

MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

BROOKINGS, OREGON

AUGUST 8, 1961

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 8:00 P.M., MAYOR C. F. CAMPBELL, PRESIDING.
COUNCILMEN PRESENT: JOHN COX, BEN FRANKLIN, JR., ERNIE CHRISTENSEN, ROBERT DIMMICK. OTHERS PRESENT: CITY ATTORNEY, W. W. BALDERREE; POLICE CHIEF, C. M. CROSS; CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE, ROY WEIDEMAN, HARROUN; CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, PRESIDENT CY ZIGLER; REPORTERS, GLINES & BARRETT; JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, DON BARTH, & DR. MCCHESSNEY.

MINUTES OF JULY 13, 1961, WERE READ AND APPROVED AS READ.

BIDS ON THE SALE OF CITY OF BROOKINGS IMPROVEMENT BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$ 24,135.14 WERE OPENED AND READ BY THE CITY RECORDER. THE FOLLOWING BIDS WERE RECEIVED AND READ. THE UNITED STATES NATIONAL BANK BID \$100.35 ON THE PAR VALUE OF EACH \$100 WITH INTEREST AT THE RATE OF 3,9413% ON THE BONDS. THE BID OF THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF OREGON, PORTLAND BRANCH BID \$100.37 WITH EFFECTIVE INTEREST RATE OF 3.938%.

MOTION BY COUNCILMAN CHRISTENSEN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BEN FRANKLIN, JR. THAT THE COUNCIL ACCEPT THE BID OF THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF OREGON, OF PORTLAND, OREGON. MOTION CARRIED.

COUNCILMAN COX WAS WELCOMED TO THE CITY COUNCIL AS ITS NEWEST MEMBER, BY MAYOR CAMPBELL. MAYOR CAMPBELL EXPLAINED TO COUNCILMAN COX THE DUTIES OF A COUNCILMAN AND ALSO EXTENDED THE APPRECIATION OF THE COUNCIL ON HIS ACCEPTING THE OFFICE OF COUNCILMAN.

X DON BARTH & DR. MCCHESSNEY ASKED THE COUNCIL TO WRITE A LETTER TO THE JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE PERMITTING THEM TO CONSTRUCT A POINT OF INTEREST IN THE AREA OF TWO PARKING METER SPACES IN THE PARKING ZONE IN FRONT OF THE CENTRAL BUILDING. THE JUNIOR CHAMBER PROPOSED TO BUILD AND CONSTRUCT A WHALE SUCH AS THAT USED IN THE AZALEA FESTIVAL PARADE. THIS POINT OF INTEREST WOULD BE A REPLICA OF A WHALE SPOUTING, ALSO, WITH BENCHES FOR TOURIST TO STOP AND REST AWHILE. THEY FELT THAT THIS POINT OF INTEREST WOULD ATTRACT TOURIST AND CAUSE THEM TO STAY A LITTLE LONGER IN THE CITY OF BROOKINGS.

MOTION BY COUNCILMAN COX, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN DIMMICK, THAT THE CITY RECORDER WRITE A LETTER TO THE U. S. JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, BROOKINGS, GRANTING THEM PERMISSION TO ERECT A REPLICA OF THE SPOUTING WHALE. MOTION CARRIED.

MR. S. E. ALDEN OF WHARF STREET REGISTERED A COMPLAINT WITH THE CITY COUNCIL THAT SAW DUST FROM THE SAWMILL AND PLYWOOD PLANTS WAS RUINING HIS PROPERTY. HE ASKED THAT THE COUNCIL TAKE SOME ACTION TO HAVE THIS NUISANCE STOPPED.

MOTION BY COUNCILMAN CHRISTENSEN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN COX THAT THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR WRITE A LETTER TO THE BROOKINGS PLYWOOD CORPORATION ASKING THEM TO TAKE SOME ACTION TO CONTROL THE FLYING OF SAWDUST FROM THE MILL OVER THE CITY. MOTION CARRIED

DARRELL SWATZEL READ A LETTER FROM THE STATE CENSUS BOARD REGARDING THE POPULATION COUNT OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS. EXPLAINING THE BASES OF CENSUS CERTIFICATION.

MR. SWATZEL GAVE A REPORT ON THE MEETING BETWEEN THE CITY REPRESENTATIVES AND WILLIAM SCHROEDER REGARDING THE SETTLEMENT OF THE DIFFERENCE ON THE COMPLETION OF THE PUMP STATION AND THE DISPOSAL PLANT. HE STATED THAT A SATISFACTORY SETTLEMENT HAD BEEN REACHED. HE STATED THAT AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CITY ATTORNEY THAT THE CITY SHOULD NOT PAY THE 2% DISCOUNT TAKEN BY SCHROEDER ON THE WARRANTS ISSUED BY THE CITY TO HIM.

MR. SWATZEL GAVE A REPORT ON THE MEETING OF THE TRAILER COMMITTEE. HE STATED THAT THE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED THAT THE CITY PERMIT TRAILER PARKING ONLY IF THE OWNER OF THE LOTS PLANNED TO BUILD WITHIN THE YEAR. OTHERWISE, TRAILERS BE ALLOWED IN TRAILER PARKS ONLY.

IT WAS THE OPINION OF THE COUNCIL THAT THERE WAS NO EMERGENCY ON THE TRAILER ISSUE AND THAT IT BE SHELVED UNTIL FURTHER STUDY AND INVESTIGATION CAN BE MADE. MR. SWATZEL WAS APPOINTED TO TALK WITH THE OFFICERS OF BROOKINGS ENTERPRISE CORPORATION AND SEE WHAT THEY WERE GOING TO DO ABOUT FINISHING THE TRAILER COURT NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

MOTION BY COUNCILMAN BEN FRANKLIN, JR. THAT THE CITY CONSULTING ENGINEER BE AUTHORIZED TO DESIGN AND DRAW UP A PLAN FOR THE WATER SYSTEM AND GIVE THE ESTIMATED COST OF SAID SYSTEM, FOR THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, ALSO TO MAKE AN APPRAISAL OF THE NOW EXISTING SYSTEM, BASED ON THE INFORMATION AVAILABLE. SUCH PLANS AND DESIGNING BE SUBJECT TO THE PRESENT EXISTING CONTRACT WITH THE FEDERAL HOUSING AND HOME AUTHORITY, SEATTLE, WASHINGTON. MOTION SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN CHRISTENSEN. MOTION CARRIED.

MAYOR CAMPBELL SUGGESTED THE NAME OF JAMES SPLANE AS CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR. HE WAS INSTRUCTED TO CONTACT MR. SPLANE AND SEE IF HE WOULD SERVE IN THIS CAPACITY.


