the past accepting a 40 foot street but had not been adopted. This request was tabled until the next regular meeting December 14th and at that time an ordinance will be presented for the decision of the Council.

6. LIQUOR RENEWAL APPLICATIONS WERE SUBMITTED FOR CITY ENDORSEMENT OF THE FOLLOWING BUSINESSES:

Green Door, Pine Cone Tavern, B.P.O. Elks #1934, O'Holleran's, Ray's Sentry, Brookings Market, McKay's Market, Ken's Tavern, and Local Market.

MOTION was made by Councilman Higham, seconded by Councilman Gorte that the above named applications be approved. Motion carried unanimously.

Edward L. Bakke, owner of the Green Door, requested endorsement on two liquor applications, the second

one being for a Class "B" Dispenser's License.

MOTION was made by Councilwoman Kemp, seconded by Councilman Higham and carried that the Class "B" Dispenser's License of the Green Door also be endorsed. Motion carried unanimously.

7. LAW ENFORCEMENT COUNCIL'S RADIO COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM.

MOTION was made by Councilwoman Kemp, seconded by Councilman Higham and carried that the City of Brookings pay their share of this communications system which is \$912.00.

8. PAYMENT OF VOUCHERS - OCTOBER 1971.

MOTION was made by Councilman Gorte, seconded by Councilman Long and carried that vouchers in the amount of \$4,771.09 be paid. Motion carried unanimously.

#### OTHER MATTERS:

Councilwoman Kemp asked Bud Cross, Chief of Police, if the city was still dispatching for the county and if so, is the city being paid for the service. Chief Cross informed the Council that the city is dispatching for the county but no money has been received since July. Chief Cross was instructed by the Council to arrange a meeting with the County Sheriff to see if some agreement can be arranged.

Archie E. Anderson is requesting permission to have sewer service for Beach View Subdivision along Highway 101 North. Plans will be presented to the Council in the near future for their review.

A letter from Senator Bob Packwood was read concerning Mercy Flights, Inc., in Oregon. Senator Packwood expressed his interest and offered his assistance for the continuation of this organization.

Councilman Long inquired if any word had been received from Harbor in regard to their sewer problem. Mayor informed him that no official word had been received. Councilman Long stated that someone from Harbor should Page 4 - Minutes Brookings Common Council November 9, 1971

> contact the city and request our sewer service and that the Council should then take careful consideration before signing any agreement with Harbor. Annexation was mentioned once again.
