

CITY OF BROOKINGS
MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
JULY 14, 1964

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 8:00 P. M., MAYOR BYRON L. BRIMM PRESIDING.

COUNCILMEN PRESENT: ERNEST CHRISTENSEN, BEN FRANKLIN, JR. AND LEROY WEIDEMAN. REPORTERS PRESENT: DICK KUESINK AND MARGE BARRETT.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS REGULAR AND SPECIAL MEETING WERE READ AND APPROVED AS READ.

MINUTES OF THE JULY 7, 1964 PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING WERE READ.

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION #88--MOTION BY LEROY WEIDEMAN THAT PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION #88 BE ACCEPTED. SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN FRANKLIN. MOTION CARRIED.

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION #89--THE COUNCIL ASKED THAT A LETTER BE ISSUED TO MR. ANDERSON AND TO THE COAST GUARD EXPLAINING THE CIRCUMSTANCES RELATIVE TO CEDAR STREET CONSTRUCTION AND THAT THE STREET WILL BE OILED AS SOON AS PRACTICAL, BUT NOT NECESSARILY WITHIN THE CURRENT YEAR. IT WAS NOTED THAT THE WATER LINE IN THE AREA OF MEMORY LANE AND CEDAR STREET HAS BEEN INSTALLED AT THE SAME LEVEL AS THE SEWER LINE AT THE POINT WHERE THE TWO LINES CROSS AND THAT THE WATER LINE WILL HAVE TO BE changed IN ORDER TO CORRECT THE SITUATION.

MOTION BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN THAT THE CITY PAY, NOT TO EXCEED \$100.00, FOR changing THE WATER LINE IF THE WORK IS COMPLETED IMMEDIATELY. SECONDED BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. MOTION CARRIED.

STREET SUPERINTENDENT, LES WILLIAMS, WAS AUTHORIZED TO OBTAIN BIDS FOR THE TOPPING AND REMOVAL OF TWO TREES LOCATED ON MYRTLE STREET, WHICH HAVE BEEN CLASSIFIED AS HAZARDOUS.

MR. EUGENE LAWRENCE REPORTED THAT HE IS DOING THE BEST HE CAN TOWARD THE DEMOLITION OF THE KRUGER BUILDING AND IS KEEPING THE AREA CLEANED UP AS THE WORK PROGRESSES. THE COUNCIL AGREED TO EXTEND THE TIME 30 DAYS, TO AUGUST 13, 1964, FOR COMPLETION OF DEMOLITION AND CLEANUP.

ORDINANCE NO. 178, PROVIDING CERTAIN TRAFFIC CONTROLS FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND PARKING LOTS, WAS READ IN FULL. MOTION BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN THAT THE RULES BE SUSPENDED AND AN EMERGENCY DECLARED AND THAT THE ORDINANCE BE READ THE SECOND TIME BY TITLE ONLY. MOTION SECONDED BY LEROY WEIDEMAN. CARRIED. THE ORDINANCE WAS THEN READ THE SECOND TIME BY TITLE. MOTION BY LEROY WEIDEMAN THAT IT BE READ A THIRD TIME BY TITLE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY BE PLACED UPON ITS FINAL PASSAGE AND THAT IT BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE. MOTION SECONDED BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. CARRIED. THE ORDINANCE WAS THEN READ THE THIRD TIME BY TITLE, WHEREUPON THE MAYOR STATED THE MOTION AND ASKED FOR A ROLL CALL VOTE WHICH RESULTED AS FOLLOWS:

ORDINANCE NO. 178, HAVING RECEIVED THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF VOTES, THE MAYOR DECLARED THE SAME TO HAVE DULY PASSED AND TO HAVE BEEN DULY ADOPTED.

A PETITION PROTESTING DISTURBING NOISES AND FUMES FROM TRUCK REPAIR SHOPS OPERATING IN THE AREA OF 7TH AND RANSOM WAS PRESENTED TO THE COUNCIL BY MRS. ZONA M. GEANEY. SHE ALSO SUBMITTED A LIST OF DISTURBANCES BY DATES FOR THE MONTH OF JULY TO DATE. POLICE CHIEF, C. M. CROSS, WAS ASKED TO CONTACT THE OWNERS OF THE SHOPS AND INFORM THEM OF THE COMPLAINTS TO DETERMINE IF THE MATTER CAN BE CONTROLLED TO THE SATISFACTION OF EVERYONE IN THE AREA.

IN ANSWER TO THE QUESTIONS OF SEVERAL PERSONS PRESENT, GENERAL INFORMATION WAS GIVEN PERTAINING TO SEWER DISTRICTS AND COLLECTION POLICIES OF THE CITY.

RESOLUTION #104-APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL PLANNING ADVANCE.

MOTION BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN THAT RESOLUTION #104 BE ADOPTED. SECONDED BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. THAT MR. CALVIN J. GORTE BE APPOINTED AS A MEMBER OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION FOR A TERM TO APRIL 21, 1968. SECONDED BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN. MOTION CARRIED.

IT WAS NOTED THAT THE COUNTY HAS PUBLISHED NOTICE FOR SALE OF PROPERTY AND THAT THE CITY HAS AN UNRECORDED LIEN INTEREST APPROXIMATE AMOUNT OF \$900.00 IN PARCEL No. 9 ON SAID LIST. (TL3500-41-13-5BB LOCATED AT 701 OLD COUNTY ROAD, ACCT #4-229 AND P4NB). THE COUNCIL ASKED THAT THE CITY ATTORNEY INVESTIGATE THE MATTER AND TAKE WHATEVER ACTION HE DEEMS TO BE TO THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE CITY.

MOTION BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. THAT IN THE EVENT THE APPROXIMATE 20 FOOT STRIP ON THE NORTHERLY SIDE OF AZALEA PARK ROAD IS OFFERED FOR CONVEYANCE TO THE CITY BY THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, BASED UPON THE SAME CONDITIONS AS CONTAINED IN THAT CERTAIN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY AND THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT DATED AUGUST 17, 1955, THE CITY ACCEPT SUCH CONVEYANCE CONDITIONED UPON RECEIPT OF A DEED FOR THE ENTIRE STREET. MOTION SECONDED BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN. MOTION CARRIED.

THE MAYOR UPON APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL APPOINTED MR. OLIVER MOODY AS SANITARY INSPECTOR FOR THE CITY.

ATTORNEY, W. W. BALDERREE, REPORTED ON THE PROGRESS MADE THUS FAR CONCERNING THE BROOKINGS PLYWOOD SEWER MATTER. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE CONSULTING ENGINEERS LOOK OVER THE SITUATION NEXT TIME THEY ARE IN BROOKINGS AND THAT A LETTER BE SUBMITTED TO THE CITY INDICATING THEIR VIEWS ON THE MATTER.

MOTION BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN THAT A LICENSE BE ISSUED TO OWEN J. CARTER FOR THE OPERATION OF HIS BUSINESS FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1965. MOTION SECONDED BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. CARRIED.

THE COUNCIL ACCEPTED THE RESIGNATION OF MUNICIPAL JUDGE WILLIAM L. BATES, EFFECTIVE JUNE 30, 1964.

IN RESPONSE TO A REQUEST BY THE MAYOR, A LETTER FROM THE GOVERNOR INDICATED THAT THE STATE WOULD GIVE CAREFUL ATTENTION CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN EMPLOYMENT OFFICE IN BROOKINGS.

ANOTHER LETTER FROM THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE, RELATIVE TO SUPPLYING DATA RELATIVE TO EXISTING AND/OR PLANNED OUTDOOR RECREATION PROGRAMS, POTENTIAL NEEDS, SITE AVAILABILITY, ETC., WAS READ.

A LETTER FROM THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT INDICATED THAT THEY WOULD STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF STRAIGHTENING A PORTION OF CHETOO AVENUE WEST OF OAK STREET. THEY ALSO EXPLAINED THAT THE DEEP DITCH, EASTERLY OF, AND ADJACENT TO THE NEW SCALE SITE IS A NATURAL CONDITION WHICH THEY COULD NOT SEE A POSSIBILITY OF ALTERING IN THE NEAR FUTURE WHEN COST AND NEED IS CONSIDERED.

A LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE TO THE POSITION OF CITY DRAFTSMAN FROM JERRY SWANSON, INFORMING THE COUNCIL THAT HE COULD COMMENCE EMPLOYMENT ON JULY 20, 1964, WAS SUBMITTED.

IT WAS NOTED THAT A PLANNING AND ZONING COMMITTEE HAS BEEN APPOINTED BY THE PLANNING COMMISSION.

COUNCILMAN WEIDEMAN INFORMED THE COUNCIL THAT HE IS STILL WORKING ON THE "STREET CUT" ORDINANCE.

IT WAS NOTED BY ROBERT KERR AND C. M. CROSS THAT PHONE CALLS COULD *Not Be* TRACED IN BROOKINGS AND THAT THERE HAS BEEN SOME DIFFICULTY EXPERIENCED IN THIS REGARD. IT WAS NOTED THAT MR. GEORGE MCBRIDE, AN OFFICIAL OF THE TELEPHONE CO. HAS OFFERED TO SCHEDULE A MEETING IN BROOKINGS IN CONNECTION WITH ANY COMPLAINTS ETC. THE COUNCIL REQUESTED THAT A MEETING BE ARRANGED WITH THE OFFICIAL WITH NOTIFICATION TO COMPLAINTANTS, OR OTHERS INTERESTED, TO ATTEND.

THE COUNCIL AUTHORIZED THE RECORDER TO ADVERTISE FOR THE SALE OF THE OLD WATER WAGON AND OTHER TANKS AND EQUIPMENT FOR WHICH THE CITY HAS NO FURTHER USE. THE MAYOR INDICATED THAT COUNCILMAN FRANKLIN HAS APPRAISED THE WATER WAGON AT \$150.00.

APPLICATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF MUNICIPAL JUDGE WERE SET ASIDE FOR THE PRESENT TIME AND IT WAS AGREED THAT THE JUDGE PRO-TEM CONTINUE IN THE CAPACITY OF JUDGE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

FIRE CHIEF, ROBERT KERR NOTED THAT THE FIRE DEPARTMENT HAS EXPERIENCED DIFFICULTY IN DISTINGUISHING STREET NAMES IN CASES WHERE THE NAMES SOUND THE SAME OVER THE PHONE OR RADIO AND RECOMMENDED THAT THE PROBLEM BE CONSIDERED IN THE NAMING OF ANY NEW STREETS.

STREET SUPERINTENDENT, LES WILLIAMS ASKED THAT THE CITY TAKE STEPS TO FENCE THE WAREHOUSE AREA AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. HE WAS AUTHORIZED TO CHECK OUT THE COST OF MATERIALS, ETC. AND PRESENT A PROPOSAL WHEREBY THE CITY CAN PROCEED WITH THE JOB, BY CONTRACT BID OR OTHERWISE. MR. WILLIAMS WAS ALSO AUTHORIZED TO USE GALVANIZED CULVERT PIPE WHEN AND WHERE REQUIRED RATHER THAN CONCRETE PIPE.

POLICE CHIEF, C. M. CROSS, EXPLAINED THAT HE HAS SEVERAL APPLICATIONS UNDER REVIEW FOR THE POSITION OF POLICE PATROLMAN BUT THAT HE HAS NO RECOMMENDATIONS AT THE PRESENT TIME.

SEWER PLANT OPERATOR, OLIVER MOODY, EXPLAINED THAT HE IS EXPERIENCING DIFFICULTY IN SOME AREAS OF THE PLANT OPERATION DUE TO THE BAD CONDITION OF SOME OF THE EQUIPMENT AND THAT HE WOULD TAKE STEPS TO RECTIFY THE PROBLEMS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THE COUNCIL ASKED THAT THE CONSULTING ENGINEERS CHECK OUT THESE CONDITIONS WITH MR. MOODY, THE NEXT TIME THEY ARE IN BROOKINGS.

RESOLUTION #105-PERSONNEL WAS READ IN FULL. MOTION BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR., THAT RESOLUTION #105 BE ADOPTED. SECONDED BY LEROY WEIDEMAN. MOTION CARRIED.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND VOUCHERS WERE PRESENTED AND REVIEWED. (VOUCHERS TOTALLING \$3,485.19)

MOTION BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN THAT THE VOUCHERS BE APPROVED AND PAID. SECONDED BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY BEN FRANKLIN, JR. THAT THE MEETING BE ADJOURNED. SECONDED BY ERNEST CHRISTENSEN, MOTION CARRIED.
