MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
JANUARY 12, 1965

Meeting called to order at 8:00 P. M., Mayor Bruce J. Manley presiding. Councilmen present: Ben Franklin, Jr., Ernest Christensen, Lloyd Mosier. Reporters present: Dick Kuesink, Marge Barrett & Ruth Brewer.

Minutes of the last regular council meeting were read and approved as read.

Motion by Ernest Christensen that the extended insurance policy on fireman, that was set forth by Fire Chief Robert Kerr be accepted. Seconded by Lloyd Mosier. Motion carried.

MOTION by Ernest Christensen that the bid on gasoline purchases submitted by Brookings Mobil Service, for furnishing gasoline for use in City Equipment for the 12 month period commencing January 15, 1965, at the prevailing rate less 3¢ per gallon, delivered at the Brookings Mobil Station, Brookings, Oregon be accepted. Seconded by Ben Franklin, Jr. Motion carried.

MOTION by Ben Franklin, Jr. that the Recorders office is to advertise two times in the local newspaper for fuel oil purchases, so that the bids can be opened at the February meeting as the present agreement with the Richfield Oil Corp. expires February 15, 1965. Seconded by Ernest Christensen, Motion carried.

Mr. Lee Fountain, building inspector, was requested by Planning Commission to suggest off street parking consideration. This suggestion tabled until January 21st meeting.

MOTION by Ernest Christensen to table until January 21st. meeting the problem of hauling logs over non designated truck route streets. Seconded by Ben Franklin, Jr. Motion carried.


Vouchers totalling \$3,350.54 were submitted for review & approval. See attached list.


MOTION by Ernest Christensen that this meeting be extended until January 21, 1965. Seconded by Ben Franklin, Jr. Motion carried.
