REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL CITY OF BROOKINGS DECEMBER 12, 1967

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present included Henry Kerr, Lloyd Mosier, and Alden Loring. Gilbert Batty was not in attendance at this meeting.

Reporters present included Ruth Brewer, Dick Keusink, and Marge Barrett.

A letter from the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce requesting a meeting room in the new City Hall was read and attached hereto. Following considerable discussion, Henry Kerr made a MOTION that the City Recorder investigate the possibility of a lock change whereby the multi-purpose room could be utilized for these meetings. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was passed unanimously.

Fred Jensen submitted a written request for an extension on his contract at the Memory Lane Pump Station. Lloyd Mosier made a MOTIONt that the extension be granted. Alden Loring seconded the motion which met with unanimous acceptance.

A letter from the Soroptimist Club whereby they requested permission to install a drinking fountain was read and attached hereto. No action was taken on this, however, until further information could be obtained.

Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that Marjorie Hoagland be reappointed to the Board of Trustees of the Chetco Community Public Library for another four-year term. Henry Kerr seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.

Mayor Manley made a MOTION that the City of Brookings advertise for gasoline bids to be opened at 8:00 P. M. January 9, 1968. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

The City Recorder was instructed to order revised budget manuals for each of the Councilmen,

Mayor Manley requested that a letter of thanks be sent to the Brookings-Harbor Jaycees for their work in obtaining a flag and flagpole for in front of the City Hall.

The names of Jack Holte and Jim Barrett were submitted for consideration to fill the two vacancies on the Parks and Recreation Commission. Henry Kerr made a MOTION that these names be accepted. Loyd Mosier seconded the motion which met with unanimous acceptance.

Once again the delinquent assessments on the Roy Weideman property were discussed. The Council said that they would meet with Mr. Weideman on this and have an answer at the January 9 meeting.

Ordinance No. 194, repealing Ordinances No. 28, 164, 165, and 182, was read. Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 194 be read the second time by title only. Following a second by Henry Kerr, the motion was unanimously approved and Ordinance No. 194 was read the second time by title only. Henry Kerr then made a MOTION that Ordinance No. 194 be read the third time by title only and declaring anemergency be placed upon its final passage and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried. Following the reading of the Ordinance the third time by title only, the following roll call vote resulted:

Ordinance No. 194, having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

Ordinance No. 195, an Ordinance repealing section 9 of Ordinance No. 8, was then read. Henry Kerr made a MOTION that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 195 be read the second time by title only. Following a second by Lloyd Mosier, the motion was approved unanimously and Ordinance No. 195 was read the second time by title only. Alden Loring then made a MOTION that Ordinance No. 195 be read the third time by title only and declaring an emergency be placed upon its final passage and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion which was carried unanimously. Following the reading of the Ordinance the third time by title only, the following roll call vote resulted:

Nayes None Absent Batty

Ordinance No. 195, having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

The placing of an 8-inch sewer line to serve four of Merrill Bullock homes on Buena Vista Loop was discussed. No specific action was taken, however,

Vouchers totaling \$9,972.19 were submitted for payment. Alden Loring made a MOTION that the vouchers be paid. Henry Kerr seconded the motion, which was passed unanimously.

The meeting was then adjourned at 9:25 P. M

Gentlemen:

The undersigned General Contractor for the installation of the above project, does hereby request an extension of time for completion.

This request is made, and I feel the extension of time is justified, in view of the fact that I have been delayed in getting the sewage pumps which were ordered on September 29, 1967, from Pacific Pumping Co. of Portland, Oregon, and which pumps have as yet not been received by me. It is anticipated that the project can be completed, weather and other factors permitting, within a period of ten days or so after the pumps are received, and it is my intention to proceed with all reasonable diligence and to complete the work without delay.

Also, I feel that the extension of time herein requested is justified further in view of the fact that the City had first considered deleting the exhaust fan, and it was not until recently that it was decided that the fan should be secured and installed. This order was placed right away when the City and the architect decided not to delete it but the best indication that we have as to its delivery date would be around the lst of January, 1968.

Therefore, for these reasons it is hereby requested that an extension of time be given to January 1, 1968. This is assuming, of course, that we will have received the fan by that time. I feel that, as stated, we can have the project completed for service within a period of ten days from the date that we receive the pumps, so that the sewer system can be put into operation, and it would be just a small matter of installing the fan, which will be done as soon as it is received.

This request would have been made earlier except that I was hope-
