MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING CITY OF BROOKINGS JANUARY 19, 1967

The meeting was called to order at 10:30 A. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present were Alden Loring, Lloyd Mosier, Gilbert Batty and Henry Kerr.

The reporter present was Marge Barrett.

Roy Erichsen appeared before the Council to give his recommendations on the City Hall site. He said that there was no doubt in his firms mind that the fill would support the weight of the building. He presented several topography maps to the Council, including one map which had all of the information co-ordinated on a site plan. Three test holes which had been dug by CooseCurry C o-op equipment were shown on the maps. One hole was dug 15 feet and showed solid fill all the way down. The other two holes could only be dug about 2 feet each, as the ground was to hard to go any further. Mr. Erichsen said positively that on the basis of his personal investigations that there are no problems with the fill and that the site was adequate in every respect for the proposed new City Hall. Following further discussion in which Mr. Erichsen stated that he would so contract, Lloyd Mosier made a MOTION that objections of December and November by the City to the City Hall site be removed upon receipt of a letter from Mr. Erichsen stating that he has thoroughly examined the building site of the new City Hall and that the foundation, based upon tests which he has made, is thoroughly adequate, and that further testing is unnecessary. Gilbert Batty seconded the motion and it was unanimously carried.

It was pointed out that the annual Sewage Works Operation School was being held in Corvallis February 8, 9 and 10. Gilbert Batty made a MOTION that Oliver Moody be authorized to attend this school. Alden Loring seconded the motion and it was unanimously passed.

The meeting was then adjourned at 11;10 A. M.
