MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING CITY OF BROOKINGS JULY 12, 1966

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present were Ben Franklin, Lloyd Mosier, Henry Kerr, and Ernest Christensen.

Reporters present were Marge Barrett, Amy Mann, Dick Keusink, and Ruth Brewer.

Minutes of the regular Council meeting held June 14 and the special Council meeting held June 23 were read and approved.

A letter from Gerald Ross Insurance Agency regarding insurance coverage on firemen was read.

Planning Commission Recommendation No. 115 was read to the Council. City Draftsman Jerry Swanson said approximately 2,000 lineal feet of pavement were involved. Following considerable discussion between the Council and Lloyd Fox, representing Southern Curry Cemetery Maintenance District, Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that this matter be tabled until the next regular Council meeting. Ben Franklin seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

A letter from the Brookings Fire Department giving a break-down of all calls answered by the Brookings and Harbor Fire Departments for the past 6½ years under their existing contract was read. City Attorney Bill Balderree pointed out that the existing contract was not economically feasible for neither the Brookings nor Harbor Fire Departments. Ben Franklin made a MOTION that City Attorney Bill Balderree negotiate another contract with the Harbor Fire Department to replace the existing one. Ernest Christensen seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Roy Erichsen of the architectural firm of Harlan, Gessford, and Erichsen presented a contract to the Council for design services on the proposed City Hall structure. Elmer Bankus asked the Council if the City stood any liability of ever having to return the money used for City Hall construction, City Attorney Bill Balderree stated it was his opinion that a valid arrangement such as the one between Curry County and the City of Brookings could be made, and that the liability in such an arrangement would be assumed by the County Court, not the City of Brookings. Mr. Erichsen said he estimated the construction cost to be \$135,000 and the structure will be planned so that it can be readily expanded to meet future needs of the City. Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that the firm of Harlan, Gessford and Erichsen be retained for architectural work on the new City Hall, and that the contract presented be signed and Ben Franklin seconded the motion and it passed returned. unanimously.

It was announced that petitions for the term of office of Mayor, Council position No. 3, and Council position No. 4 which expire December 31, 1966 were now available through the Office of the Recorder. Deadline for the filing of these petitions is September 8, 1966 at 5:00 P. M.

City Draftsman Jerry Swanson discussed the Memory Lane lift station and recommended that the City Council retain the services of a consulting engineering firm for the preparation of final engineering plans, the confirmation of a total cost estimate and the review of Federal or State construction aid funds which may be available for such a project and upon the completion of such a study, place the measure upon the November ballot of the General Election for a vote of the people for the sale and issuance of General Obligation bonds not to exceed the amount set forth in the Engineer's estimate. Ben Frankling made a MOTION that the firm of Harlan, Gessford, and Erichsen be retained to present the preliminary plans and specifications in the standardized form necessary for a general obligation election. Ernest Christensen seconded the motion and it was unanimously carried.

The City Draftsman recommended that Ordinance No.116, Section 14 be ammended by increasing the outside sewer district fee from three hundred dollars to five hundred dollars, and that only single family dwellings on one single residential lot be approved for connection without consent of the Mayor and City Council. The City Draftsman also recommended that all subdivisions which are not within the boundaries of a sewer assessment district be served only by and through the formation of a sewer assessment district as outlined in Ordinance No. 146. Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that the engineering department recommendations be accepted. Ben Franklin seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

A letter from Elmer Bankus requesting the formation of a sewer assessment district for his Sea Cliff Terrace subdivision was read and discussed. Ben Franklin made a MOTION that the City of Brookings advise Elmer Bankus to retain his own engineer to complete all plans and specifications for the formation of a sewer assessment district subject to City approval. Ernest Christensen seconded the motion and it met with unanimous approval.

Bids for employee life insurance were tabled until the employees could be polled for the type of plan which they prefer.

City Attorney Bill Balderree said it was his opinion that there was no particular evil in the word split-level home, and the fact that it is a split level home does not prohibit the dwelling in an R-1 zone particularly. He stated the main thing to consider is the height, terrain of the land, and the view obstruction. Whether or not a split-level home is allowed in an R-1 zone depends upon the individual circumstances.

Vouchers totaling \$4,110.74 were submitted for payment. Ernest Christensen made a MOTION the bills be paid. Following a second by Lloyd Mosier, the motion was passed unanimously.

The meeting was then adjourned at 10:10 P. M.
