

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL
CITY OF BROOKINGS
AUGUST 15, 1968

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present were Gilbert Batty, Lloyd Mosier, and Henry Kerr.


No reporters were present at the meeting.

Mayor Manley announced that the purpose of this meeting was to hold the public hearing on the vacation of the streets of that unnamed subdivision plat of 1920. Maps were presented showing the streets to be vacated. Several persons appeared to question what effect the vacation would have on the parking of the Seventh Day Adventist Church. Archie McVay gave his personal assurance that parking would be guaranteed for the Seventh Day Adventist Church. Since there were no further questions, Ordinance No. 201, an ordinance vacating the streets, alleys, and public ways of that unnamed subdivision plat of 1920, was read. Gilbert Batty made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 201 be read the second time by title only. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was unanimously carried. Ordinance No. 201 was then read the second time by title only. Lloyd Mosier then made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 201 be read the third time by title only, and that declaring and emergency be placed upon its final passage, and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Henry Kerr seconded the motion, which was unanimously passed. Following the reading of Ordinance No. 201 the third time by title only, the following roll call vote resulted:

Nays - None
Absent - Loring

Ordinance No. 201, having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

The meeting was then adjourned at 8:40 P. M.
