REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL CITY OF BROOKINGS March 12, 1968

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present were Lloyd Mosier, Henry Kerr, Alden Loring and Gilbert Batty.

Reporters present were Dick Keusink and Marge Barrett.

Minutes of the February 13 Council meeting were read and approved.

A petition requesting the Council "to determine their intention relative to the enforcement of the trailer ordinance" which had been signed by 31 individuals was presented. Many of these individuals were in attendance at the meeting. The main basis of the complaint was the structure now being occupied by Byron E. Brimm. C. A. Mac-Kenzie appeared before the Council and spoke on behalf of the absent petitioners. He said they felt that this was a "flagrant and intentional violation of an ordinance of the City of Brookings." He further stated that the petitioners did not want penalties imposed on individuals, but felt that if trailers were allowed in the City on a hit-of-miss basis, the City would lose its charm." Building Inspector Lee Fountain spoke to the Council and those in attendance about Mr. Brimm's structure/ Following considerable further discussion, Lloyd Mosier made a motion that Byron E. Brimm be given 90 days to remove his structure from the City, and that he be so notified; Gilbert Batty seconded the motion which was carried unanimously.

First reading of Ordinance No. 196, an ordinance repealing Section 6 of Ordinance N_0 . 2, relating to the reading of the minutes of Council Meetings, was read in full. Alden Loring made a motion that the first reading of the Ordinance be accepted. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was unanimously accepted.

A letter of resignation from Jack Holte for his position on the Parks and Recreation Commission was read. Lloyd Mosier made a motion that his resignation be accepted. Mayor Manley seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

Mayor Manley then appointed Alva Putman and Sam Erb to fill the existing vacancies on the Parks and Recreation Commission, Henry Kerr made a motion that these names be accepted. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.

Bids for furnishing the City of Brookings with liability insurance for the twelve-month period commencing March 18 were opened and read. Gerald RossInsurance Agency bid \$1796.00. Fauerso-Lesmeister Agency bid \$1878.00. Alden Loring made a motion that the low bid of Gerald Ross Insurance Agency be accepted. Mayor Manley seconded the motion which was accepted unanimously.

Bids for furnishing sewer line material were opened and are attached hereto. Gilbert Batty made a motion that the low bid submitted by E. J. Bartells Company of Portland be accepted. Alden Loring seconded the motion which met with unanimous approval.

City Recorder Robert O. Dimmick, Jr. presented a report on a proposed parks and recreation district to follow the boundaries of School District 17-C. If \$30,000 were to be raised, it would result in taxes equal to $90 \ensuremath{\phi}$ per \$1,000 true cash valuation. This report was for informative purposes, and no action was necessary.

Mayor Manley made a motion that City Draftsman Jerry Swanson be permitted to attend the Surveying and Mapping conference in Corvallis on March 21, 22 and 23. Henry Kerr seconded the motion which was carried unanimously.

A motion was then made by Mayor Manley that the title of Jerry Swanson be changed from City Draftsman to Assistant City Engineer per the recommendation of B.A. Martin, City Engineer's letter. Gilbert Batty seconded the motion which was met with unanimously approval.

Building Inspector Lee Fountain discussed some non-conforming advertising signs in the City. Police Chief C.M. Cross indicated that he would contact the owners.

Vouchers totaling \$4,650.13 were submitted for payment. Lloyd Mosier made a motion that the vouchers be paid, seconded by Gilbert Batty and unanimously approved.

The meeting was then adjourned at 9:35 p.m.
