# REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL CITY OF BROOKINGS APRIL 9, 1968

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present were Gilbert Batty, Lloyd Mosier, and Alden Loring.

Reporters present were Ruth Brewer, Dick Keusink and Marge Barrett.

Minutes of the regular meeting held March 12 and the special meetings held March 14 and 29 were read and approved.

A letter from the Harbor Rural Water District rejecting the city's offer was read and is hereto attached.

Planning Commission Recommendation No 128 was read and discussed. Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that Planning Commission Recommendation No. 128 be accepted and that the City Attorney draw up the necessary ordinance. Gilbert Batty seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.

Planning Commission Recommendation No. 129 pertaining to split-level homes, was read. Gilbert Batty made a MOTION that Planning Commission Recommendation No. 129 be accepted. Alden Loring seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.

Ordinance No. 196, pertaining to the reading of Council minutes at succeeding meetings was read in full the second time. Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that Ordinance No. 196 be read the third time by title only and declaring an emergency be placed upon its final passage and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Mayor Manley seconded the motion which was unanimously passed. Following the reading of Ordinance No. 196 the third time by title only, the following roll call vote resulted:

Ordinance No. 196, having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have duly adopted.

Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that bids be advertised for on three pieces of property which the city has acquired for delinquent assessments and that the bids be opened at the May 14 Council meeting. Alden Loring seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.

Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that the City of Brookings advertise for the water intake structure for the municipal water system to be opened May 10 and awarded May 14. Mayor Manley seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.

Mayor Manley reappointed Calvin Gorte and William Landis to the Planning Commission, as their present terms expires on April 21. Alden Loring made a MOTION that these reappointments be accepted. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was accepted unanimously.

The Council gave Police Chief C. M. Cross permission to obtain a steel door for between the jail and office sections of the police department. They also authorized giving the steel jail partitions out of the old jail to the City of Port Orford providing that they be removed without charge or liability to the City of Brookings.

Alden Loring made a MOTION that Judge Beinke be given permission to attend the Oregon Traffic Court Conference in Eugene on May 2, 3, and 4. Gilbert Batty seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.

A review of the city's insurance coverage was postponed until the meeting in May in order that that the Council may study the present coverage further.

A brief review and discussion of general fiscal policy took place, and it was pointed out that the first meeting of the Budget Committee will be held on May 6.

Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that the City of Brookings offer Karl Ostenberg \$5,000 for that portion of his land needed by the city for their municipal water system as is shown on the attached legal description. Alden Loring seconded the motion which was unanimously accepted.

The possibility of the City of Brookings removing their parking meters was discussed. A question pertaining to the legality of the parking meters on a state highway was also asked. It was pointed out that the City of Brookings and the State of Oregon presently have an agreement whereby parking meters are permitted on the state highway. The Council decided to table the question of removing parking meters until the budget hearings.

Leo Lucas and Roscoe Conway, representing the Southern Curry Cemetery Maintenance District, appeared before the Council to question when water will be available to the cemetery. Mayor Manley said that the city will get water there as fast as they could. Much discussion took place on this item between the Council, Leo Lucas, and Elmer Bankus. The Council said the their decision concerning this item could not be made until after the pending court case is completed.

Vouchers totaling \$4,939.25 were submitted for payment. Alden Loring made a MOTION that the vouchers be paid. Gilbert Batty seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.

The meeting was then adjourned at 9:25 P.M.

. Description of the tract of land which is the subject of this report:

A parcel of land lying within the Southwest Quarter (SW1) of the Southeast Quarter (SEL) of Section 34, Township 40 South, Range 13, West, Willamette Meridian, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point lying on the northerly bank of the Cherco River, said point being North 536.5 feet and East 3440.4 feet from the Southwest corner of said Section 34, Township 40 South, Range 13 West, Willamette Meridian, Curry County, Oregon;

thence North a distance of 325.0 feet to an iron pipe lying on the southerly

right-of-way line of the North Bank Chetco River Road;

thence following said southerly right-of-way line of said road a distance of 350 feet to an iron pipe, the chord of which bears North 84°11' West a 347.6 feet:

thence leaving said southerly right-of way line, South a distance of 296.0 feet to a point lying on the northerly bank of the Chotco River;

thence continuing South a distance of 100 feet, more or less, to the thread of the stream of the Chetco River;

thence Southeasterly, following the thread of said river, a distance of 370 feet, more or less, to a point which lies due South a distance of 100 feet from the point of beginning;

thence North a distance of 100 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning

and being within Curry County, Oregon.
