

CITY OF BROOKINGS
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
October 14, 1969

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Harold Young. Flag salute followed.

Prayer was given by Pastor John Gordon of First Baptist Church.

Councilmen present included Alden Loring, Bill Higham and Gil Batty. Not in attendance was Scott Sheppard.

Cameron C. Thom, City Attorney, and Ed Riley, City Engineer, were present.

Reporters present were Marge Barrett and Dick Keusink.

The minutes of September 9 and 16 were approved as read.

Council was informed that the State of Oregon had deeded to the City a small portion of land on the corner of Railroad and Wharf Streets.

Mayor Young announced that Allen L. Henderson is being hired as City Administrator.

MOTION was made by Alden Loring and seconded by Gil Batty that the hiring of Allen L. Henderson for City Administrator be approved. Motion carried unanimously.

Request for two street lights to be installed was discussed. One light to be located at First Street between Easy and Ransom Streets, and the other at the corner of Pine and Myrtle Streets. The cost of these lights is \$50 per year per light. City Recorder informed the Council that there is enough money budgeted in the 1969-70 budget in the Street Lighting Fund to afford two more street lights.

MOTION was made by Bill Higham and seconded by Alden Loring that street lights be installed at First Street between Easy and Ransom and at the corner of Pine and Myrtle Streets. Motion carried unanimously.

Chief of Police C. M. (Bud) Cross requested that the bail amount on overtime parking tickets be established.

MOTION was made by Gil Batty and seconded by Bill Higham that the amount of bail to be set on overtime parking is \$1.00. Motion carried unanimously.

Pastor Crist of Assembly of God Church has requested permission to hold musical and testimony programs on parking lots within the City. Chief of Police Cross informed the Council that he has no objections to these programs as long as they are held in an orderly manner.

Planning Commission Recommendation No. 136; recommending to the City Council that the petition of Mr. & Mrs. Roy Brimm be accepted. The request for rezoning of property designated as

all of Tax Lot 301 and a part of Tax Lot 300, Map No. 40-13-32C from an A-1 zone to a special zone to allow for a mobile home estates subdivision. After some discussion the Council scheduled October 28 for a workshop discussion on this petition. A combined workshop of the Council and Planning Commission is scheduled for November 25, 1969. The Public Hearing of the petition of Mr. & Mrs. Roy Brimm for this proposed special zone will be held on December 9, 1969 at 8:00 p.m.

It was brought to the attention of Mayor and Council that the League of Oregon Cities Convention is scheduled for November 16-18, 1969 at the Hilton Hotel in Portland, Oregon. Reservations have to be in by November 1. Those who are attending are to inform the City Recorder so that reservations can be made.

It was brought to the attention of the Council that the next regular Council meeting of November 11 falls on a legal holiday, Veteran's Day.


MOTION was made by Bill Higham and seconded by Gil Batty that the next regular Council meeting will be held on November 12. Motion carried unanimously.

MOTION was made by Bill Higham and seconded by Gil Batty that the vouchers in the amount of \$5,131.40 be paid. Motion carried unanimously.

MOTION was made by Gil Batty and seconded by Alden Loring that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried. The meeting then adjourned at 9:35 p.m.
