

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
MARCH 13, 1962

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 8:00 P. M.: MAYOR C. F. CAMPBELL PRESIDING.  
COUNCILMEN PRESENT: JOHN COX, ERNIE CHRISTENSEN, BEN FRANKLIN JR., ROBERT  
DIMMICK. OTHERS PRESENT: POLICE CHIEF, C. M. CROSS; PUBLIC WORKS SUPT.  
FRANK HARRISON; REPORTERS, BARON AND BARRETT.

SEALED BIDS FOR FURNISHING A DUMP TRUCK TO THE CITY WERE OPENED. BROOKINGS  
SUPPLY INC., 1962 INTERNATIONAL MODEL C-1640 \$4925.00. AKIN MOTOR CO.-  
1962 FORD--\$4878.38.

MOTION BY ROBERT DIMMICK THAT THE LOW BID OF AKIN MOTOR CO. BE ACCEPTED  
WITH DELIVERY TO BE MADE ON OR BEFORE 60 DAYS FROM DATE. MOTION SECONDED  
BY ERNIE CHRISTENSEN. CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

THE URGENT NEED FOR A FRONT END LOADER WAS DISCUSSED. MR. HARRISON  
REMINDS THE COUNCILMEN OF THE TIME LIMIT ON THE TRADE-IN ALLOWANCE FOR  
THE 922 CATERPILLAR.

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING HELD JANUARY 19, AND THE LAST REGULAR  
MEETING HELD FEBRUARY 13, 1962, WERE READ AND APPROVED AS READ.

MAYOR CAMPBELL EXPLAINED THAT THE STATE HIGHWAY ENGINEERS WERE NOW IN THE  
PROCESS OF PRELIMINARY SURVEY WORK ON CENTER STREET.  
IN CONNECTION WITH THE 5TH. STREET ENTRANCE FROM THE HIGHWAY, IT WAS SUGGESTED  
THAT THE PROPERTY BELONGING TO THE CITY IN THE AFFECTED AREA, BE DEEDED TO  
MR. BANKUS, WHO IN TURN WOULD DEED IT BACK TO THE CITY WITH USE RESTRICTIONS  
WRITTEN INTO THE DEED, TOGETHER WITH THE STRIP OF PROPERTY OWNED BY HIM, WHICH  
IS NECESSARY FOR FULL AND SATISFACTORY ACCESS.

A PETITION FOR BILLBOARD CONTROL CONTAINING 63 SIGNATURES WAS SUBMITTED.  
IT WAS NOTED THAT THE BILLBOARD WHICH WAS RECENTLY ERECTED ON NORTH CHETCO  
AVENUE WAS SO CONSTRUCTED TO CONFORM WITH THE REQUIREMENTS AS PROVIDED IN  
ORDINANCE NO. 64. IN ORDER TO PRECLUDE INDISCRIMINATE PLACING OF BILLBOARDS  
UNTIL SUCH TIME AS FURTHER STUDY AND A CONTROLLING ORDINANCE CAN BE ADOPTED,  
THE CITY ATTORNEY WAS INSTRUCTED TO DRAW UP A TEMPORARY MEASURE. THE CITY  
RECORDER WAS INSTRUCTED TO OBTAIN MODEL ORDINANCE'S, WHICH COULD BE USED AS  
A GUIDE FOR BROOKINGS.

BOB WILLIAMSON SPOKE ON BEHALF OF R. A. WILLIAMSON, REQUESTING PARKING SPACE  
IN FRONT OF HIS BUSINESS, LOCATED NEAR THE FIRE HALL.. AFTER DISCUSSION,  
POLICE CHIEF C. M. CROSS WAS INSTRUCTED TO PROCEED WITH THE PLANNING OF PARKING  
METERS WHERE FEASIBLE IN THE AREA, WHICH WOULD NOT INTERFERE WITH POLICE PARK-  
ING OR THE FIRE STATION ACCESS, WITH ALLOWANCE FOR DOUBLE PARKING FOR THE  
GREYHOUND BUSES, IF NECESSARY AND FEASIBLE.

RESOLUTION NO. 75--RESOLUTION FOR PROCEEDINGS TO VACATE ALLEY.  
MOTION BY COUNCILMAN CHRISTENSEN THAT RESOLUTION NO. 75 BE ADOPTED. SECONDED  
BY ROBERT DIMMICK, MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION NO. 64--REGARDING OFFSTREET PARKING FOR  
TOURISTS WAS DISCUSSED BUT NO DEFINITE CONCLUSION WAS REACHED NOR ACTION  
TAKEN THEREON.

SALES CONTRACT BETWEEN CITY OF BROOKINGS AND PENNSALT CHEMICAL CORP. FOR  
FURNISHING CYLINDER CHLORINE FOR THE DISPOSAL PLANT FOR THE PERIOD FROM MAY 1,  
1962 TO APRIL 30, 1963 WAS SUBMITTED. MOTION BY COUNCILMAN CHRISTENSEN THAT  
THE CONTRACT BE ACCEPTED AND THAT MAYOR CAMPBELL BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN SAID  
CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY. MOTION SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN COX. MOTION  
CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOTION BY COUNCILMAN FRANKLIN THAT MAYOR CAMPBELL BE AUTHORIZED TO ATTEND THE OREGON COAST ASSOCIATION CONVENTION AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF THIS AREA; SAID CONVENTION TO BE HELD AT SEASIDE, OREGON ON APRIL 7, 8, AND 9, 1962. MOTION SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN DIMMICK. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

SEVERAL MATTERS OF CORRESPONDENCE WERE PRESENTED AND DISCUSSED INCLUDING A LETTER FROM AN ATTORNEY IN GOLD BEACH RELATING TO A STRIP OF PROPERTY ON MOORE STREET WHICH WAS PREVIOUSLY DEEDED TO THE CITY BY QUIT CLAIM DEED FROM A CONTRACT BUYER, WHO SUBSEQUENTLY DEFAULTED ON THE CONTRACT. THE MATTER WAS REFERRED TO CITY ATTORNEY; W. W. BALDERREE.

THE RECORDER WAS INSTRUCTED TO NOTIFY THE BUDGET COMMITTEE MEMBERS THAT A BUDGET MEETING WILL BE HELD ON MARCH 29, AT \*8:00 P. M. AT THE CITY HALL.

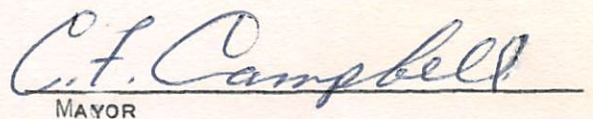

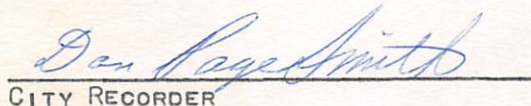
