

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF BROOKINGS
MARCH 8, 1966

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Mayor Bruce J. Manley.

Councilmen present at the meeting were Ernest Christensen, Henry Kerr, Lloyd Mosier and Ben Franklin, Jr.

Reporters in attendance were Dick Kuesink, Marge Barrett and Ruth Brewer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Letters from Schuler, Rankin, Myers & Walsh and the Brookings Fire Department were read and are attached hereto. Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that the fire call charge be waived as was requested in the letter. This was seconded by Lloyd Mosier and passed unanimously.

Byron Brömm appeared before the Council and requested permission to erect a 20' by 60' metal prefabricated home on his lot within the City limits. There was considerable discussion as to whether this structure represents a trailer house or a prefabricated home. City Attorney Bill Balderree suggested that Mr. Brimm present Building Inspector Lee Fountain with specific plans of the structure. If it is in compliance with the Uniform Building Code, zoning restrictions, and the State of Oregon electrical and plumbing codes, a permit should be issued.

Ordinance No. 183 was read to the Council in its entirety by City Attorney Bill Balderree. Vern Garvin and the Council discussed the Ordinance. In this discussion, Vern Garvin stated that a "subscriber" as used in the Ordinance consists of one person. A MOTION was made by Ernest Christensen that the franchise rate be changed to 2% of the gross profits. This motion was seconded by Ben Franklin, Jr. and passed unanimously. Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that the word "T.V." be stricken from the Ordinance title. This was seconded by Henry Kerr and passed unanimously. Ernest Christensen then made a MOTION that Section 7 be amended so that pavement cuts be made to conform with the existing City Ordinance. Following a second by Lloyd Mosier, the motion met with unanimous approval. The Council then requested that the City Attorney rewrite the Ordinance for presentation at the next Council meeting.

Bids for furnishing the City of Brookings with Comprehensive Liability Insurance for the year 1966-67 were opened and read aloud. Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that the low bid of \$1,617.40 as submitted by Farmers Insurance Group be accepted, subject to approval of the policy by the City Attorney. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Ben Franklin, Jr. made a MOTION that the bid on gasoline purchases submitted by the Brookings Mobil Service at the February 8, 1966, Council meeting for the prevailing pump rate less 3¢ per gallon be accepted. Lloyd Mosier seconded the motion and it was unanimously passed.


The date of the first meeting of the Budget Committee for the 1966-67 budget was tentatively set at April 8, 1966.


City Draftsman Jerry Swanson discussed the Memory Lane overflow situation with the Council. The City Draftsman was instructed to submit plans for correcting the problem at the next Council meeting.

Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that an application seeking State Street Aid for Fern Street between Highway 101 Chetco Ave. and Pacific Ave. be submitted. Henry Kerr seconded the motion and it was unanimously passed. Copy Attached hereto.


Vouchers totaling \$3,614.20 were submitted for payment. Ernest Christensen made a MOTION that the vouchers be paid. This motion was seconded by Lloyd Mosier and passed unanimously.

Following a MOTION by Ernest Christensen and second by Ben Franklin, Jr., the meeting was adjourned at 10:25 P. M.



"Ashes Are No Asset"

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, under the provisions of ORS 366.800 and 366.805 there has been withdrawn from state highway funds appropriated for allocation to the several cities of the State of Oregon the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 (\$250,000) Dollars, and said sum has been set up in a separate account to be administered by the State Highway Commission and to be spent each year by said Commission upon streets not a part of the state highway system, within cities, which are receiving excessive wear through sudden increases in population in the area or heavy and unusual traffic; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brookings is an incorporated city of the State of Oregon and has a population of 2747 as given by the latest official census; and

WHEREAS, the following streets of said city, _____

Fern Street, between U. S. 101, Chetco Ave. and Pacific
Avenue;

are not a part or parts of the state highway system, but are streets under the jurisdiction and control of said city which are "receiving excessive wear through sudden increase in population in the area, or heavy and unusual traffic," and

WHEREAS, said streets are and each of them is in need of repair, reconditioning, and other major improvement,

NOW, THEREFORE, the members of the City Council, in regular or special session assembled, do hereby find, declare, and resolve:

1. That the aforesaid named streets of said city are in need of repair, reconditioning, and other major improvement.

2. That said streets are in their present state and condition of disrepair by reason of excessive wear through sudden increases in population in the area, or by heavy and unusual traffic.

3. That the Oregon State Highway Commission hereby is respectfully requested to consider and declare said streets as qualified for reconditioning, repair, and other improvement out of funds allocated and made available by and through the said \$250,000 appropriation of state highway revenues which is to be administered and spent by the Highway Commission.

4. That the City of Brookings does hereby offer to State Highway Commission, and does hereby pledge complete cooperation and assistance to the end that said city may share and participate in the use and benefit of said special fund and appropriation; and therefore does designate Jerry R. Swanson as the official representative of the city in all negotiations resulting from this request.

Passed and approved this 8th day of March, 1966.

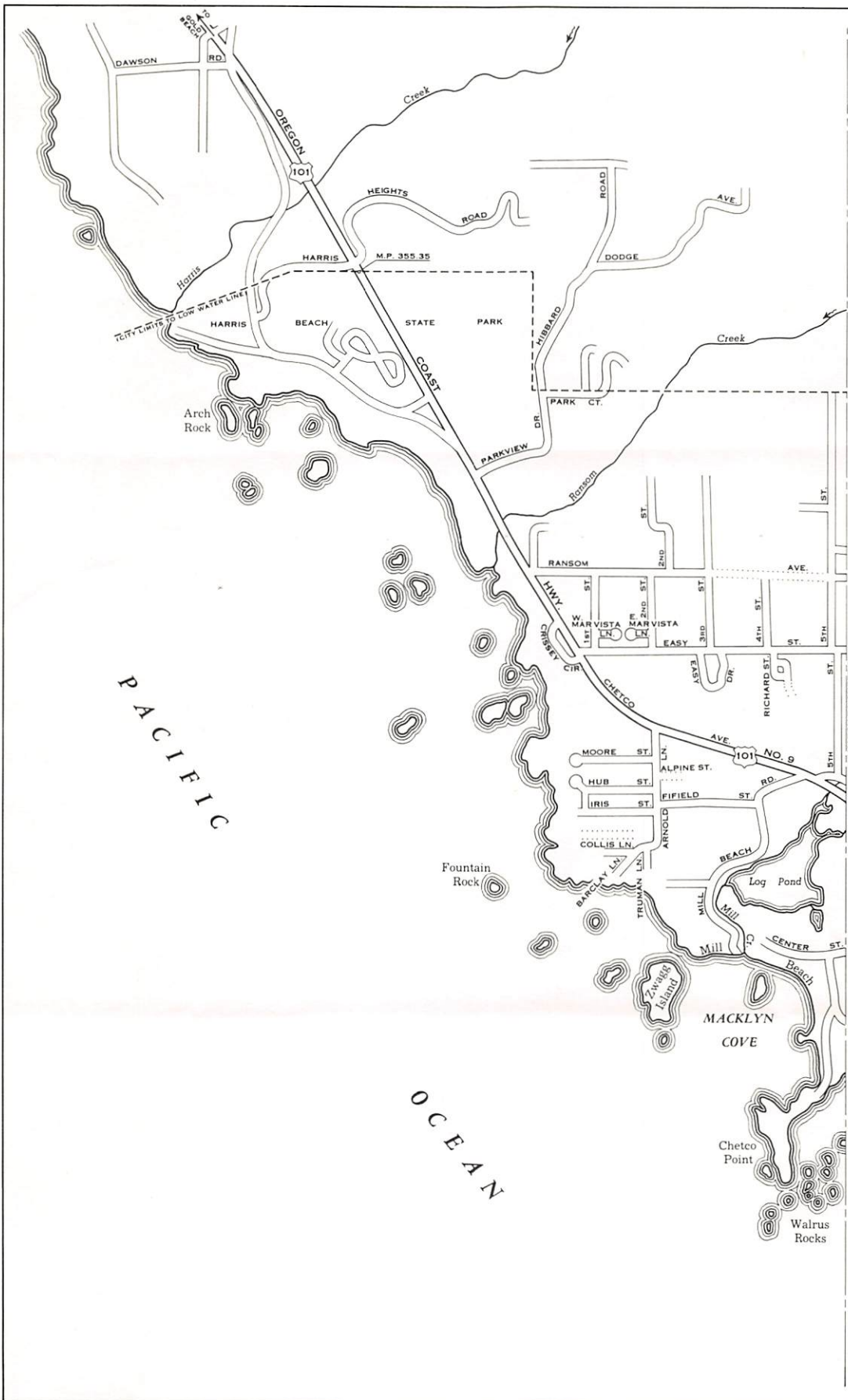

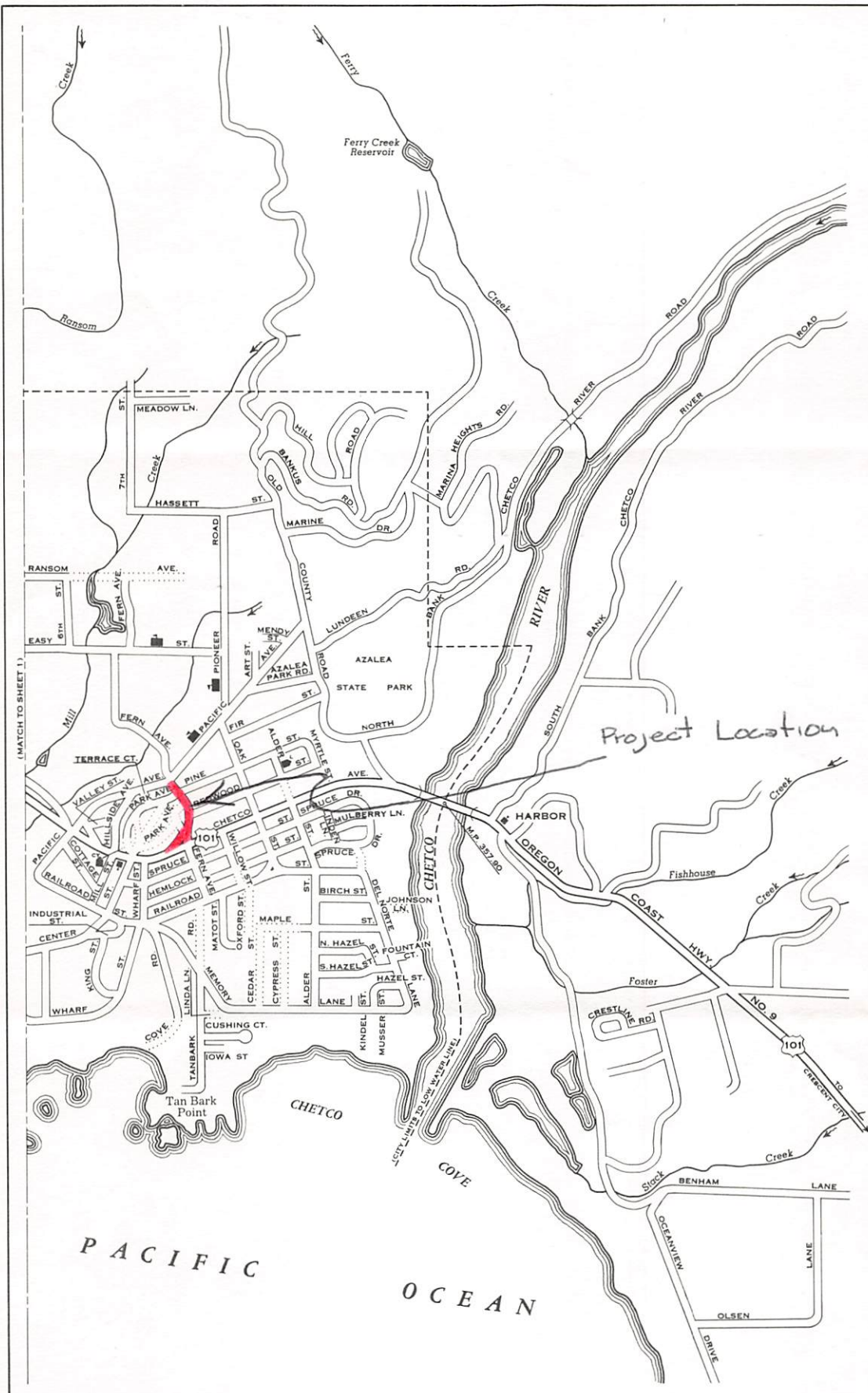
