REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL CITY OF BROOKINGS JULY 9, 1968

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present were Gilbert Batty, Lloyd Mosier, Alden Loring, and Henry Kerr.

Reporters present were Dick Keusink, Ruth Brewer, and Marge Barrett.

Minutes of the Council: meeting held on June 11 and the public hearing on the 1968-69 budget held on June 24 were approved as posted.

A letter from Harlan, Gessford, & Erichsen requesting an appearance before the Council to discuss federal grants for sewer treatment plants was read. The Council agreed to schedule the appearance requested for the August 13 Council meeting.

A letter from William E. Taylor, attorney for Byron Brimm, was read and attached hereto. The City attorney indicated that he would contact Mr. Taylor and schedule a meeting with the Council in an effort to solve the problem.

Ordinance No. 199, an Ordinance regulating collection and disposal of garbage in the City of Brookings and giving an exclusive franchise for the same, was read in its entirety. Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 199 be read the second time by title only. Henry Kerr seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried. Ordinance No. 199 was then read the second time by title only. Henry Kerr made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 199 be read the third time by title only and that declaring an emergency be placed upon its final passage, and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was carried unanimously. Following the reading of Ordinance No. 199 the third time by title only, the following roll call vote resulted:

Absent- None

Ordinance No. 199 having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

Ordinance No. 200, an Ordinance requiring compliance with State Public Utility Commission and State Board of Health regulations, was read in full. Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 200 be read the second time by title only.

Henry Kerr seconded the motion which was unanimously accepted. Ordinance No. 200 was then read the second time by title only. Gilbert Batty made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency declared and that Ordinance No. 200 be read the third time by title only, and declaring an emergency be placed upon its final passage and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was unanimously accepted. Following the reading of Ordinance No. 200 the third time by title only, the following roll call vote resulted:

Ayes- Manley, Mosier, Kerr, Batty, Loring

Nayes- None

Absent- None

Ordinance No. 200, having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

Initiative petitions requesting the removal of parking meters were once again presented. Considerable discussion on the request of these petitions took place concerning election procedures, hooding the meters, parking control, and other related subjects. The Council felt that the election should be held in conjunction with the general election in November, but no specific action was taken. Since no specific action was taken, the initiative petitions were deemed as being rejected, and the measure will be placed on the ballot in the November general election under the provisions of Ordinance No. 58.

An application for a water line extension from the Brookings Water Company was presented. It is to be a 75 foot extension on the north end of Fourth Street. The Council chose to hold the matter in abeyance pending an opinion of the City's legal counsel.

Building Inspector Lee Fountain stated that the owner of the Spruce Street Apts. has requested that she be able to continue to use her building until sometime this fall in order that the weather will permit her to burn the building at that time. Henry Kerr made a MOTION that the request be granted. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion, which was unanimously accepted.

City Engineer B. A. Martin discussed street improvements with the Council. He pointed out that some streets are in sufficient order to pave immediately, but that it will be necessary to do engineering work on some of the other streets. He recommended that the city hire Jerry Swanson to do the engineering work on the streets. Henry Kerr made a MOTION that the recommendations of B. A. Martin be accepted. Alden Loring seconded the motion, which was passed unanimously.

It was announced that petitions are now available for Council position No. 1, now occupied by Lloyd Mosier, Council position No. 2, now occupied by Henry Kerr, and the office of Mayor, now occupied by Bruce J. Manley.

Cont'd:

Deadline for these petitions in order to have names appear on the November ballot is 5:00 P. M., August 30.

Vouchers totaling \$5,834.63 were submitted for payment. Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that the vouchers be paid. Henry Kerr seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

The meeting was then adjourned at 9:50 P. M.
