

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

OF THE CITY COUNCIL

OF BROOKINGS, OREGON, HELD

May 10, 1960

The council met in regular session on May 10, 1960, at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

Present were Mayor Campbell, Councilmen Hanks, Hein, Goetz, and Phetteplace, Attorney Balderree, Chief Cross, Everett Echols, Frank Harrison, and Paul Bodenhammer.

The minutes of the regular meeting held on April 12, 1960, were read and approved.

Paul Bodenhammer stated that the absence of parking meters in front of his place of business was hurting his trade. He would like to have the bus stop moved further down the street and meters replaced so that his customers would have a place to park and be able to unload or load their merchandise.

Chief Cross suggested that the alley behind the depot be widened or else permit the busses to double park while loading and unloading passengers and cargo.

RECOMMENDATION NO. 63 from the Planning Commission requesting that the sidewalks be kept clear of merchandise displays and other obstructions that hinder their proper use. Chief Cross was instructed to check this situation and to use the necessary steps to correct the situation.

A letter from the Christian Science Church requesting a delay in making their sewer connection until their new building could be erected was read and discussed. The Recorder was instructed to notify the church that they could wait until the sewer line along Redwood Street was installed before they would be forced to connect to the sewer.

A letter from Eugene F. Allison, Superintendent of School District 17-C dated April 22, 1960, was read and discussed. Superintendent Allison requested the City of Brookings adopt a resolution opposing the formation of the Junior College District as now planned and also that the Council have a representative at the hearing to be held in Coquille, May 17, 1960, to speak against the proposed Junior College District as now planned. He pointed out that this district would have no practical value to the people of the City of Brookings, as this proposed college would not be a campus type and students would have the problem of commuting. He also pointed out it would increase our tax levy and at the same time be of little or no value to this community.

Councilman Goetz made a motion that we adopt such a resolution, seconded by Councilman Hein. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks that the Mayor, Recorder and two councilmen be authorized to sign the Oregon State Highway Line Permit Agreement. Motion carried.

A letter from Mr. Echols in reference to Ordinance No. 48, report for sewer District No. 10 was read and discussed. Mr. Echols was instructed to go ahead and include the proposed extended sewer lines in the one sewer estimation contract, in order that the proposed hearing be held as soon as possible.

Mr. Harrison stated there was a quantity of oil flowing into the sewer lines. A discussion on how to locate and stop the flow of it was discussed. The Recorder was instructed to write letters to all service stations and garage operators directing their attention to City Ordinance No. 104, Section 5, Article 2 of the City of Brookings, prohibiting the use of sewers for the dumping of gasoline, oils etc.

The Police Chief, Bud Cross, was instructed to investigate and search out the said violaters of the above described ordinance.

Mr. Echols entered a protest at his being docked \$25.00 for the week in April from salary while out of the City. He reported that he was giving more than the required time and felt the deduction was not called for. The Council agreed that inasmuch as he was paid for services as called for in the monthly agreement salary and was paid for overtime work as reported from time to time that the deduction was justified.

Mr. Echols requested that the engineering department was in need of a file cabinet, desk, chairs, and additional equipment. He called the council's attention to the fact that all correspondence relating to the engineering department and also magazines, etc. should be funncled to the department. He also stated that he did not have sufficient copies of letters and other information pertaining to the engineering department in a place ready to refer to when needed.

The Mayor was instructed to inform the Consulting Engineer Erichsen of the proposed additions and changes in the plans for Sewer District No. 10 and to include these in the proposed layout.

City Attorney Balderree read the requirements that must be fulfilled before calling a special hearing of sewer approval.

The council discussed the necessity of holding meetings twice a month in order to properly complete and expedite the business pertaining to the city. It was agreed that the next meeting be held May 23. It was agreed that the council would hold meetings on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month.

Chief Cross reported that all city police were required to use uniform traffic citations after July 1.

Attorney Balderree explained the League of Oregon Cities codification program for all city ordinances.

ORDINANCE NO. 145, an ordinance regulating and licensing certain businesses, professions, pursuits and occupations in the City of Brookings for regulatory and revenue purposes, fixing the fees therefor, providing for an increase or decrease of the same, fixing the penalty for violation thereof, providing for the enforcement thereof, providing certain definitions, providing for a savings clause, repealing Ordinances No. 6, 80, 103 and 111 and declaring an emergency was read the first time fully and distinctly at length.

Thereupon Councilman Hein moved that the rules be suspended and an emergency declared and that said ordinance be read the second time by title only. This motion was seconded by Councilman Goetz. The Mayor thereupon stated the motion and the vote resulted as follows:

Thereupon Councilman Phetteplace moved that the rules be suspended and an emergency declared and that said ordinance be read the second time by title only. This motion was seconded by Councilman Hein. The Mayor thereupon stated the motion and the vote resulted as follows:

Thereupon Councilman Hein moved that the rules be suspended and an emergency declared and that said ordinance be read the second time by title only. This motion was seconded by Councilman Hanks. The Mayor thereupon stated the motion and the vote resulted as follows:

An ordinance relating to electrical installations and repealing Ordinance No. 72 passed May 10, 1955, was read the first time fully and distinctly at length.

An ordinance repealing Ordinances No. 16, 17, 21 and 24 was read the first time fully and distinctly at length.
