

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

OF THE CITY COUNCIL

BROOKINGS, OREGON

OCTOBER 11, 1960

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER BY MAYOR C. F. CAMPBELL PRESIDING, OCTOBER 11, 1960
AT 8:00 P.M.

COUNCILMEN PRESENT WERE PERCY HANKS, GORDON GOETZ, ERNEST CHRISTENSEN, AND
LELAND HEIN, ATTORNEY BALDERREE, DARREL SWATZEL, CHIEF CROSS, CONSULTING
ENGINEER, ERICHSSEN, RUSSELL JENKINS, MARJE BARRETT, AND MRS. HADLEY.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 13, WAS READ AND APPROVED.

MR. ERICHSSEN GAVE A REPORT ON THE PUMP STATION, AND ALSO THE PROGRESS BEING
MADE ON SEWER DISTRICT No. 10. HE STATED THAT THE PUMP STATION WAS WATER PROOF,
BUT HE STATED THAT THE COUNCIL SHOULD BE IN A BY-PASS AT THE PUMP STATION IN
CASE OF A POWER SHORTAGE. MR. ERICHSSEN GAVE A BREIF RESUME OF THE IMMEDIATE
PLANS THAT HE HAD IN CONNECTION WITH PRESENT PROPOSED WATER SYSTEM FOR THE
CITY OF BROOKINGS.

MR. ERICHSSEN WAS IN ACCORD WITH THE COUNCIL THAT THE CITY OF BROOKINGS SHOULD
FILE FOR THE WATER RIGHTS ON THE CHETCO. HE WAS INSTRUCTED TO DO SO.

COUNCILMAN GOETZ ASKED IF THE CITY COULD HOOK-UP THE PROPERTY OWNERS ON THE
SEWER LINE AS SOON AS THE PUMP STATION WAS COMPLETED. MR. ERICHSSEN STATED THAT
THE HOOK-UPS COULD BE MADE IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE PUMP STATION WAS COMPLETED.

MR. ERICHSSEN STATED THAT HE FELT THE CITY OF BROOKINGS NEEDED A 14-INCH WATER
LINE FROM THE CITY OF BROOKINGS WATER SUPPLY LEADING INTO THE CITY.

MR. CAMPBELL SUGGESTED THAT WE LOOK AT THE WATER SYSTEM IN THE SAME WAY AS WE
HAVE LOOKED AT THE SEWER SYSTEM AND BUILD FOR THE FUTURE.

COUNCILMAN HEIN ASKED IF THERE WERE ANY RECORDS KEPT OF THE FLOW OF WATER
THAT WENT OUT OF MEMORY LANE PUMP STATION. HE ALSO, WANTED TO KNOW IF THERE
WERE ANY INFILTRATION IN THE MEMORY LANE SEWER LINE.

MRS. HADLEY ASKED FOR A RAISE IN HER SALARY FROM \$13 A WEEK TO \$15 A WEEK.
THE RECORDER WAS INSTRUCTED TO ACT AS REQUESTED.

CHIEF CROSS ASKED THE COUNCIL TO SUPPLY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WITH A WALKIE-
TALKIE RADIO SYSTEM TO BE ABLE TO CO-ORDINATE POLICE WORK IN A MORE EFFICIENT
MANNER.

FIRE CHIEF KERR GAVE A BRIEF REPORT ON THE PROGRESS BEING MADE IN OUTFITTING
THE NEW FIRE TRUCK FOR THE CITY.

MR. SWATZEL GAVE A REPORT ON THE MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF
BROOKINGS AND THE HARBOR FIRE DISTRICT. MR. SWATZEL READ THE MUTUAL AID AGREE-
MENT.

MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN HEIN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN HANKS THAT THE MAYOR AND
CITY RECORDER BE AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT FOR THE CITY OF BROOKINGS.

MAYOR CAMPBELL CALLED FOR A VOTE BY ROLL CALL:

AYES: HEIN, GOETZ, CHRISTENSEN, HANKS, CAMPBELL
NAYES: NONE
ABSENT: NONE

ORDINANCE No. 155, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BROOKINGS IMPROVEMENT BONDS IN THE SUM OF \$109,181.90 PROVIDING AND APPROVING THE FORM OF THE BONDS TO BE ISSUED AND THE COUPONS TO BE ATTACHED THERETO, PROVIDING FOR THE ADVERTISEMENT AND SALE OF SAID BONDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, WAS READ THE FIRST TIME FULLY AND DISTINCTLY AT LENGTH.

THEREUPON COUNCILMAN CHRISTENSEN MOVED THAT THE RULES BE SUSPENDED AND AN EMERGENCY BE DECLARED AND THAT SAID ORDINANCE BE READ THE SECOND TIME BY TITLE ONLY. MOTION SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN HEIN. MOTION CARRIED.

MAYOR CAMPBELL THEN DECLARED THAT SAID MOTION HAD DULY CARRIED AND DIRECTED THAT ORDINANCE No. 155 BE READ THE SECOND TIME BY TITLE ONLY. SAID ORDINANCE WAS THEREUPON READ THE SECOND TIME BY TITLE ONLY.

MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN HEIN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN GOETZ THAT THE RULES BE SUSPENDED AND AN EMERGENCY BE DECLARED AND SAID ORDINANCE BE PASSED TO ITS THIRD READING BY TITLE ONLY AND PLACED UPON ITS FINAL PASSAGE AND BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE. THE MAYOR THEREUPON STATED THE MOTION AND THE VOTE RESULTED AS FOLLOWS:

"AYES": HEIN, GOETZ, CHRISTENSEN, HANKS, CAMPBELL.
"NAYS": NONE
"ABSENT": NONE

THE MAYOR THEREUPON STATED THE MOTION HAD DULY CARRIED AND DIRECTED THAT ORDINANCE No. 155 BE READ THE THIRD TIME BY TITLE ONLY. SAID ORDINANCE WAS THEN READ THE THIRD TIME BY TITLE ONLY. THEREUPON COUNCILMAN GOETZ MOVED THAT THE RULES BE SUSPENDED AND AN EMERGENCY BE DECLARED AND SAID ORDINANCE BE ADOPTED. MOTION SECONDED BY HANKS. THE MAYOR ORDERED THAT THE ROLL BE CALLED AND THEREUPON A ROLL CALL UPON THE FINAL PASSAGE AND THE ADOPTION OF SAID ORDINANCE WAS HAD AND THE VOTE RESULTED AS FOLLOWS:

"AYES": MAYOR CAMPBELL, COUNCILMEN GOETZ, HANKS, CHRISTENSEN, HEIN.
"NAYS": NONE
"ABSENT": NONE

SAID ORDINANCE No. 155 HAVING RECEIVED THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF VOTES, THE MAYOR DECLARED THE SAME TO HAVE DULY PASSED AND TO HAVE BEEN DULY ADOPTED.
