## MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING CITY OF BROOKINGS AUGUST 9. 1966

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley

Gouncilmen present were Lloyd Mosier, Ernest Christensen, and Ben Franklin. Henry Kerr entered the meeting at a later time.

Reporters present were Amy Mann, Marge Barrett, and Dick Keusink

The minutes of the July 12, 1966 Council meeting were read and approved.

Ordinance No. 184 was read to the Council in its entirety. A motion was made by Ernest Christensen that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 184 be read the second time by title only. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. The Ordinance was then read the second time by title only. Ernest Christensen made a motion that the Ordinance be read the third time by title and declaring an emergemcy be placed upon its final passage and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Ben Franklin seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. The Ordinance was read the third time by title only. The vote on Ordinance No. 184 was as follows:

Ordinance No. 184 having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

Lloyd Mosier made a motion that rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 185 be read the second time by title only. The Ordinance was then read the second time by title only. Lloyd Mosier made a motion that the Ordinance be read the third time by title and declaring an emergency be placed upon its final passageand that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Ben Franklin seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously. Following the reading of the Ordinance the third time by title only, the following vote resulted:

Absent: Henry Kerr.

Ordinance No. 185, having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

Ordinance No. 186 was read in its entirety. Ernest Christensen made a motion that the rules be suspended and an emergency be declared and that Ordinance No. 186 be read the second time by title only. Following a second by Ben Frankfin, the motion carried unanimously. The Ordinance was read the second time by title only. Ernest Christensen made a motion that the Ordinance be read a third time by title and declaring an emergency be placed upon its final passage and that it be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Following a second by Ben Franklin, the Ordinance was then read the third time by title only. The vote on Ordinance No. 186 was as follows:

Nayes: none

Absent: Henry Kerr.

Ordinance No. 186, having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

Bids for employee life insurance were once again tabled in order that consolidation with the City's present health and accident policy may be investigated. The question of a possible conflict between this type of policy and the State Industrial Accident policy was also raised.

City Draftsman Jerry Swanson reported that he was working on the center-line survey which the Council requested, but that he has been unable to complete it as yet.

Roy Erichsen discussed preliminary plans for the new City Hall with the Council. Several changes were suggested by Judge Fell Campbell and the various department heads. Mr. Erichsen said that he would incorporate the changes into the preliminary plans and discuss them further with the Council at a later date.

A report on the Memory Lane Lift Station was also presented to the Council by Mr. Erichsen. He stated that the location<sup>th</sup> which he proposed would be deep enough to serve all the population in the area, and that it could handle approximately 2,200 persons. Mr. Erichsen strongly recommended that the existing line be expanded and replaced, as this would be the best way to correct the present problem.

Elmer Bankus discussed the possibility of constructing a rock wall along the frontage road leading to Fifth Street with the Council. The Council requested that City Draftsman Jerry Swanson work out the details of this proposal with Elmer Bankus.

Vouchers totaling \$3,920.23 were presented for payment. Lloyd Mosier made a motion that the vouchers be paid. Ernest Christensen seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. Ernest Christensen made a motion that the meeting be adjourned. Henry Kerr seconded the motion, and it met with unanimous approval. The meeting was then adjourned at 9:30 p. m.
