Minutes of the Special Meeting

OF THE CITY COUNCIL

BROOKINGS, OREGON

April 27, 1961

The meeting was called to order by Mayor C. F. Campbell. Councilmen present were Ernest Christensen, William Hackney and Ben Franklin. Others present were City Administrator Darrell Swatzel, Mrs. English, Mrs. Geaney, Elmer Bankus and Marjorie Barrett.

The Mayor explained the purpose of the meeting was to hear any person in favor of or opposed to the proposed budget for fiscal year, 1961-62.

Mr. Bankus stated that he had a question concerning the funds in Sewer Dist. 1. Mayor Campbell explained the cost of Sewer Dist. 1 including Pacific Street and that the amount on hand was approximately \$21,000.00. Mr. Bankus asked if a warehouse wasn't supposed to be built. Mayor Campbell explained that the warehouse was included in the \$150,000.00 bond issue, however all the funds were needed for the disposal plant and the out-fall sewer line.

Mrs. Geaney wanted to know if a sewer line was to be installed on 6th Street, also the cost of the sewer. The Administrator explained that preliminary work was being done for a sewer district in that area. Mrs. Geaney also wanted to know if a pump station was to be installed. She was assured that no pump station was to be installed in that area.

Mrs. Geaney wanted the budget on Parks & Recreation explained. Mayor Campbell explained it was set forth in the budget, in the event that funds were donated to the City, the City could then use them for Parks & Recreation. He further explained that there was no taxation connected with this item but that the expenditure was off-set by the receipt in the same amount.

Mayor Campbell gave a general description of the sewer system, street maintenance and water system for the City.

Mrs. English stated she was present to answer any questions she could concerning the library budget.

There being no further questions, a motion was made by Ernest Christensen and seconed by William Hackney that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.
