

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING  
OF THE CITY COUNCIL

BROOKINGS, OREGON  
NOVEMBER 2, 1961

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 8:00 P. M., MAYOR C. F. CAMPBELL PRESIDING.  
COUNCILMEN PRESENT: JOHN COX, ERNIE CHRISTENSEN, AND ROBERT DIMMICK.  
OTHERS PRESENT: REPORTERS; MARGE BARRETT, FRANK ECKBLOM AND JERRY BARRON,  
POLICE CHIEF C. M. CROSS; STREET SUPT. FRANK HARRISON, DOUGLAS GOLDSBERRY AND  
DOYLE RAUSCH, CIVIL DEFENSE APPOINTEES; CONTRACTOR, GARY WIMBERLY; FIRE CHIEF,  
ROBERT KERR.

MAYOR CAMPBELL NOTED THAT THE HIGHWAY COMMISSION WILL MEET ON NOV. 8, 1961, AND  
WILL PROBABLY TAKE UP THE MATTER OF THE CITY'S REQUEST IN CONNECTION WITH OB-  
TAINING STATE EXCESS PROPERTY.

THE NEXT ORDER OF BUSINESS WAS THE APPOINTMENT OF A CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR.  
MOTION BY ERNIE CHRISTENSEN THAT DOUGLAS GOLDSBERRY BE APPOINTED AS CIVIL DEFENSE  
DIRECTOR AND DOYLE RAUSCH BE APPOINTED AS HIS ASSISTANT. SECONDED BY JOHN  
COX. MOTION CARRIED.

THE COUNCIL AUTHORIZED MILEAGE FOR THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR AND HIS ASSISTANT  
BASED ON 10¢ PER MILE. EXPENSES INCURRED FOR THEIR OFFICE ARE TO BE PAID FROM  
THE CIVIL DEFENSE FUND AND THE EMERGENCY FUND, AS REQUIRED. THE NEW DIRECTOR  
WAS AUTHORIZED TO USE THE OFFICE AND VAULT FACILITIES AT THE CITY HALL AS HEAD-  
QUARTERS, AND THE COOPERATION OF THE MAYOR, COUNCIL AND CITY EMPLOYEES WAS ASSURED.

THE MATTER OF THE TANBARK SEWER AREA WAS NEXT ON THE ADGENDA. GARY WIMBERLY  
EXPLAINED THE METHOD PROPOSED AS A TEMPORARY SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM. THE COST,  
WHICH INCLUDES PIPE, CONCRETE AND MATERIALS TO BE FURNISHED BY THE CITY WAS SET  
AT \$890.00. HE EXPLAINED THAT HE COULD HAVE THE JOB COMPLETED IN A WEEK OR  
TEN DAYS, WEATHER CONDITIONS PERMITTING.

MOTION BY JOHN COX THAT THE CONTRACTOR, GARY WIMBERLY, BE AUTHORIZED TO COMPLETE  
THE JOB FOR THE COST AS STATED. SECONDED BY ROBERT DIMMICK. MOTION CARRIED.

A DISCUSSION FOLLOWED CONCERNING THE PROPOSED PUMPING STATION AND SEWER LINES IN  
THE TANBARK AREA. PROPERTY OWNERS IN THAT AREA WANTED ASSURANCE THAT THE STATION,  
LINES, ETC., WOULD NOT DEPRECIATE THEIR PROPERTY VALUES. MAYOR CAMPBELL STATED  
THAT THE CITY WOULD WORK WITH THE PROPERTY OWNERS TO THE BENEFIT OF ALL CONCERNED.

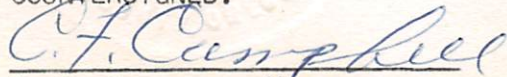
FIRE CHIEF, ROBERT KERR, ASKED THAT THE COUNCIL STATE ITS POSITION IN CONNECTION  
WITH THE USE OF FIRE EQUIPMENT OUTSIDE OF THE INCORPORATED AREAS OF THE CITY.  
AFTER A LENGTHY DISCUSSION IT WAS MOVED BY ROBERT DIMMICK AND SECONDED BY JOHN  
COX THAT ALL FIRE EQUIPMENT BE KEPT WITHIN THE CITY, EXCEPT WHEREBY MUTUAL AID  
ARRANGEMENTS ARE MADE IN ADVANCE WITH THE STATE AND COUNTY, AND ONLY THEN AT  
THEIR REQUEST. MOTION CARRIED. *EXCEPT BY CONTRACT WITH PRIVATE PARTIES*

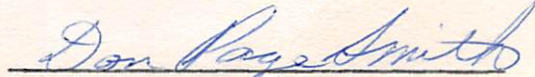
FRANK HARRISON BROUGHT UP THE MATTER CONCERNING THE PROPOSED PURCHASE OF A FIVE  
YARD DUMP TRUCK. IT WAS NOTED THAT BEN FRANKLIN JR., HAD APPROACHED THE COUNTY  
REGARDING A TRUCK WHICH THEY HAVE AVAILABLE, AND WHICH COULD BE PURCHASED FOR  
AROUND \$800.00. AFTER FURTHER DISCUSSION IT WAS DECIDED TO DO MORE CHECKING  
BEFORE PURCHASING A TRUCK. FRANK HARRISON WAS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE ARRANGEMENTS  
TO HAVE A TRUCK BROUGHT OVER FROM CRESCENT CITY FOR INSPECTION.

MAYOR CAMPBELL COMMENDED FRANK HARRISON FOR THE FINE JOB HE IS DOING IN CONNECTION  
WITH PUBLIC WORKS MATTERS.
