

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
CITY OF BROOKINGS  
JUNE 19, 1967

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present included Lloyd Mosier, Henry Kerr, Alden Loring and Gilbert Batty.

Reporters present were Marge Barrett and Dick Keusink.

Minutes of the May 9 Council meeting were read and approved.

A petition from Harold Cooper signed by seven residents and property owners in his area stating that they had no objections to the fence which he built was presented to the Council. Alden Loring made a MOTION that a temporary permit be issued to Mr. Cooper, subject to further action by the City Council. Lloyd Mosier seconded this motion, which was unanimously carried. The Council also requested Mr. Cooper to notify any future purchaser of his property of the circumstances of the fence being there.

A letter from Andrew Rose protesting to the dumping and intent to burn of the wood scrap next to his property at 620 Memory Lane was read to the Council and discussed. It was suggested that the City notify the property owner to put up a sign stating no dumping of garbage on the premises, and also compel the owner to dispose of the wood scrap in the best manner possible. Fire Chief Bob Kerr indicated that a fire permit would be issued if the area is made safe for burning.

Four representatives from the United States Department of Employment appeared before the Council to discuss their program with them. It was pointed out that a house to house survey of the area had been taken, and that tests were given numerous residents to determine their capabilities. Industries of the area were also surveyed. All of these findings will be compiled and submitted in a report which will be available about September 1.

An audit contract for the fiscal 1966-67 year between Buddy E. Smith and the City of Brookings was submitted for approval. Gilbert Batty made a MOTION that the contract be accepted. Henry Kerr seconded the motion, which met unanimous approval.

Fire Chief Bob Kerr requested that the Council enter into a contract with Western States Fire Apparatus Company for pump certification and maintenance. This would include inspection twice a year and certification once a year. Contract cost would be \$250.00 per year. Henry Kerr made a MOTION that the City sign the contract upon approval of the City Attorney. Alden Loring seconded the motion, which was unanimously accepted.

City Draftsman Jerry Swanson said that an individual desires to pave Woodland Part Court cul-de-sac at his own expense, but felt that the matter should be brought before the Council first. The Council stated that they had no objections to the paving.

The City Draftsman also stated that plans and specifications are nearing completion on the Memory Lane Pump Station. These will be forwarded to the state for approval shortly after July 1, and it is hoped that a 30% grant will be received. Construction should begin sometime in August.


Lloyd Mosier presented City Hall plans for paving, landscaping, and construction of a Council table. It was pointed out the \$8,000 in funds were available from the County for this. Mayor Manley made a MOTION that the \$8,000 available be accepted to apply toward paving, landscaping, and other costs of the new City Hall. Henry Kerr seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Mayor Manley made a MOTION that a notice of appeal in the case of Bankus vs. City of Brookings be filed and that the case be appealed to the Supreme Court. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which met with unanimous approval.


It was pointed out that the public hearing on the proposed 1967-68 budget will be held June 26 at 8:00 P. M.
